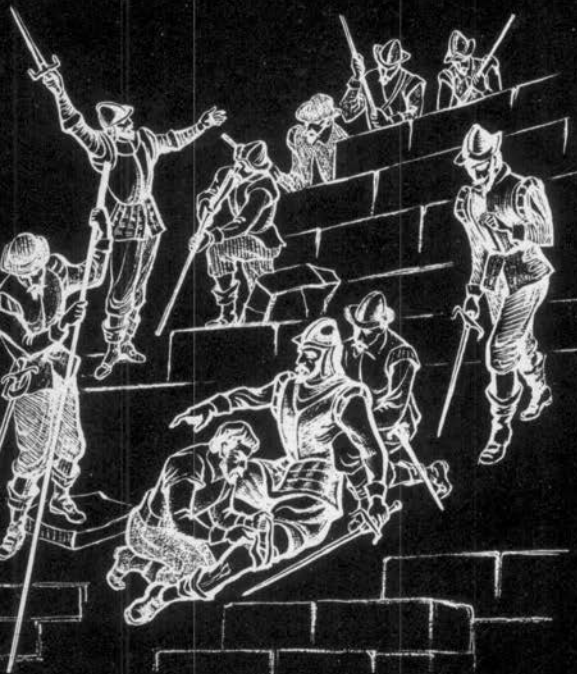
A vigil under arms

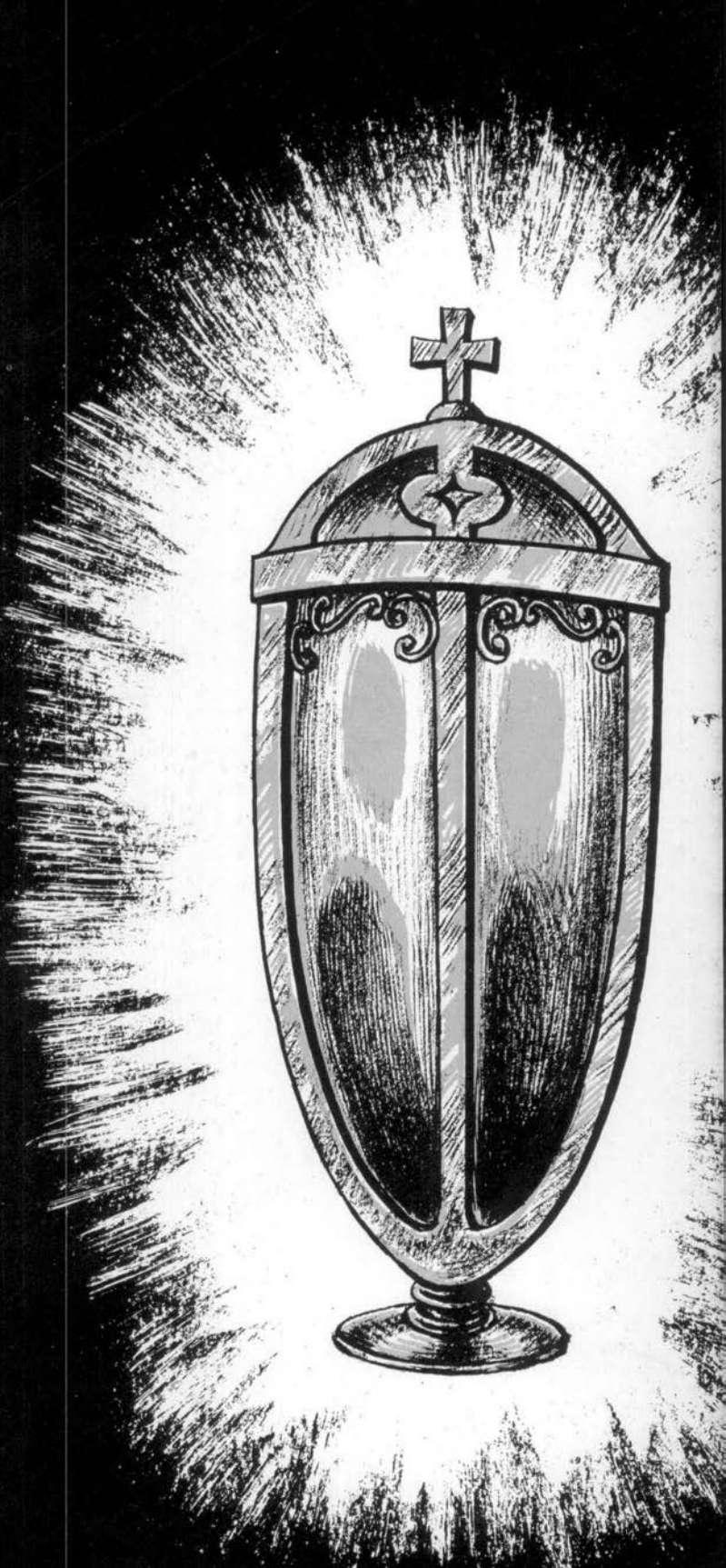

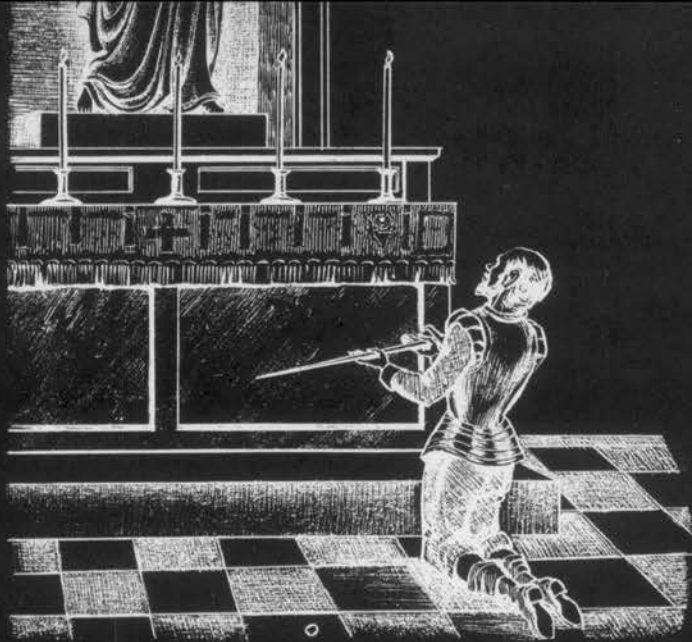
All his life he was to remain close to her and this devotion to Mary is reflected, too, in all who have come in contact with his sons.

