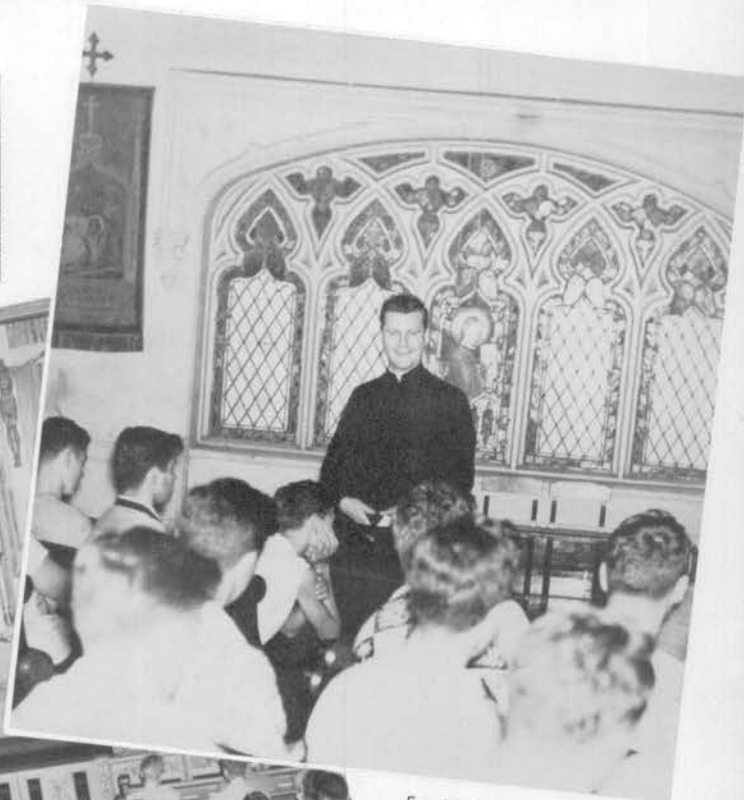

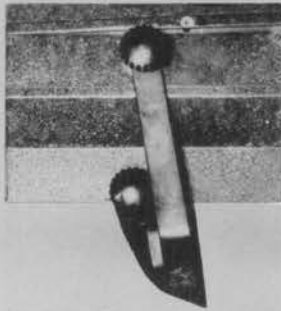

B'klyn Prep Upsets Erasmus

Moriarty's Boot Decides After Heights Rally

The scholastic football season got under way with a major upset yesterday when Brooklyn Prep edged the highly-touted Erasmus Hall, 7-6, at Boys High Field. The game was the first meeting between the two rivals since 1935. The series now stands 7-6, with one tie thrown in, in favor of Erasmus.

Erasmus got off smoothly, scoring 11 plays after the start. The Buff and Blue had many other threats. In the fourth period, the Dutchmen tallied a six-pointer when Hal Lubetsky raced 70 yards for a touchdown, but the play was called back and a clipping penalty inflicted on his teammates.

It was the educated toe of Joe Moriarty which enabled the Crown Heighters to surprise the Flatbushers. Moriarty split the uprights early in the fourth quarter after his teammate, Don Costello, scored.

