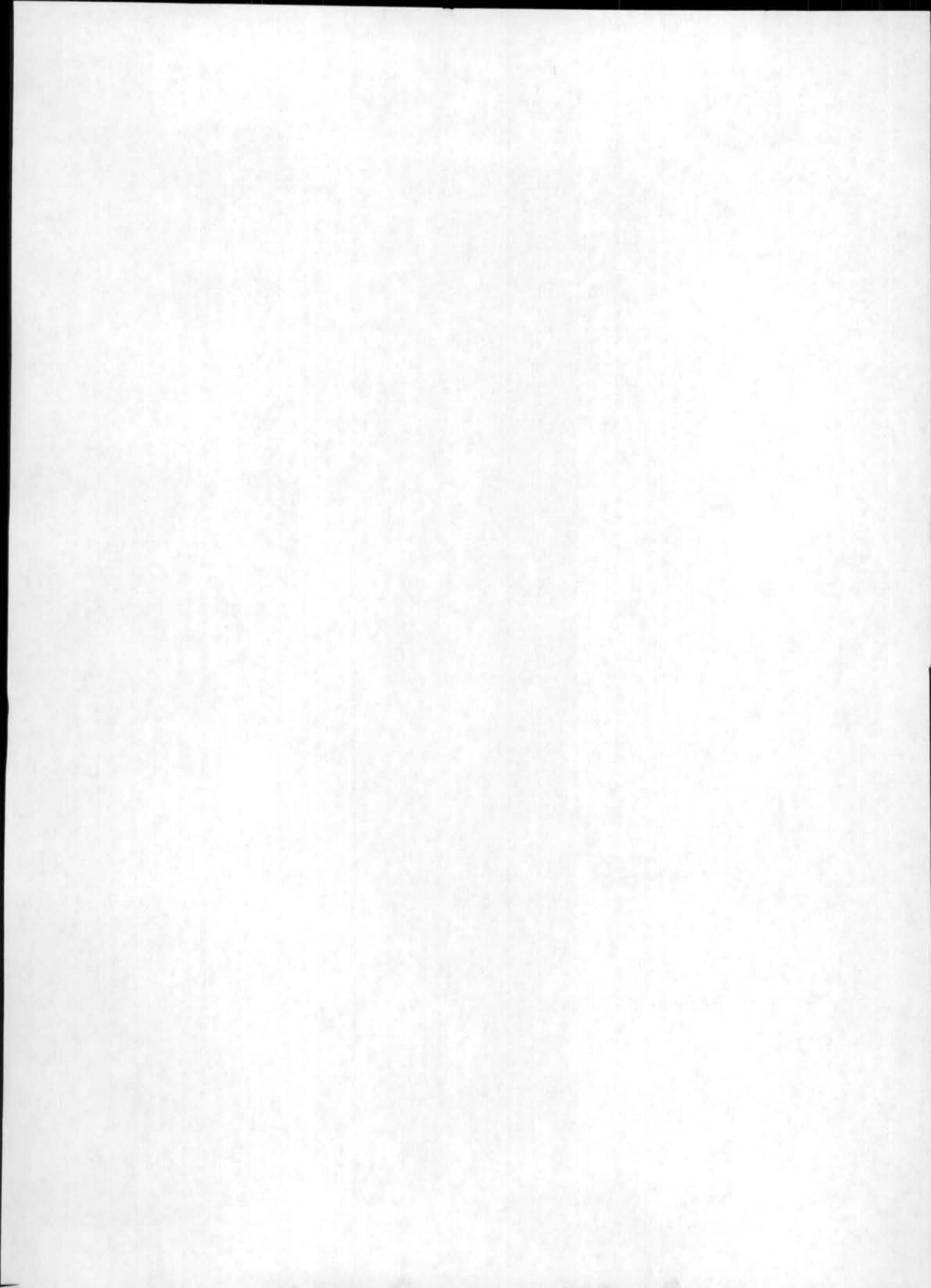

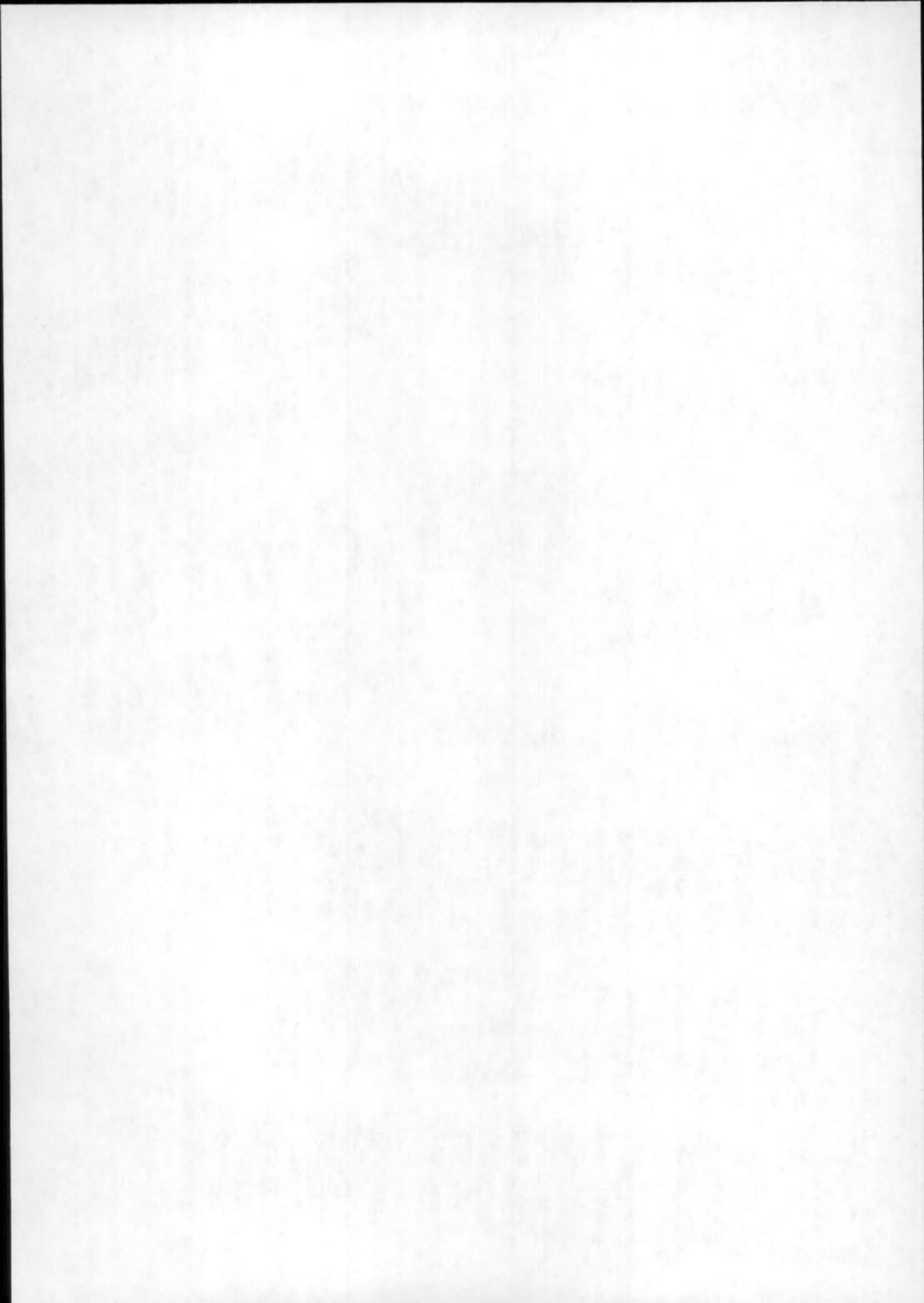

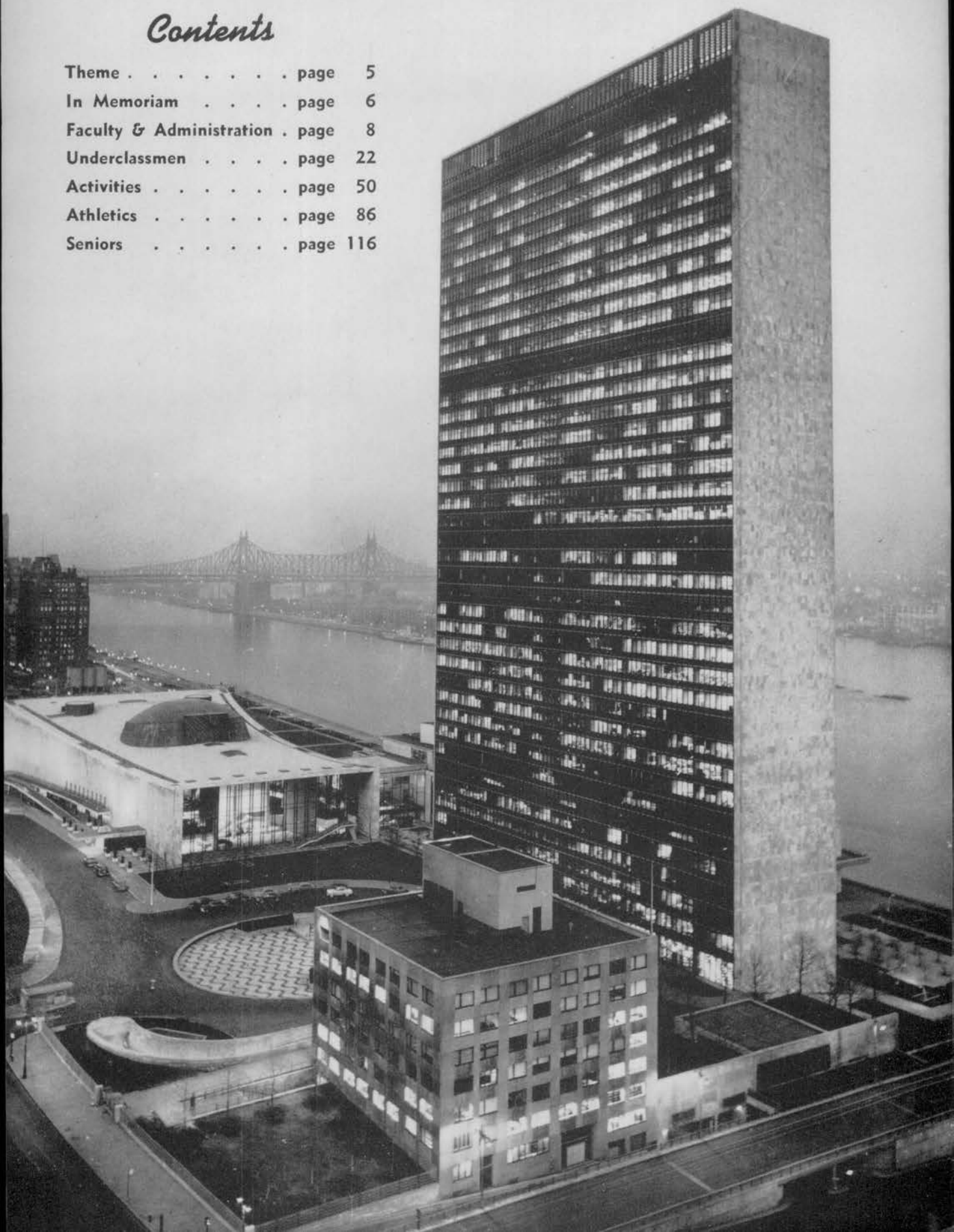

The world, during this year 1956-57, has produced more than its share of drama. Some of it was fraught with knife-edged tension, some blessed with laughing relief from the strain of watching the world teeter on the brink of self-annihilation in one international crisis after another. The world of 1957 saw national unity as well as discord, scientific progress and moral deterioration, political intrigue and spiritual conversion. There was laughter, but more weeping; some smiles, but much nervous dread; scattered voices of optimism, but a generally pessimistic chorus.

On one small lump of the world's topographical skin, however, appeared a part of the world drama that was more hopeful than the whole, for it was played with hope in Him Who is the source of all hope. Crown Heights, indeed, is only a small part of the world's stage, but in a sense, a more significant drama than those