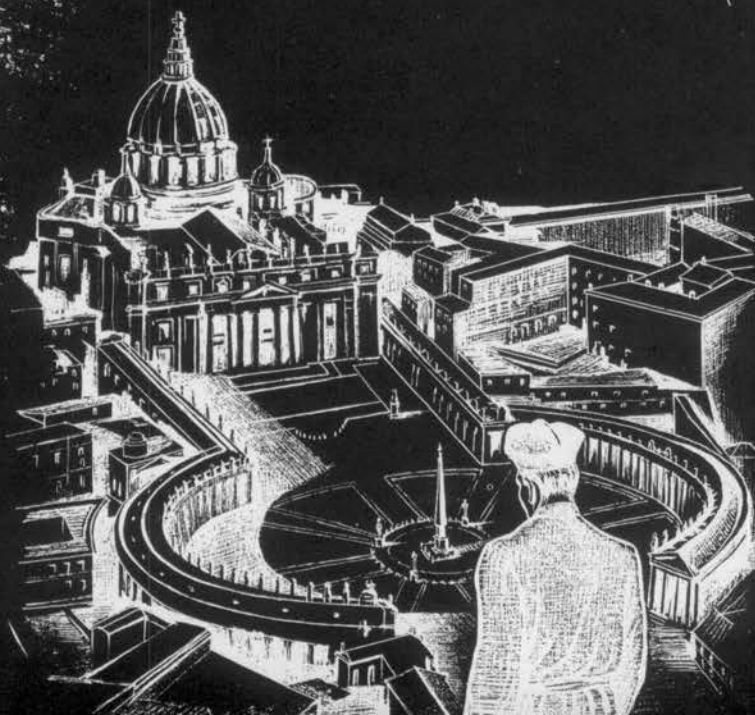

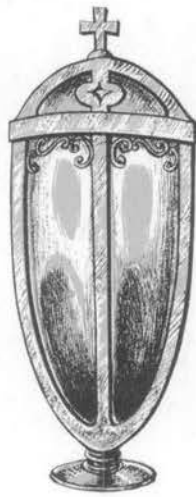

A Vigil over his men

As Captain in command of Pamplona Castle, Ignatius prepared to withstand a French siege in 1521. The men within the castle were his men and them would he protect. The force of survival was vigilance and the only weapon against the French cannon was courage.

An iron ball crashing through Ignatius' legs spelled the doom of Pamplona. Flesh and bone were shredded but the courage and vigil were untouched. It takes more than cannon shot to force a fighting man to relax his vigil over his charges.

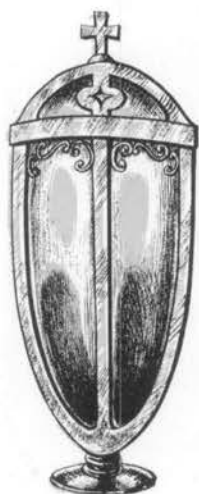
In Memoriam



Father Frederick Frohnhoefer, S.J.

The life and work of Father Frederick Frohnhoefer, S.J. epitomized the ideal of vigilance in a son of Ignatius. As the oldest active teacher of the Society of Jesus in the New York Province, Father Frohnhoefer was still teaching within twelve hours of his death.