Brooklyn Prep started moving toward its touchdown in the waning minutes of the third period. 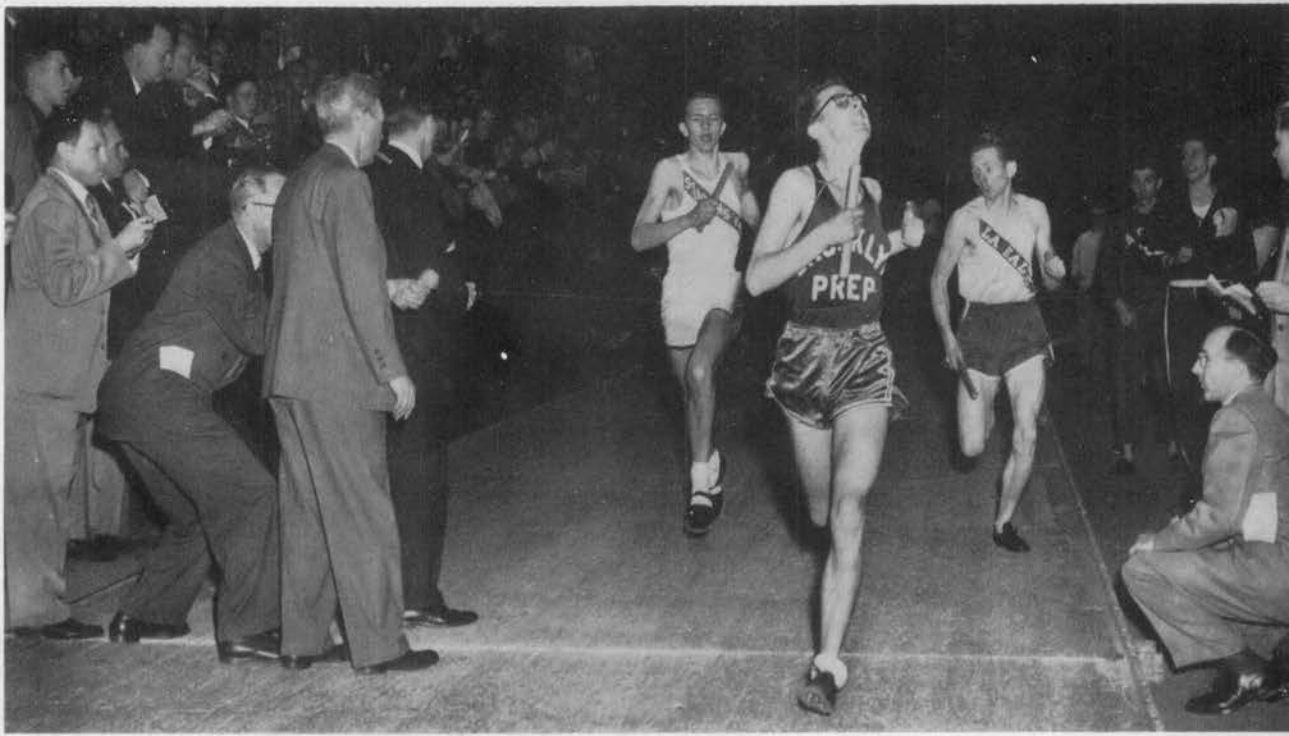

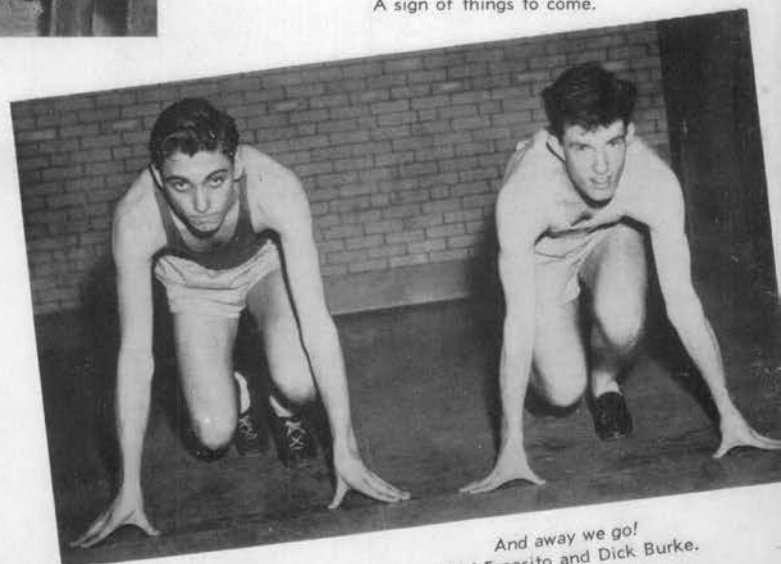

It was the first league swimming title for Brooklyn Prep since 1948. The meet was a thriller and was not determined until the final event when Brooklyn Prep sewed up the decision with a comfortable victory in the 200-yard freestyle relay.

Doolan outguessed opposing coach Tom Booras of St. Francis by electing to try for the 150-yard medley relay with a strong trio. The key to the victory was Jim McCarthy, Brooklyn Prep's National AAU junior 100-yard freestyle champion, who figured in two victories.