that filled the headlines was created at Brooklyn Prep this year. For here, in a drama of their own, were being trained leaders who might change the plot of the world-wide drama of the future. United in the universal principle "For the Greater Glory of God," faculty and students, studies, extra-curricular activities and athletics became the components of a drama in the truest sense of the word. That drama, present in every conscious moment of every individual who participates in it, is what we shall endeavor to cement in words and pictures, so that the actors in it, as well as their parents and friends, the spectators, may remember the life-long significance and realize the eternal scope of the principles and ideals presented here, in the Drama of Brooklyn Prep.

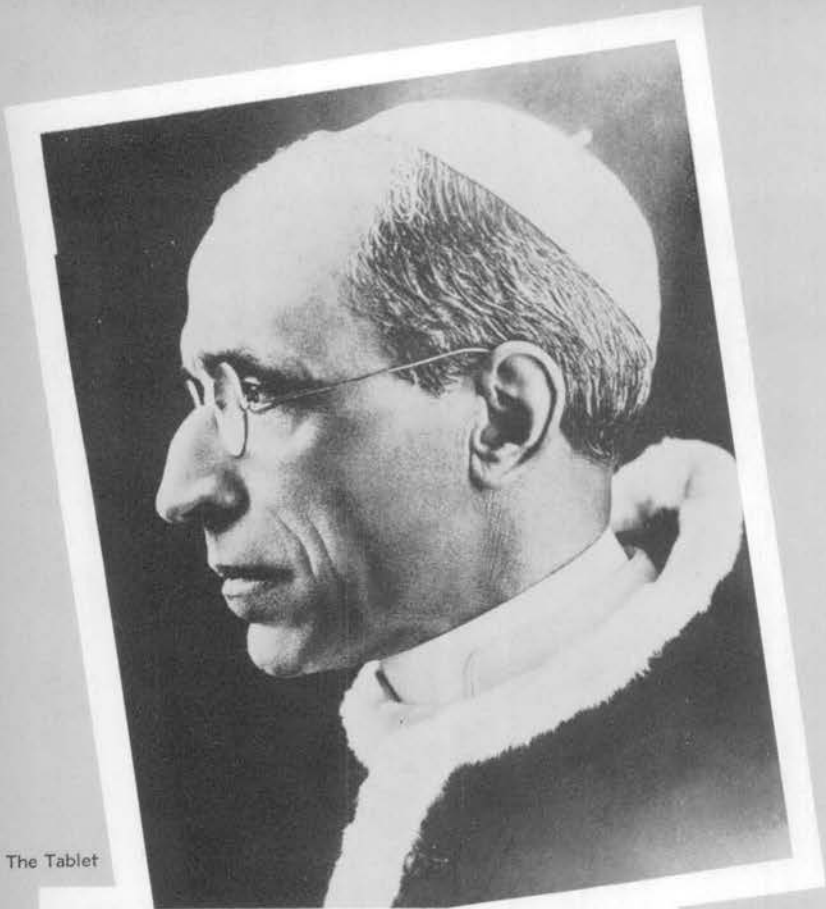

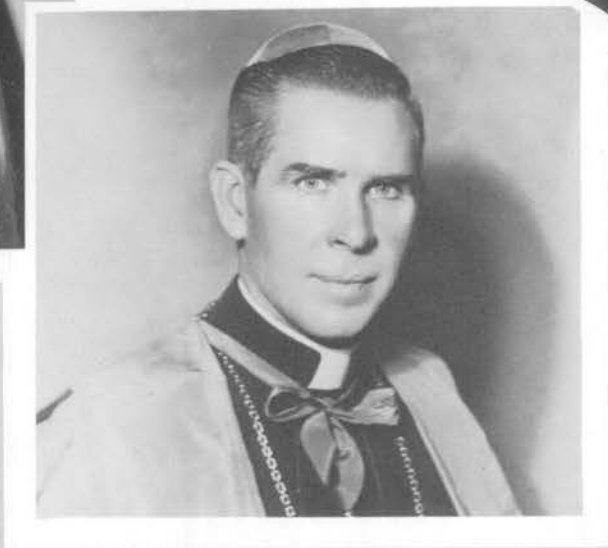
The vacancies left by these two men of God will be difficult to fill in the hierarchy of Brooklyn. They will be impossible to fill in the hearts of Prep men.