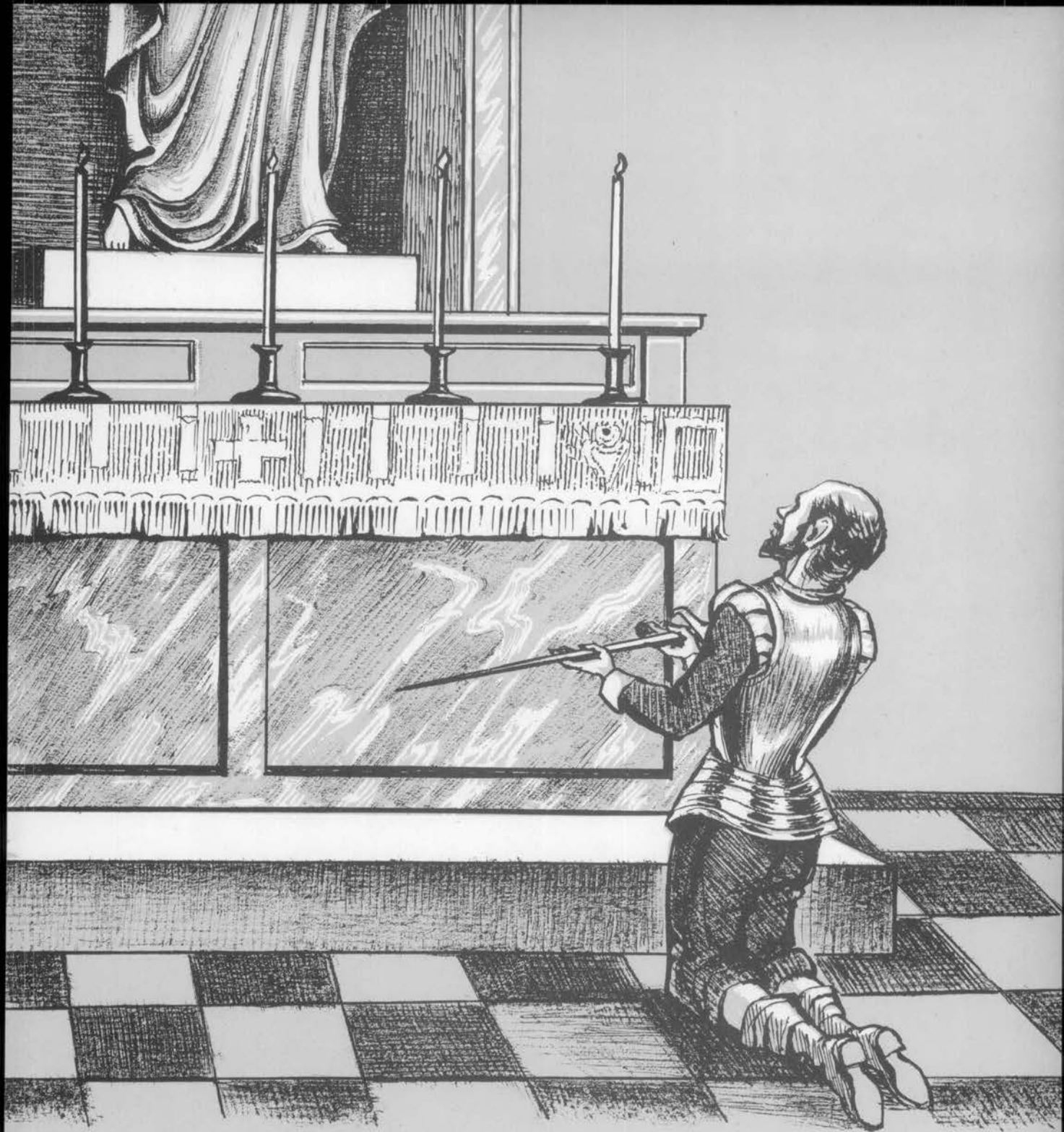


A vigil of Dedication

The cannon ball that felled Ignatius finished a minor war and started a major revolution. At Pamplona a leg and a dream were shattered but from the spurs of bone a new sword was forged and a new vigil began.

At Monserrat this hobbled soldier knelt before Our Lady through a long night. At the end of this vigil a soldier's hand laid a scarred sword at Mary's feet. The major battle of Ignatius' career was soon to begin.

Because we have watched this warrior saint for four years at his vigils and at his wars, we Seniors know that he has fitted to our hands a lifelong sword for Christ's using.