MCCARTHY SET a new league record to win the 100-yard freestyle in a sizzling 0:54.1 and also handled the 50-yard freestyle leg on the winning medley relay team. John Hayman and Tom Sweeney handled the other medley legs as the Eagles won the event in 1:26.2.

The Little Terriers failed to pick up a single point in the medley relay even though they loaded it with Joe Mannino, Joe Kelly and Ed Gallagher. It was a bad day all around for Gallagher, the CHSAA backstroke titleholder, who lost his first individual decision in three years in his specialty—the 100-yard backstroke.

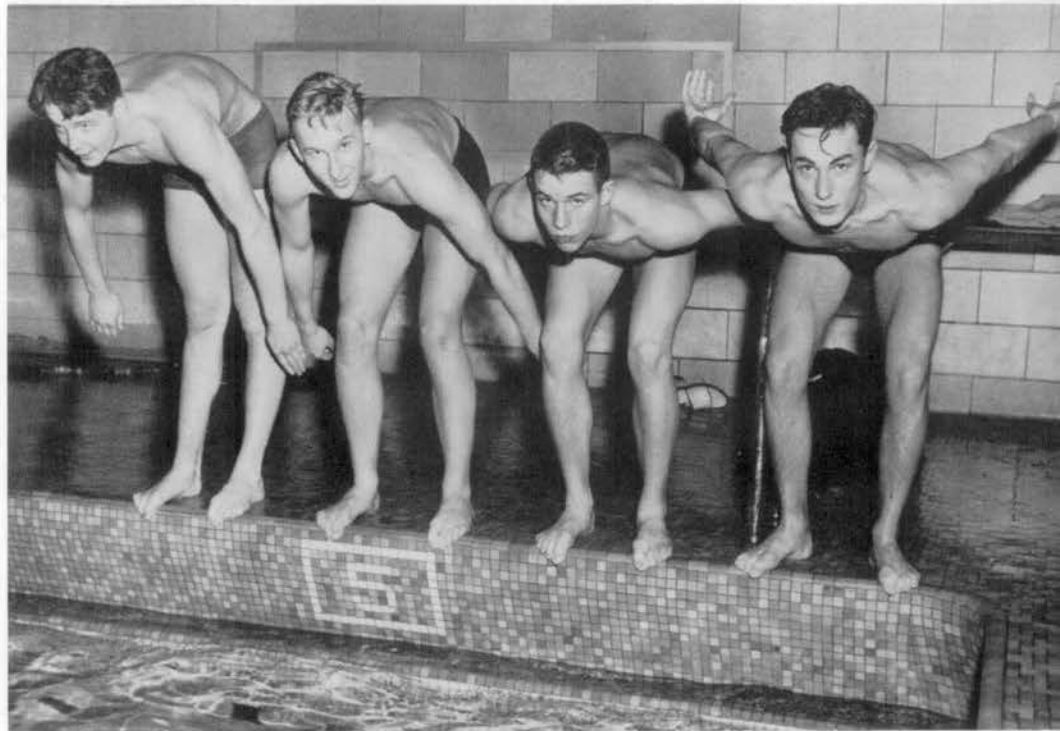
Brooklyn College was the scene of the third and final meet of the round robin to determine the league titleholder. The finalists each had trimmed Loughlin, the other team involved in the triple deadlock, earlier in the week.

JOHN HAYMAN of Brooklyn Prep was responsible for handing Gallagher his first defeat in three years in the 100-yard backstroke. The time was a good 1:05. Bob Duffy and Everett McCooey were responsible for other Brooklyn Prep individual triumphs.

The Eagles showed they meant business by winning the 200-yard freestyle relay in 1:45 with a team comprised of Ray Dunn, Bob Duffy, Dusty McDonald and Everett McCooey to make certain of the victory.

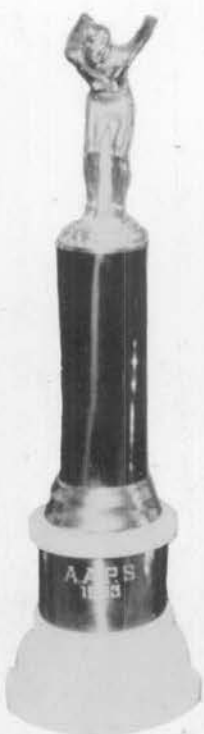