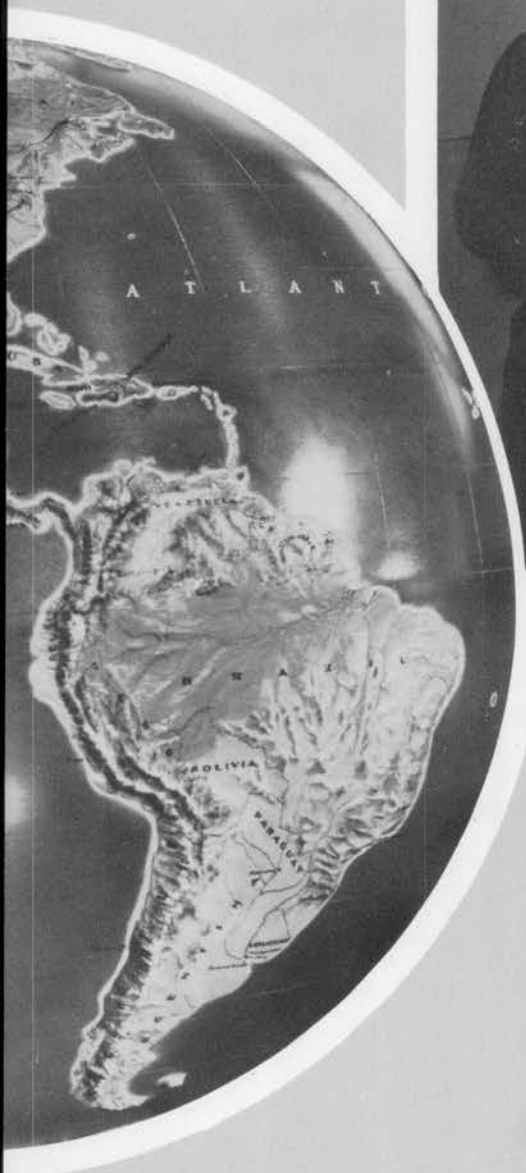

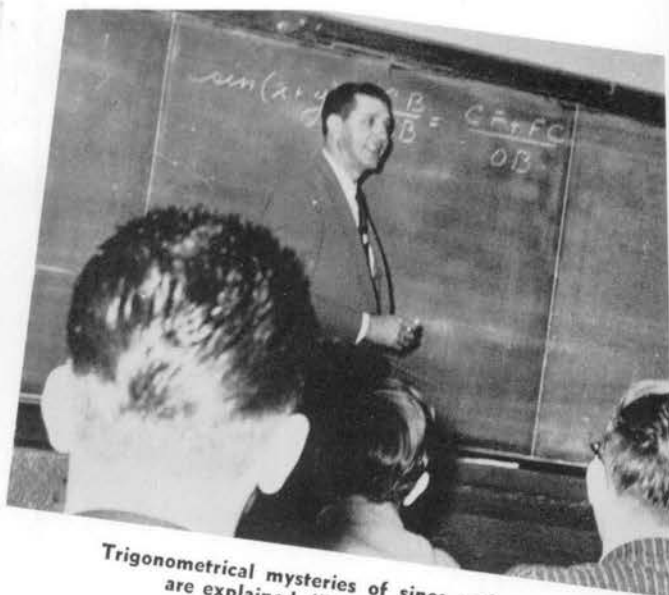
Underclassmen

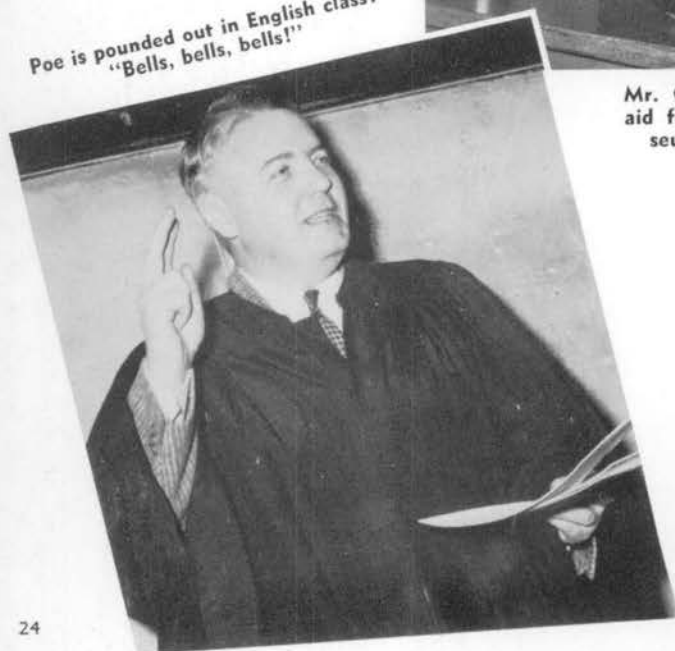

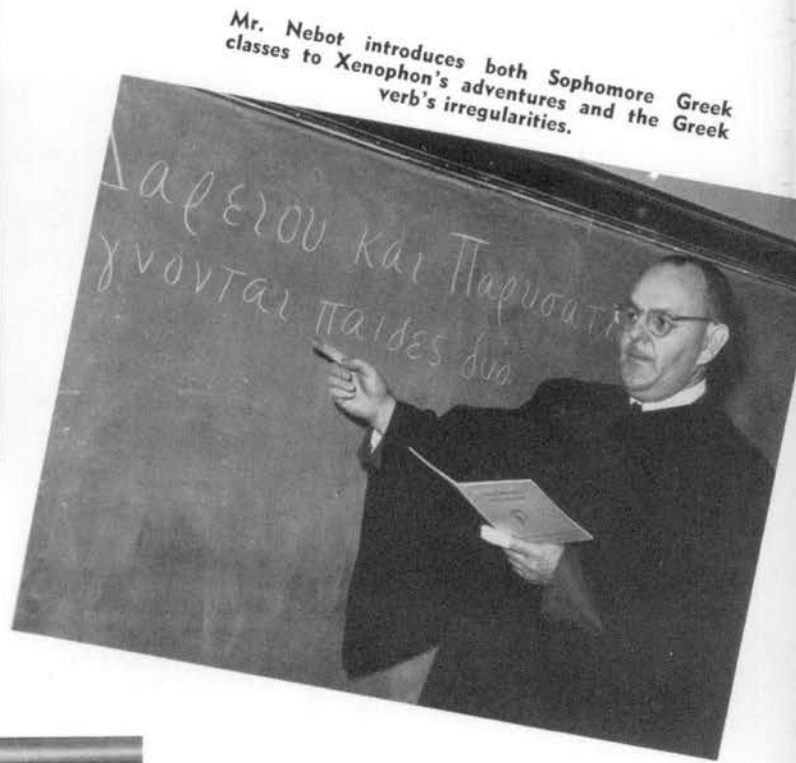

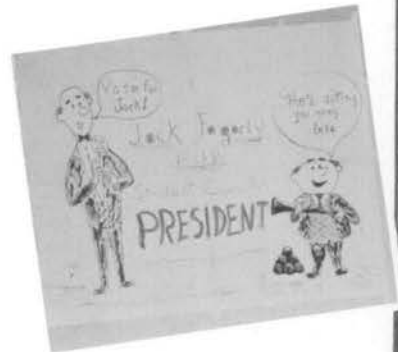

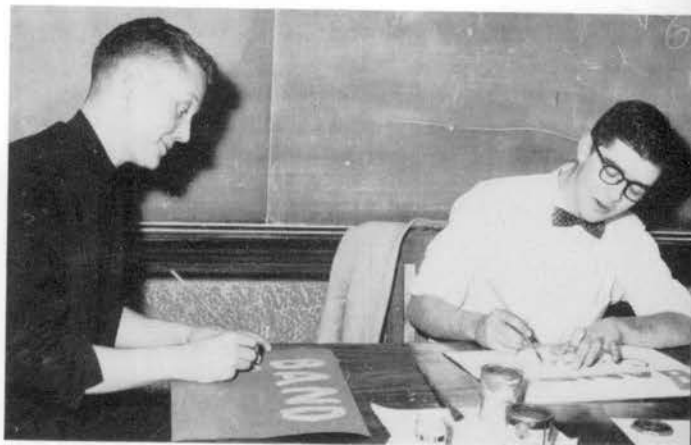