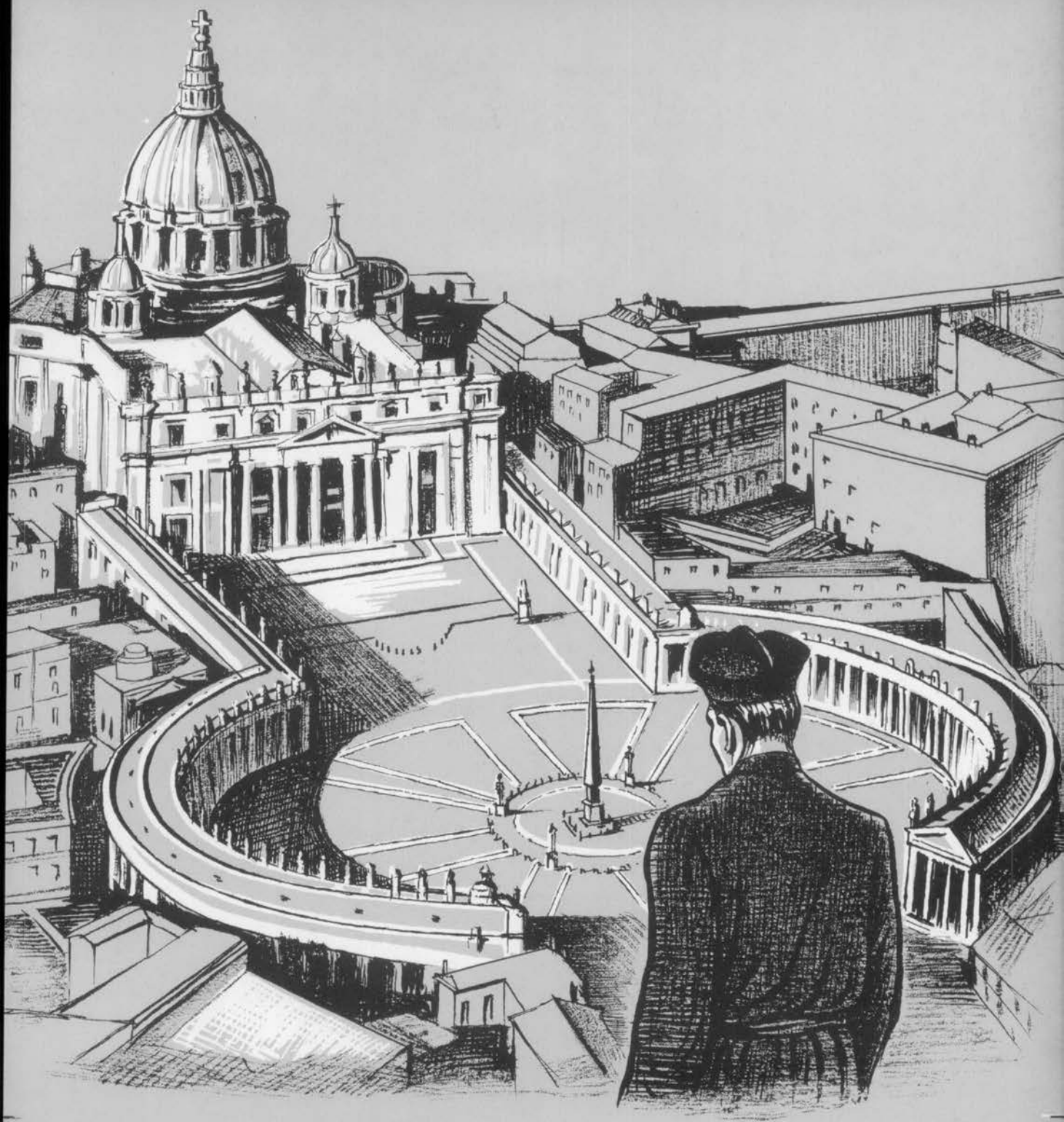




The Society's vigil over the Church

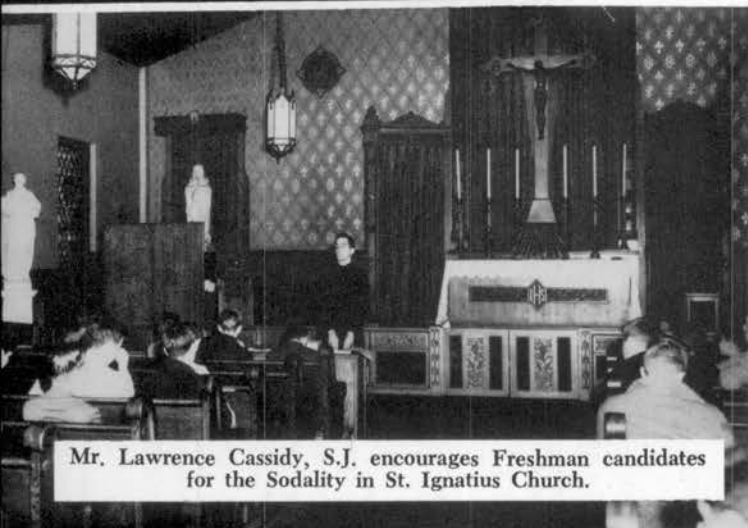

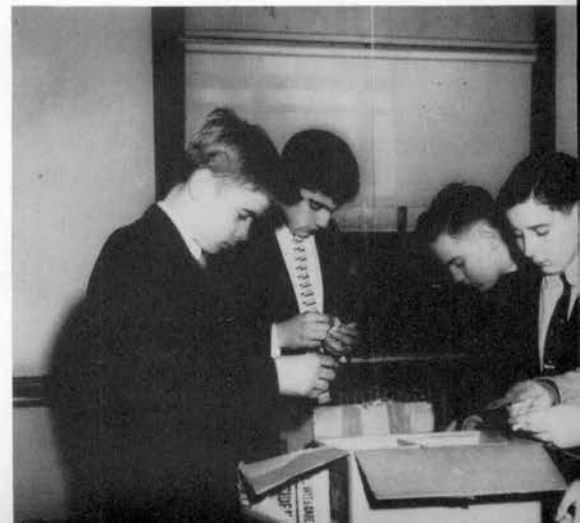

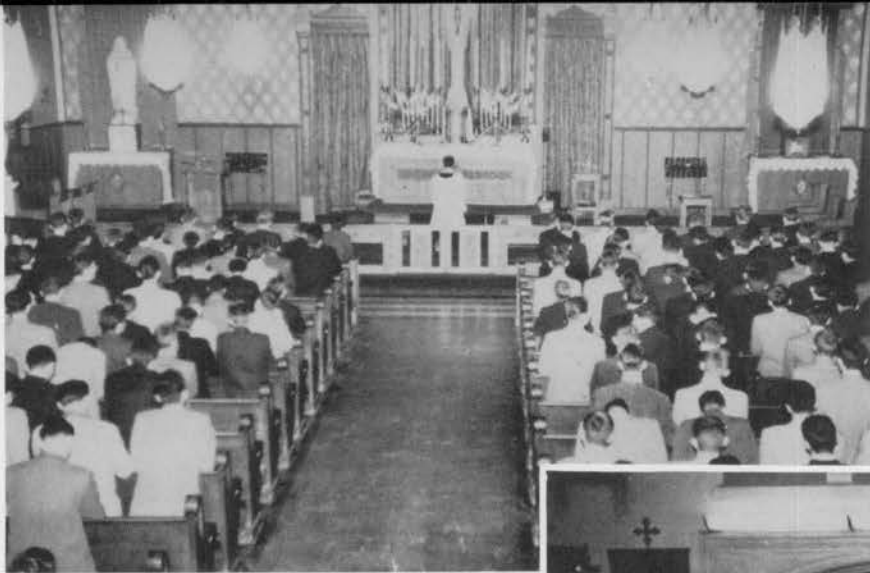

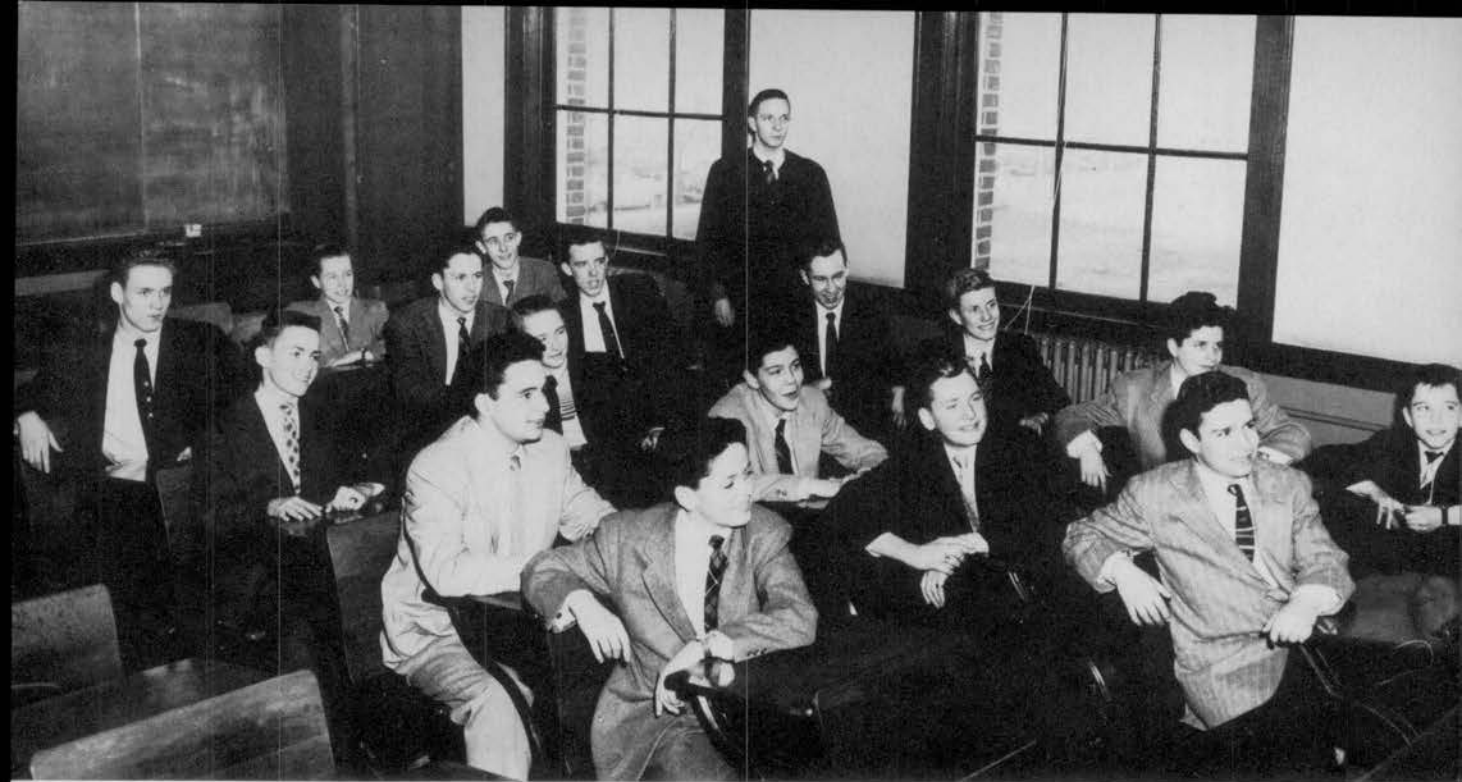

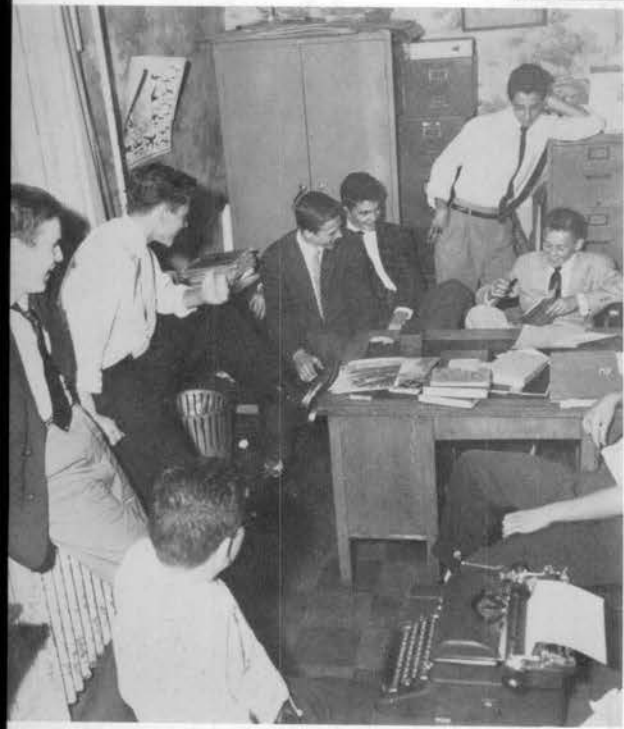

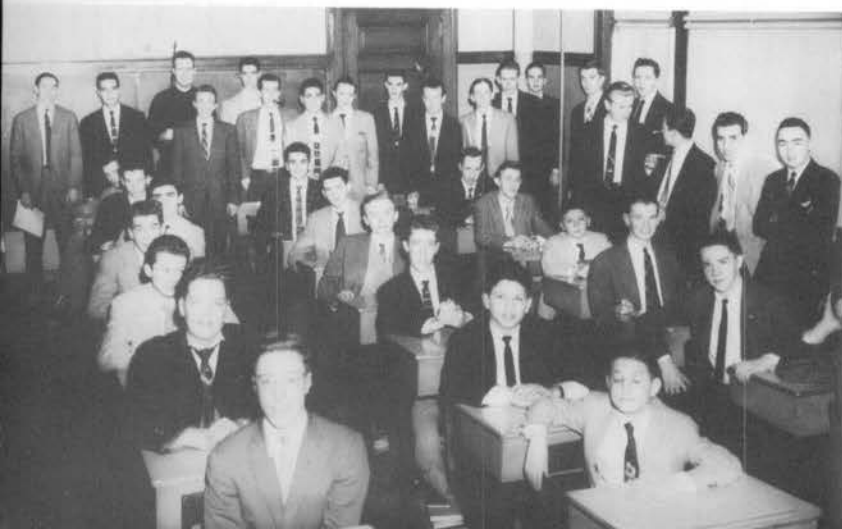

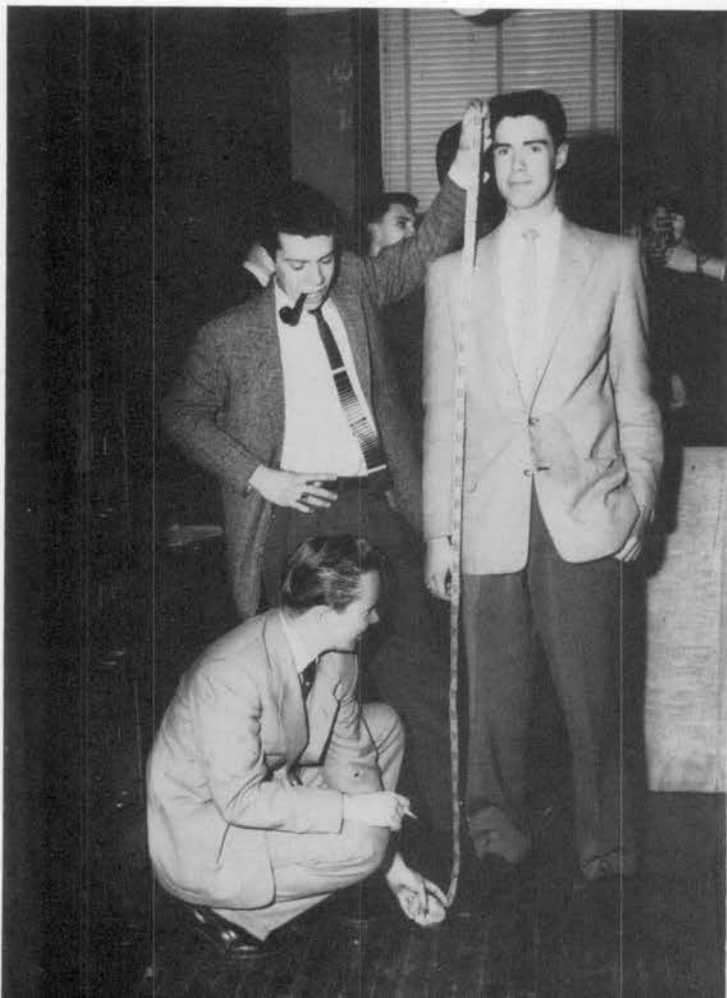

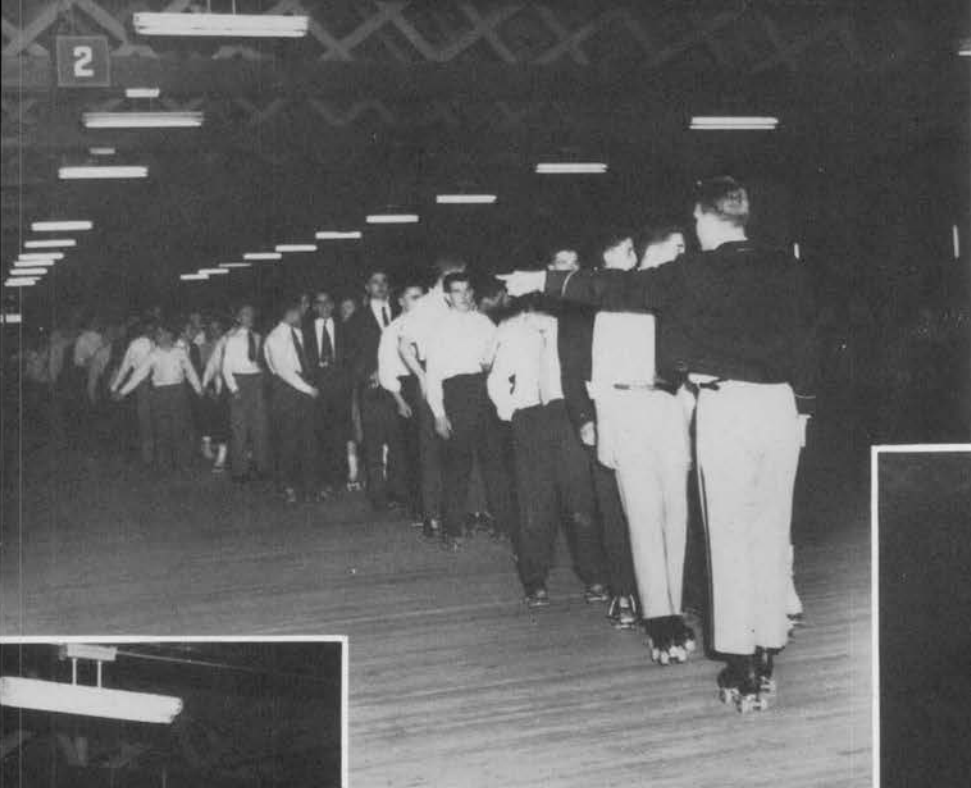

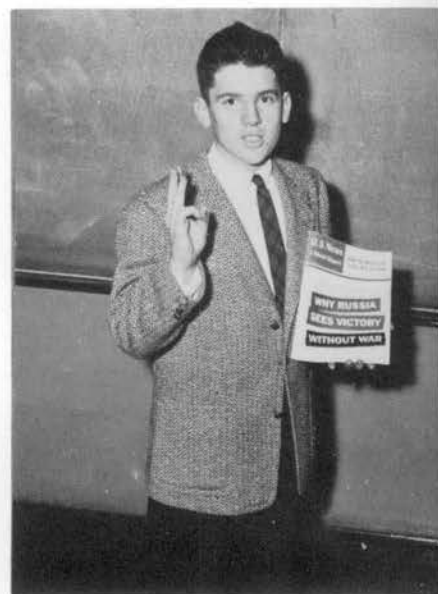

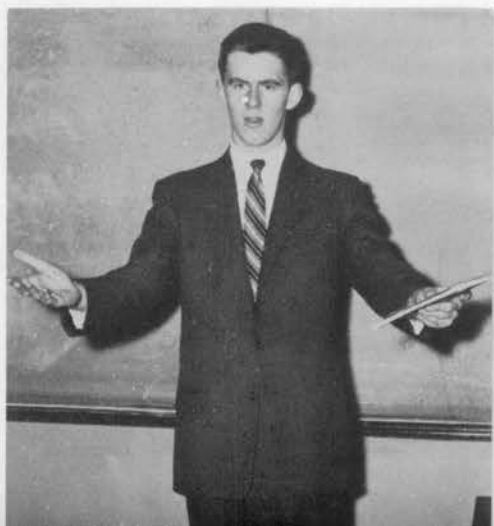

In September 1955 a new activity was welcomed by the Student Council into the ranks of extra-curriculars. For a few years Prep men have voted for a choral group. Mr. McCrystal's assignment to Prep gave the undergraduates a Moderator. His own work in choral music helped in organizing and directing a Glee Club.

