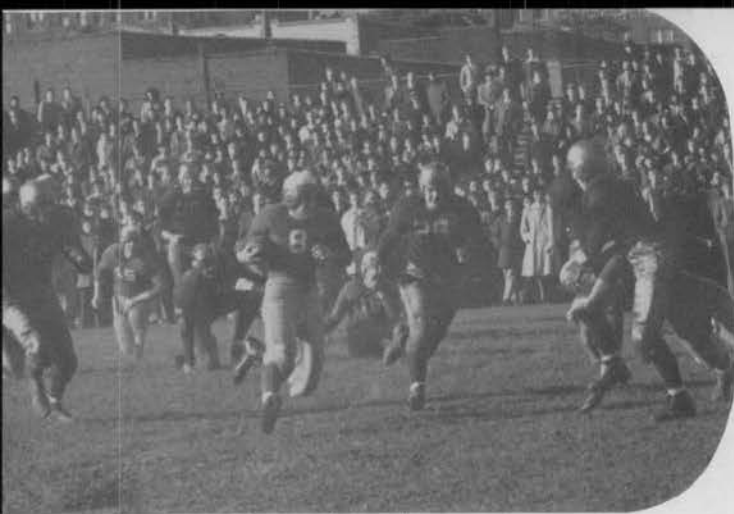


BROOKLYN PREP 27 — XAVIER 6

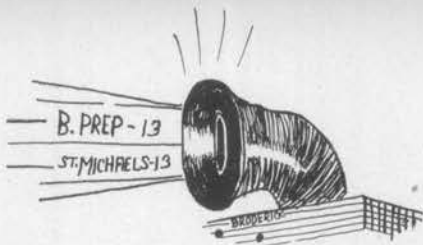

BROOKLYN PREP 13 — MOUNT ST. MICHAEL 13

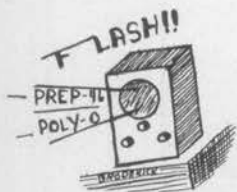

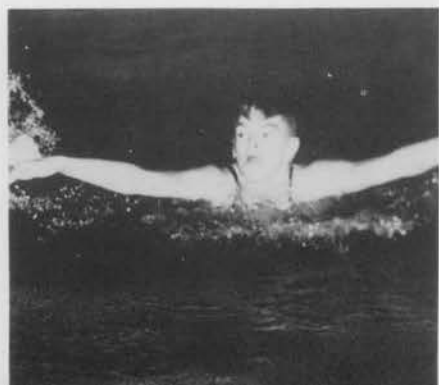