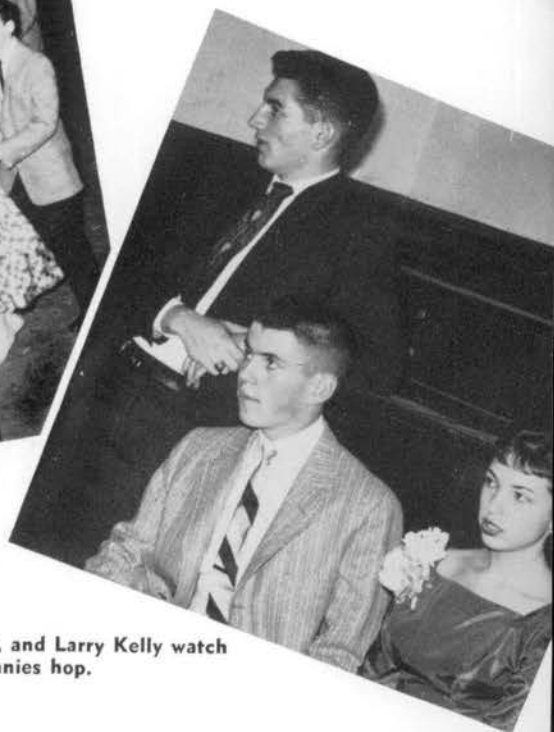

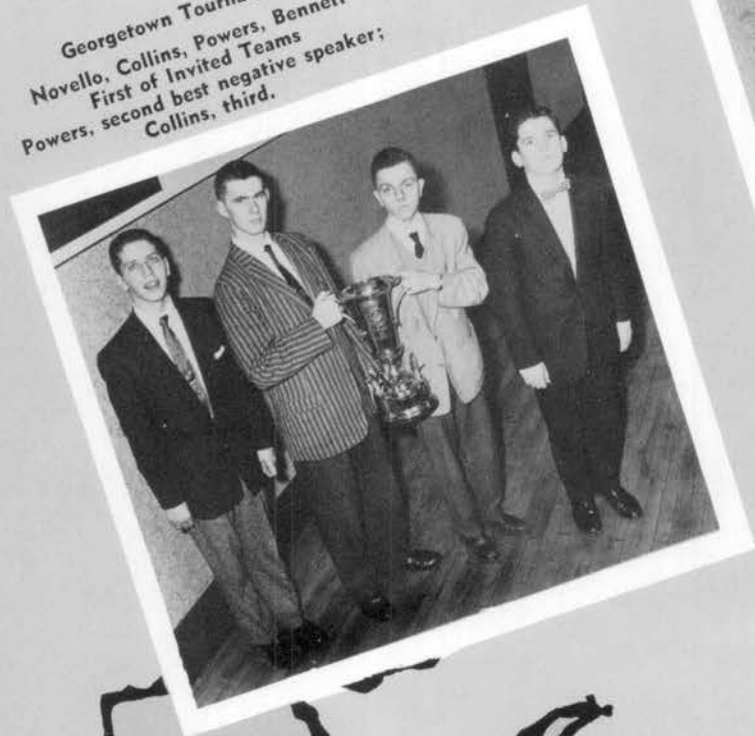

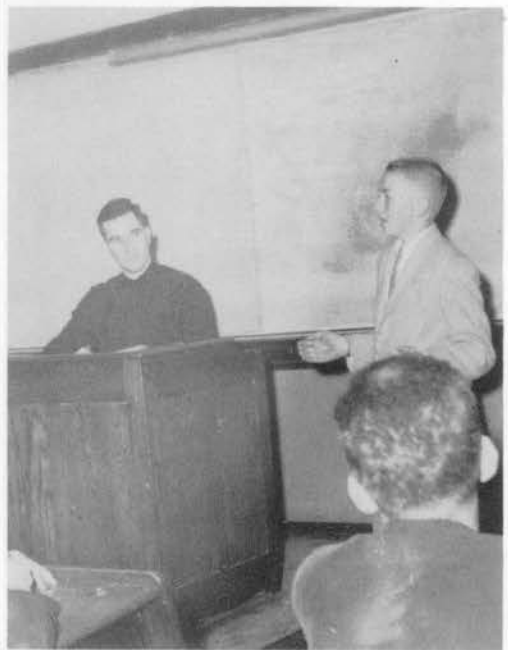

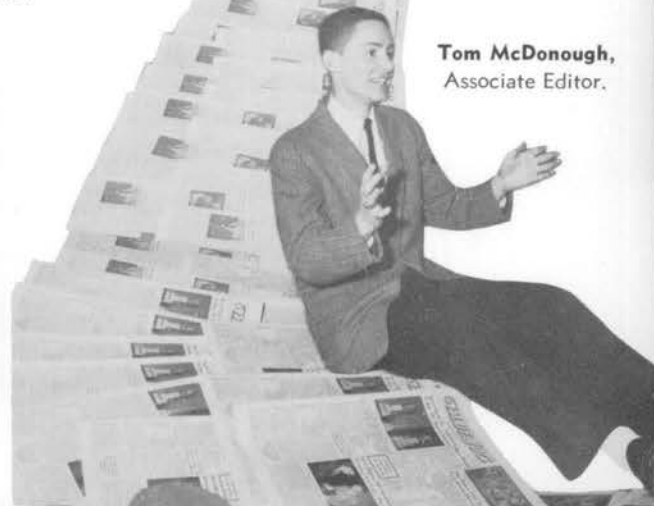

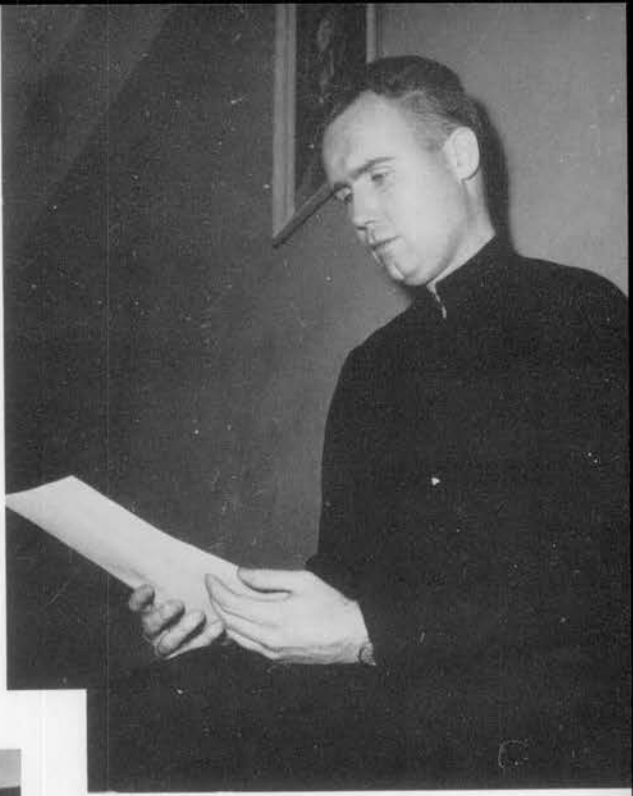