Basses and tenors came forward for an audition in answer to the first announcement. Six weeks later on November 17, 1955 the Brooklyn Prep fathers were stamped as "first nighters." The annual Smoker was the first public performance of the new choral group. Afternoons of practice, constant coaching, and careful watch over the eighth and quarter notes blended to bring applause from the congenial audience.

This same group returned to brighten the Parents' Night at Prep on February 10, 1956. The Glee Club set the tone for the evening in honor of St. Ignatius by their stirring rendition of "Fundador," the Spanish hymn and battle-call of the Jesuits.

On March 23, 1956 the coordinated musical activities of the school gave proof of their vigilant work both privately at home and publicly at school rehearsals. The new Glee Club cooperated with the well-established Brooklyn Prep Band in a joint concert. The encores echoing through Loyola Hall proclaimed to the Glee Club that their first year was a success.

Parents, friends and fellow Prep men beamed and clapped as the "Syncopated Clock" followed the "Ballet Parisienne" on the concert program.

Earlier in the year the Marching Band tried to cheer the football team on to victory; the blare of the band was a sign of Prep spirit. Student spectators were lifted up by the stirring marches to cheer for their squad.

At the Smoker in November the fathers applauded their musician-sons; the mothers waited until February before sharing the realization that hours of practice at home pay dividends when blended with the notes of other instruments under the direction of a Moderator's baton.