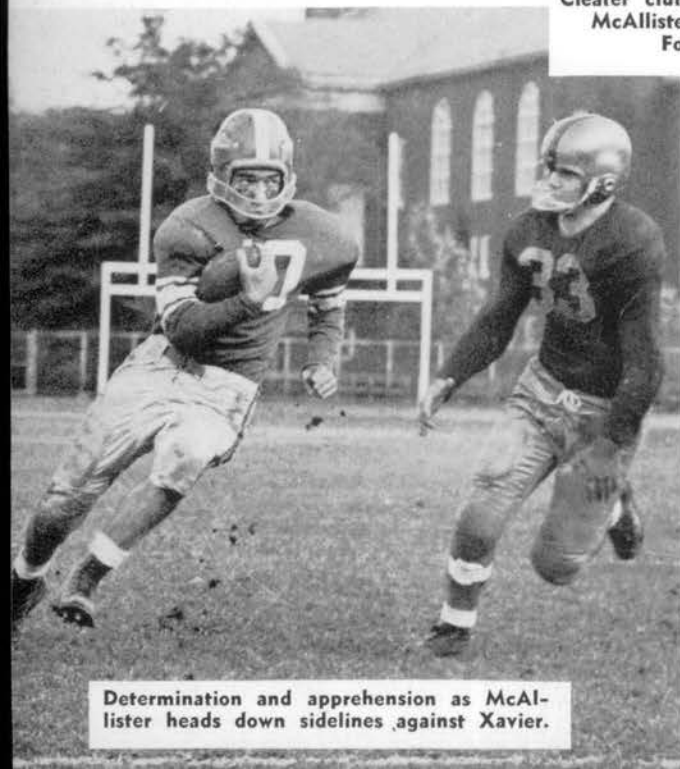

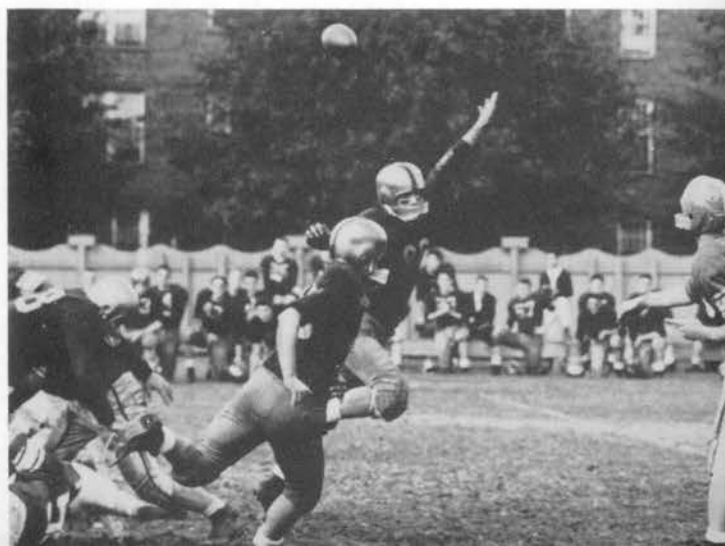

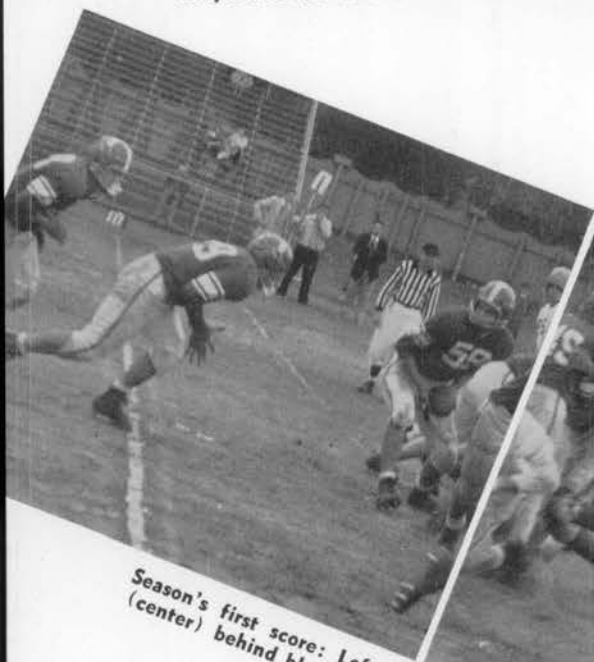

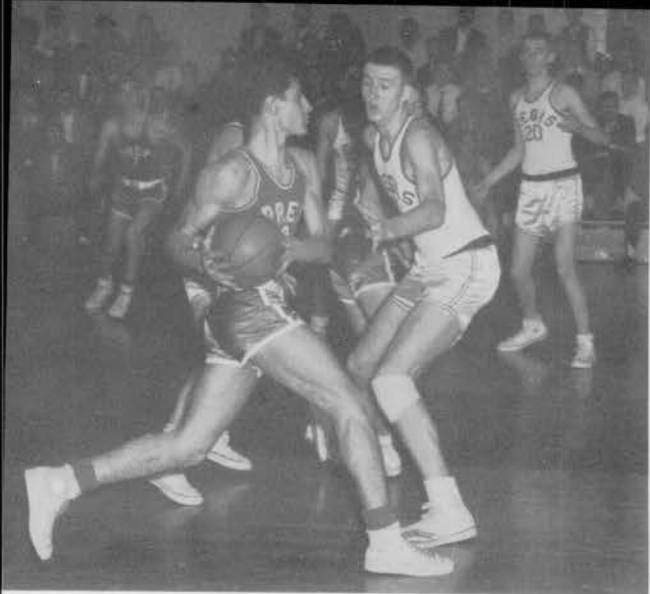

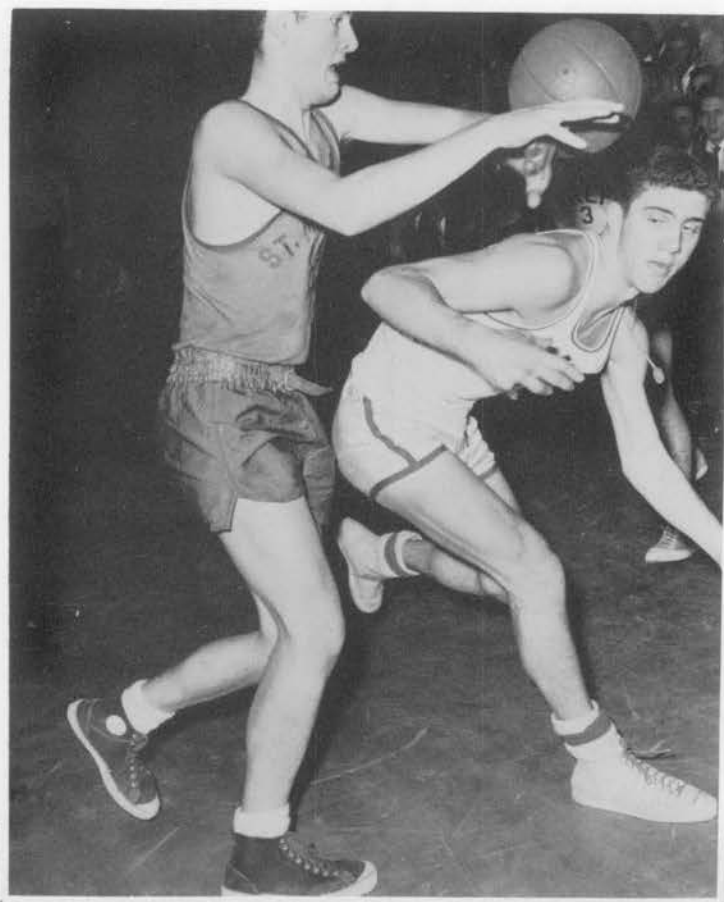

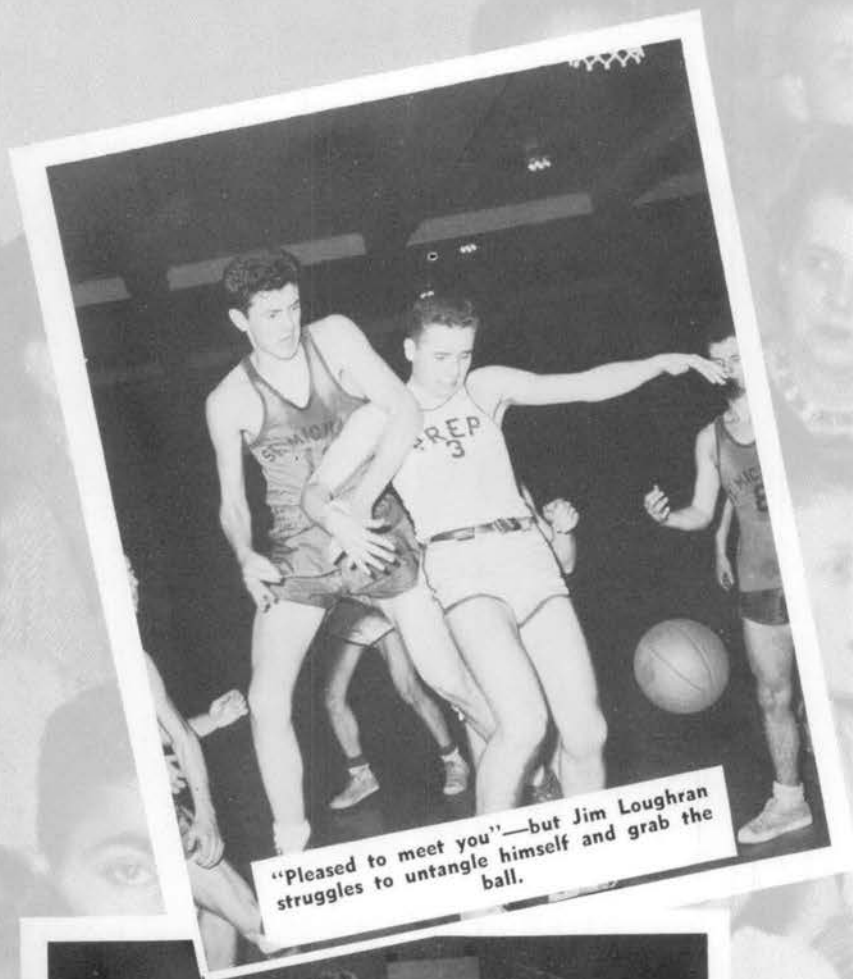