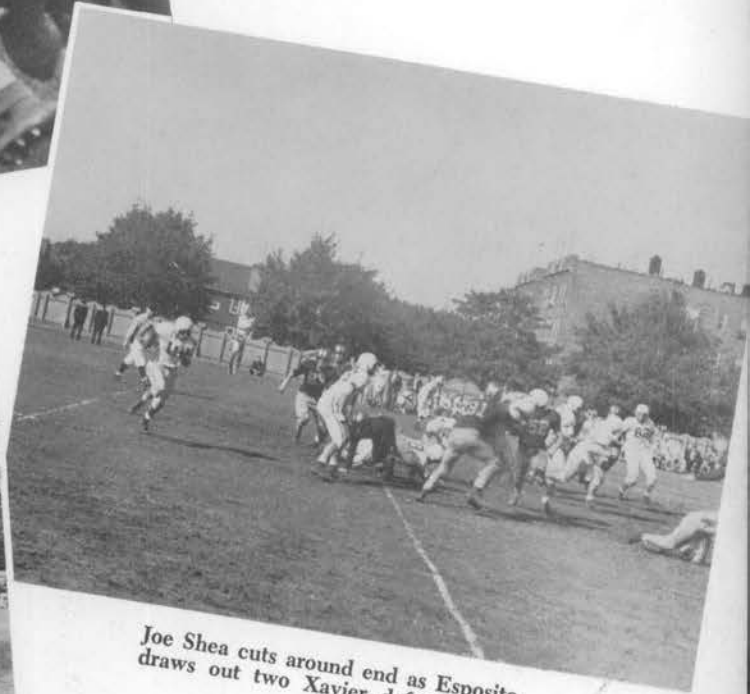

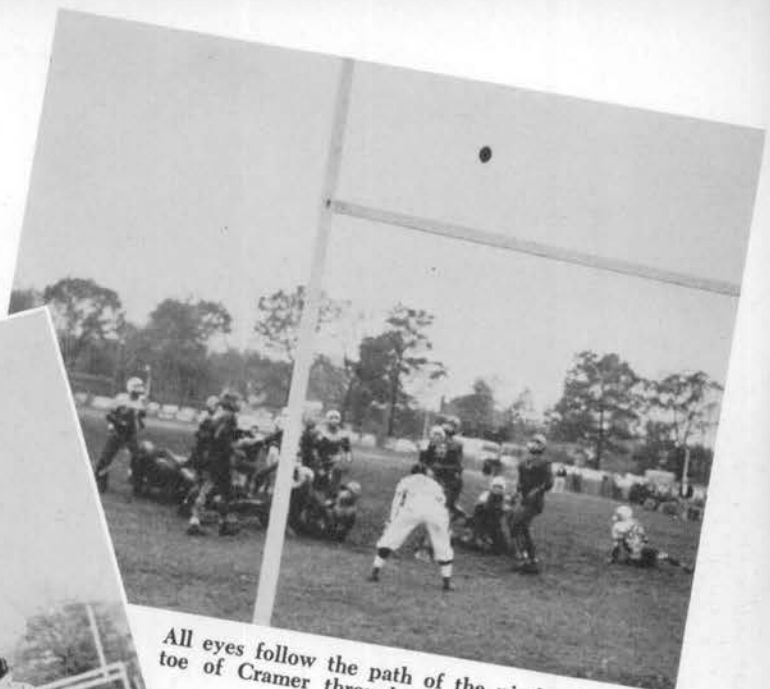

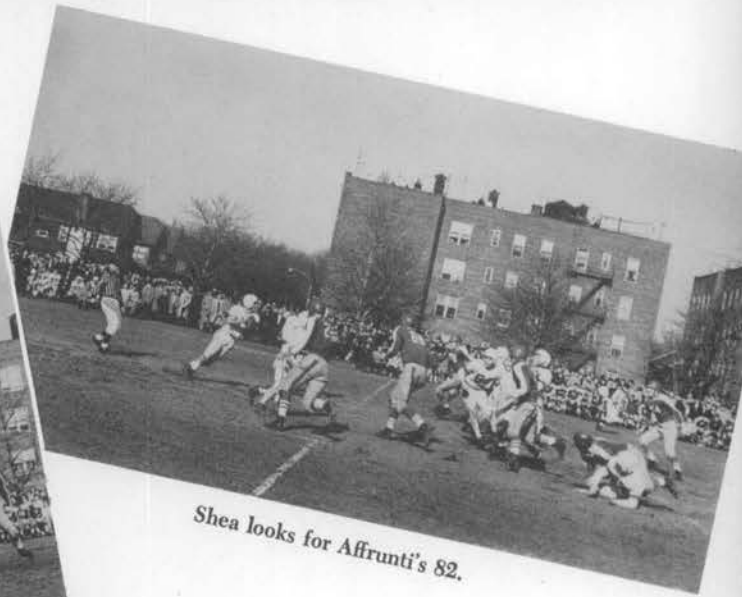

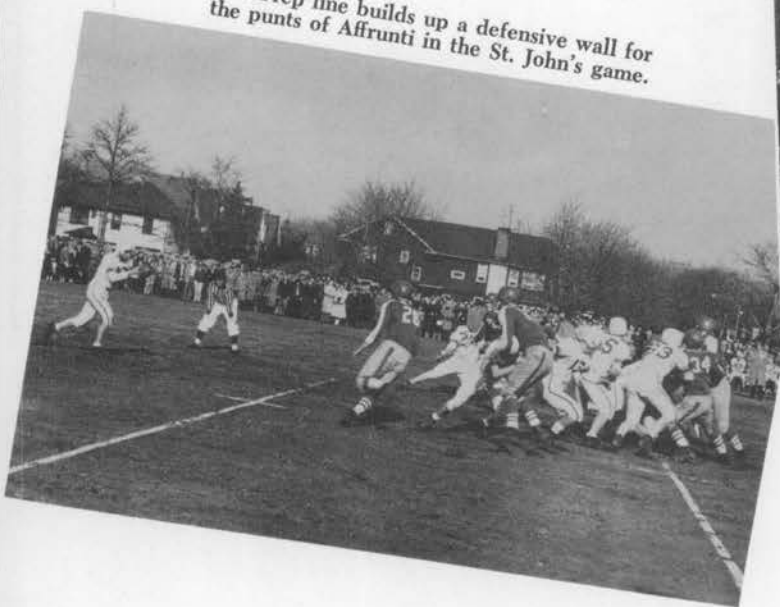


Joe Shea heads upfield in the St. John's fracas.