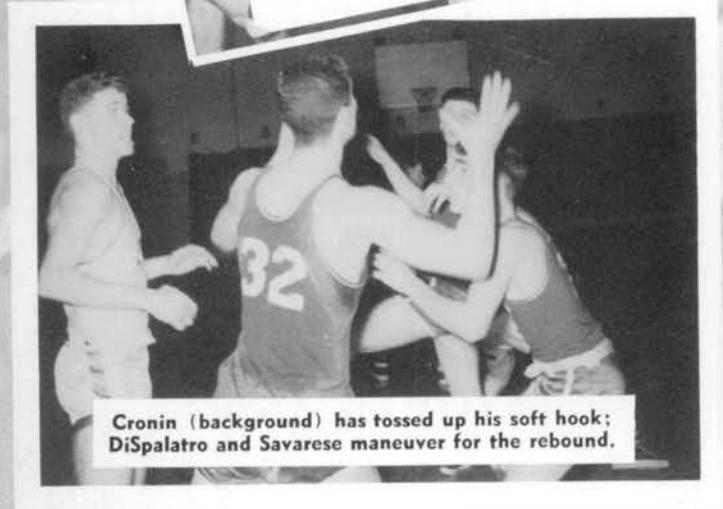

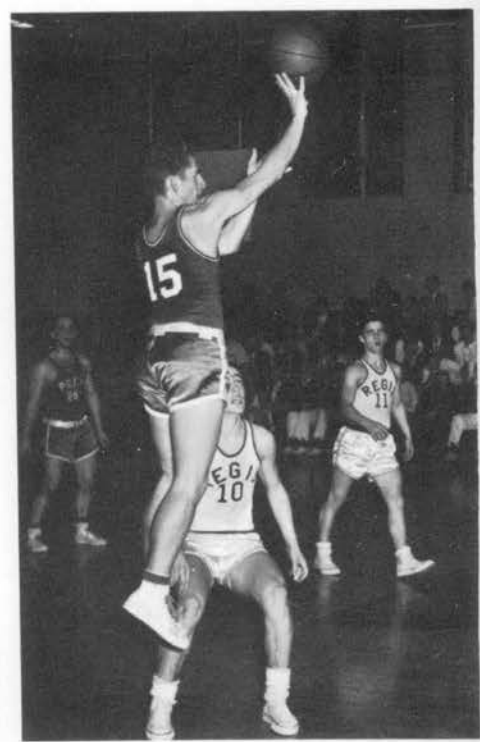

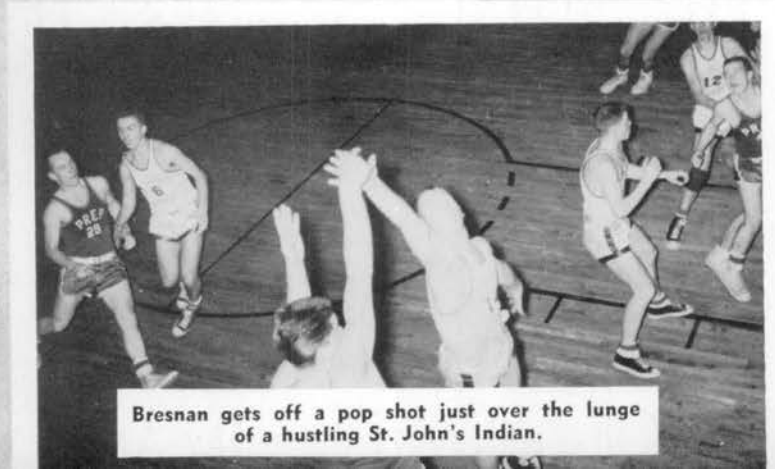

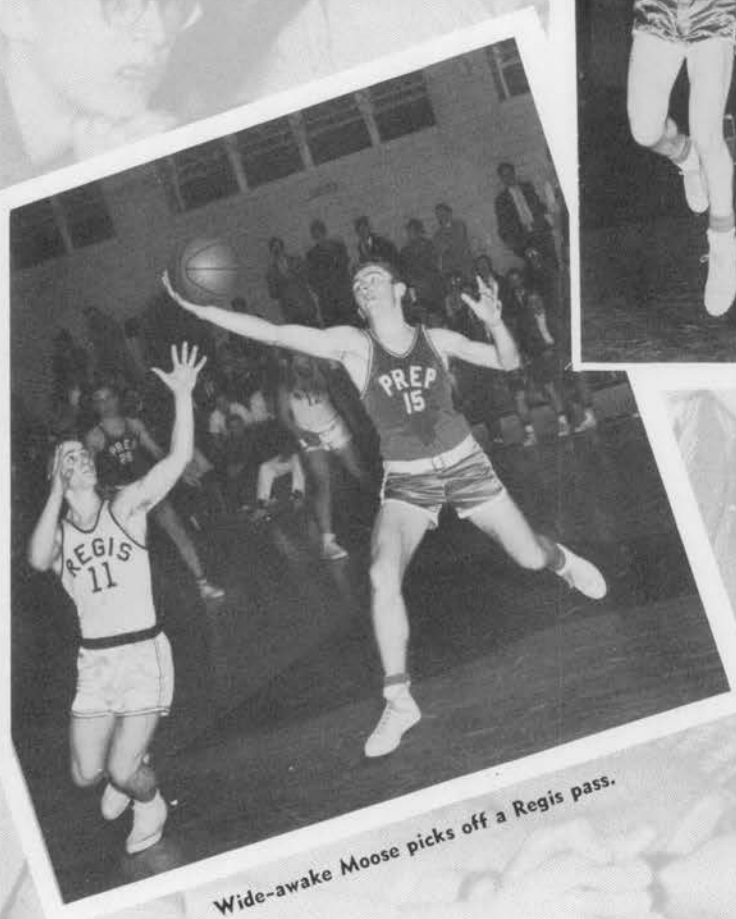

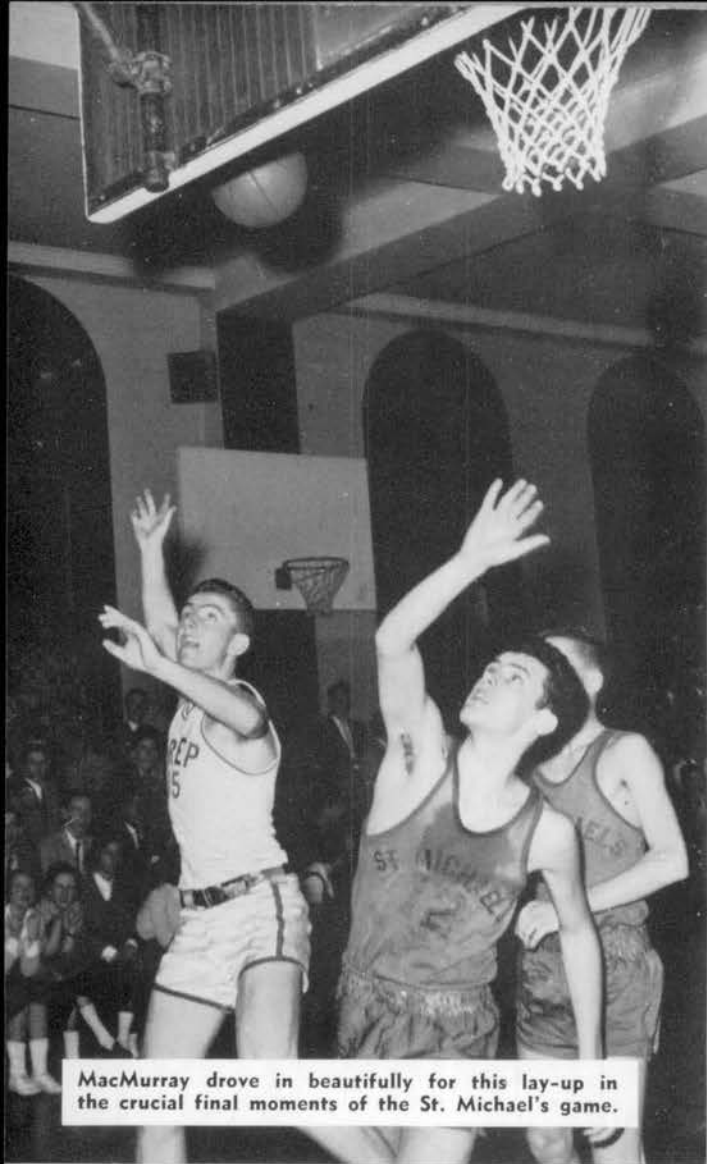

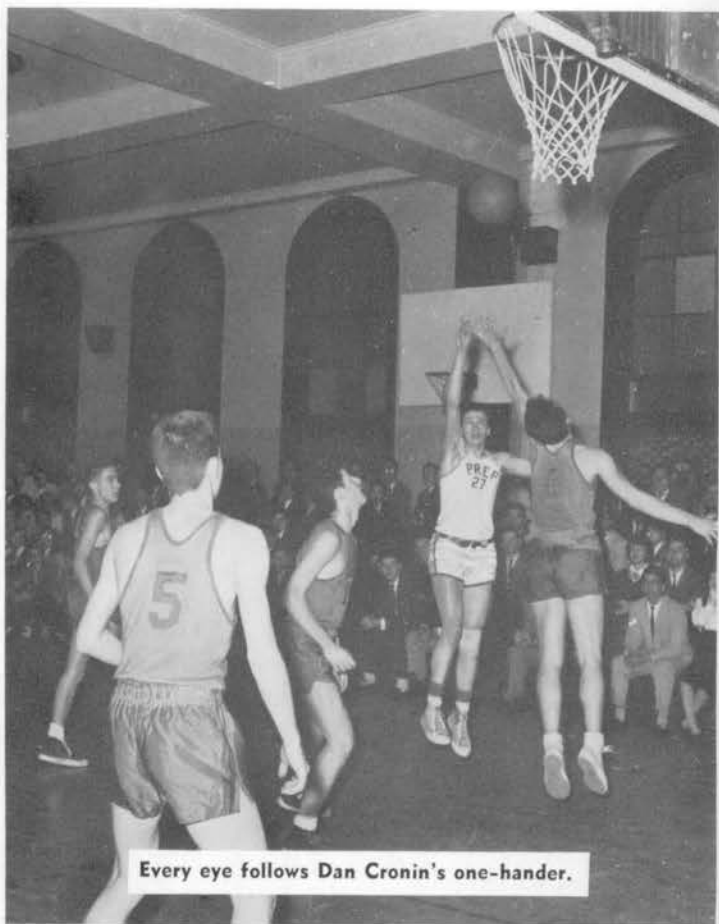

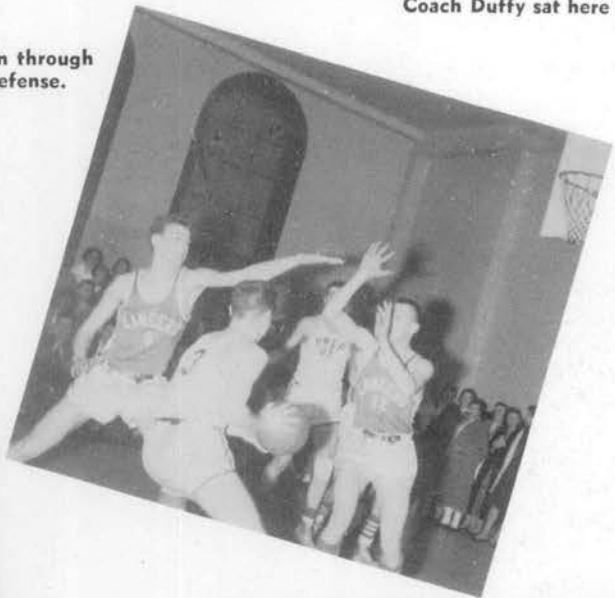

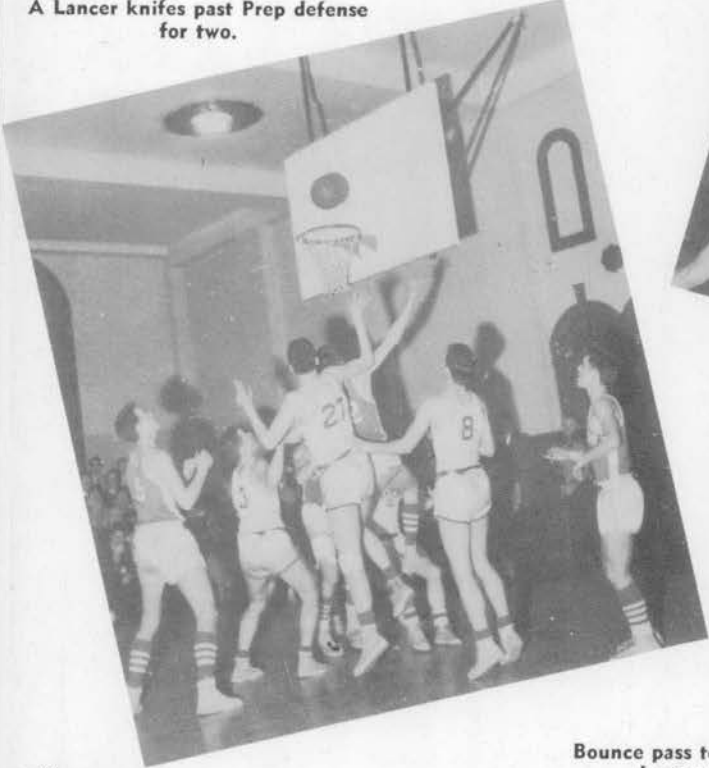

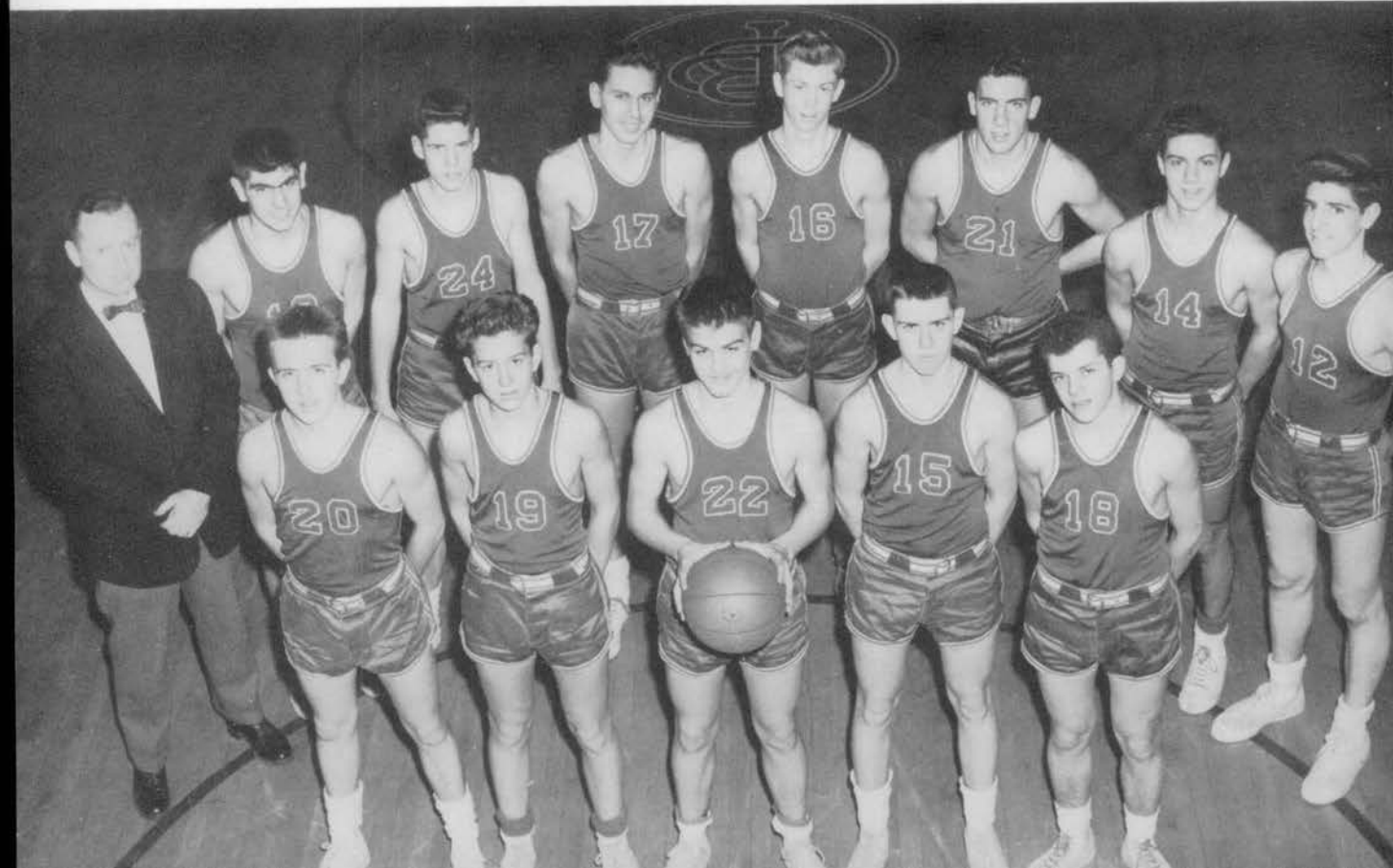

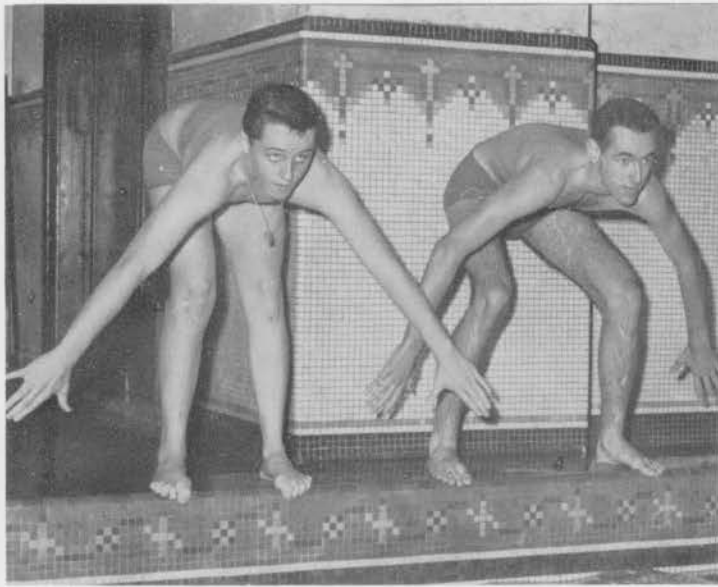

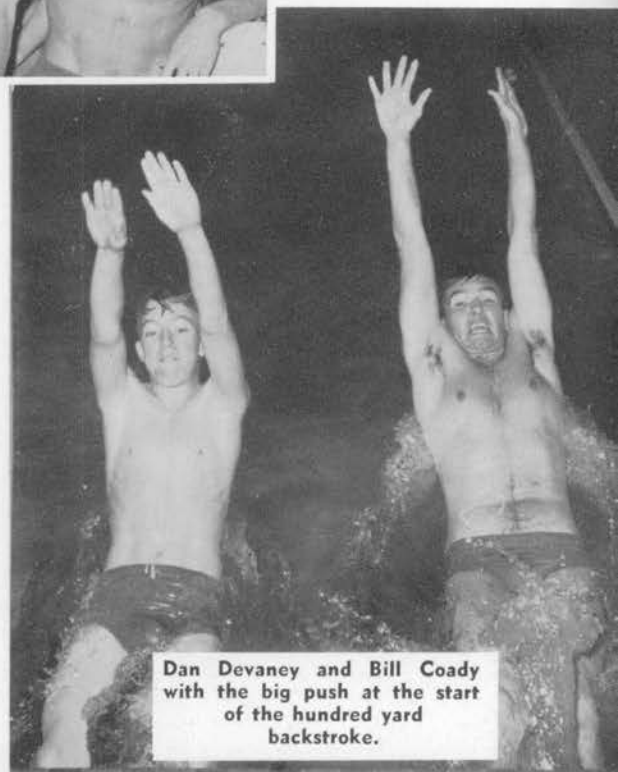
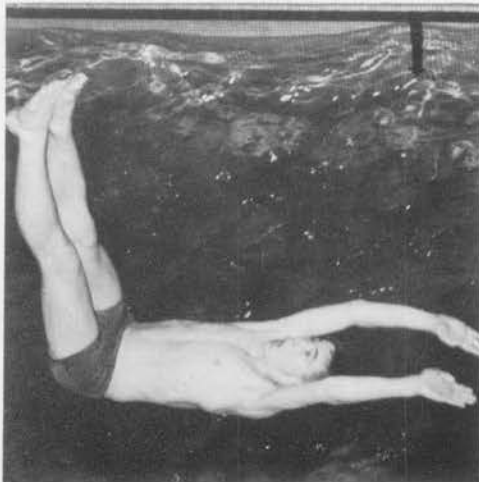