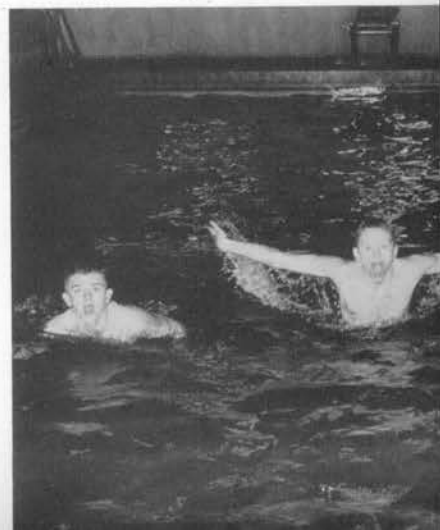

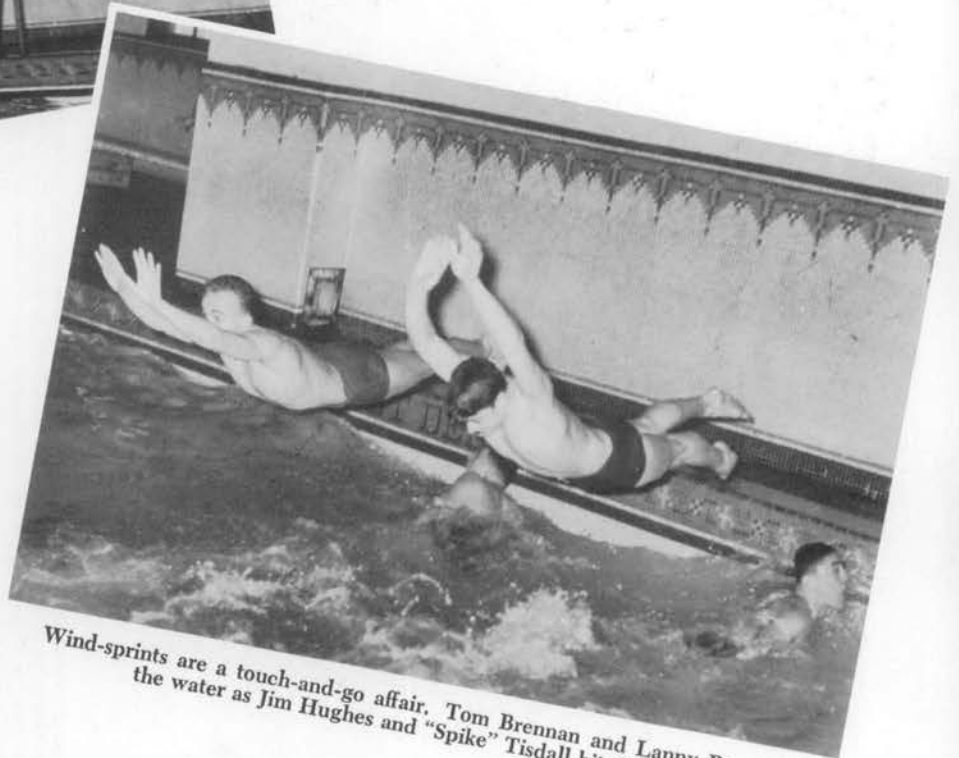

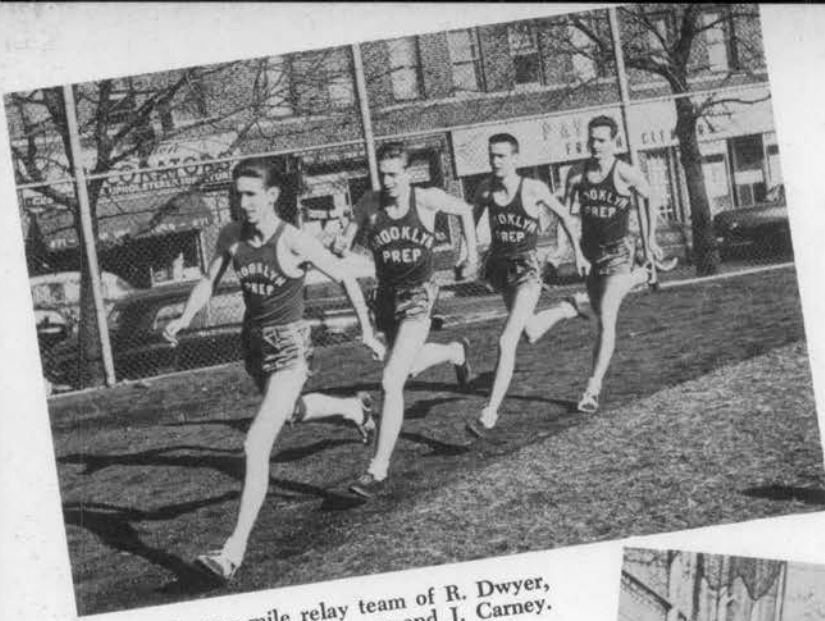

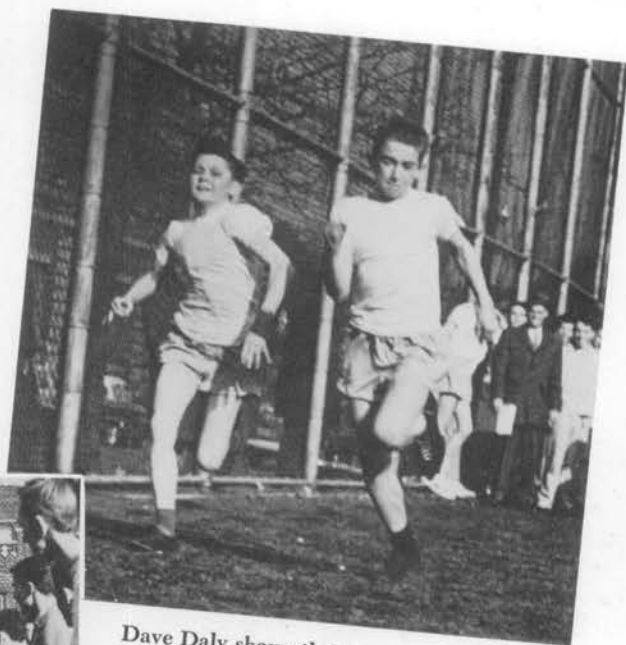