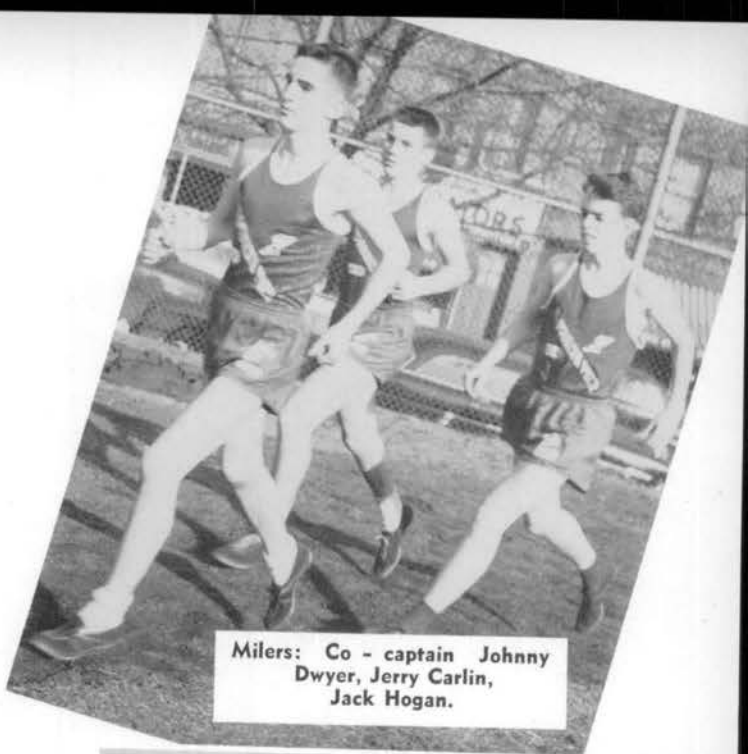

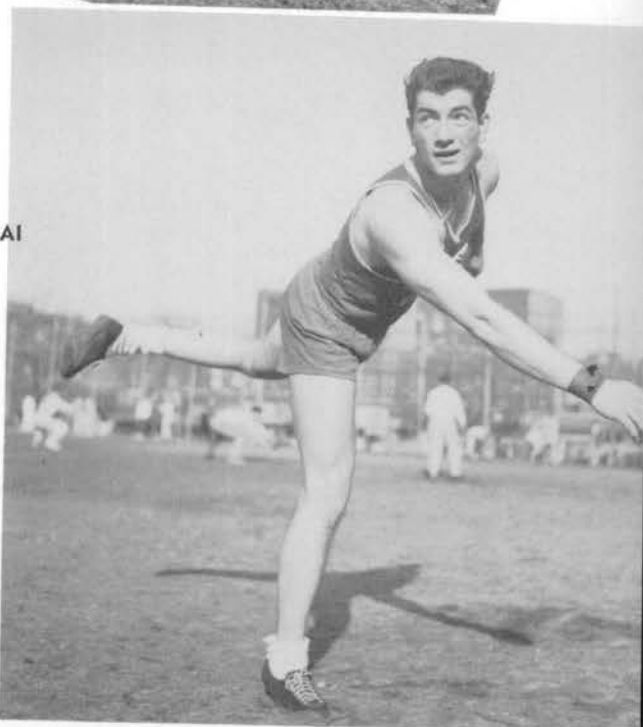

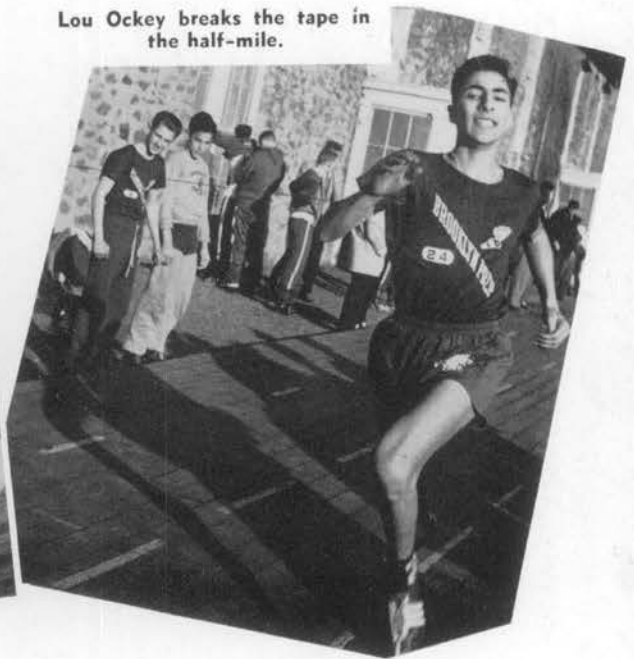

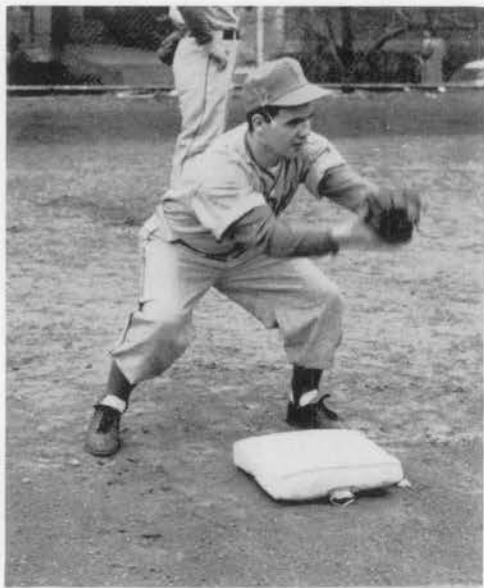

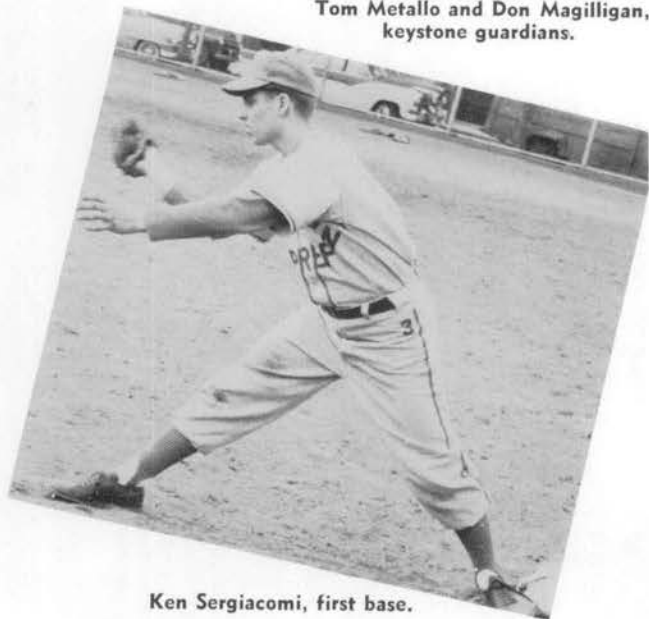

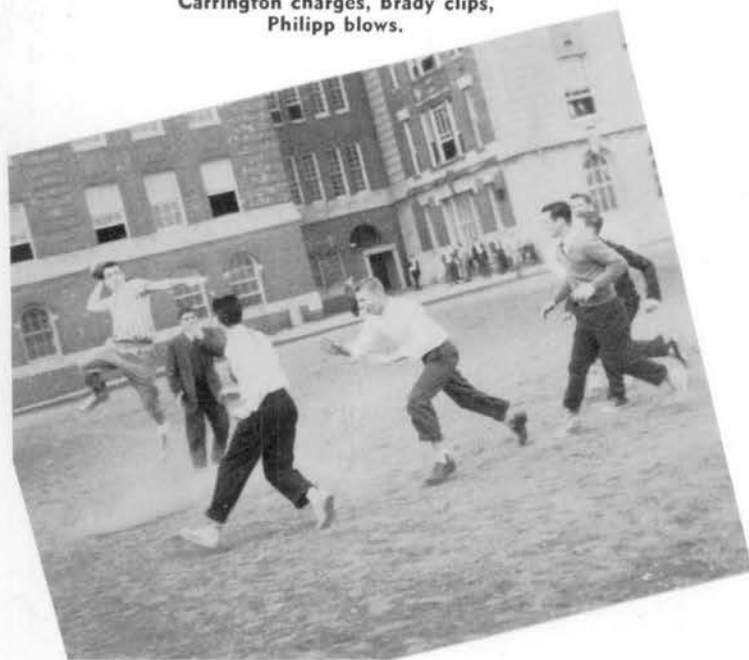

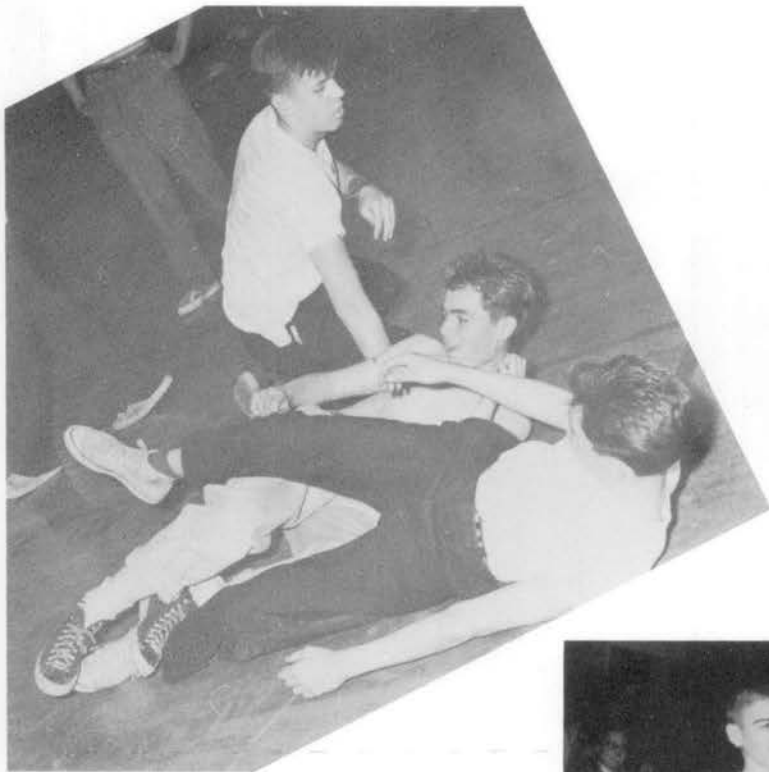

Leading figures, as always, dominated this year's world drama: Warsaw's Cardinal hailed the first crack in Poland's Iron Curtain; the United States' executive leaders began another term of office; Hungary's national hero was freed from the grasp of the Red fist; the unsuccessful Democratic nominee led the country's large minority.

The diploma is the sign, for Prep's leading figures, of the successful conclusion of a part in the Prep drama. Having filled their subordinate role of underclassmen for three years, and their term of leadership for another, the graduates go on now to larger parts on the world stage, for which Prep has prepared them.

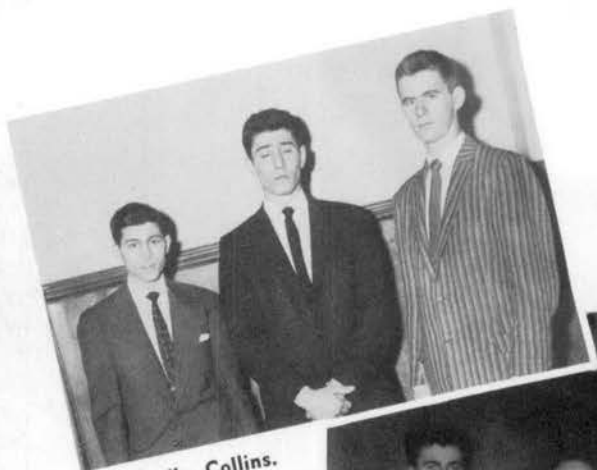

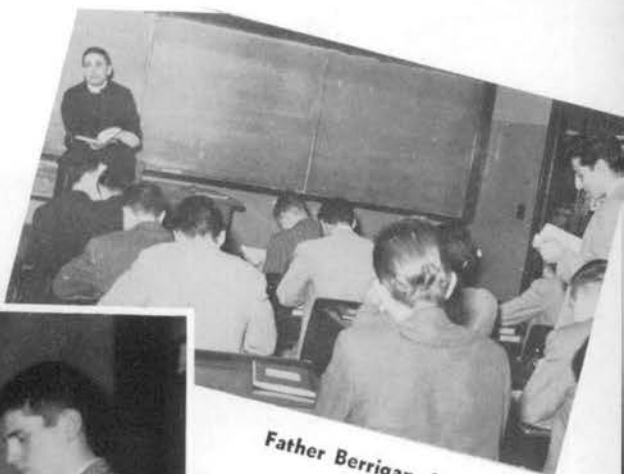
