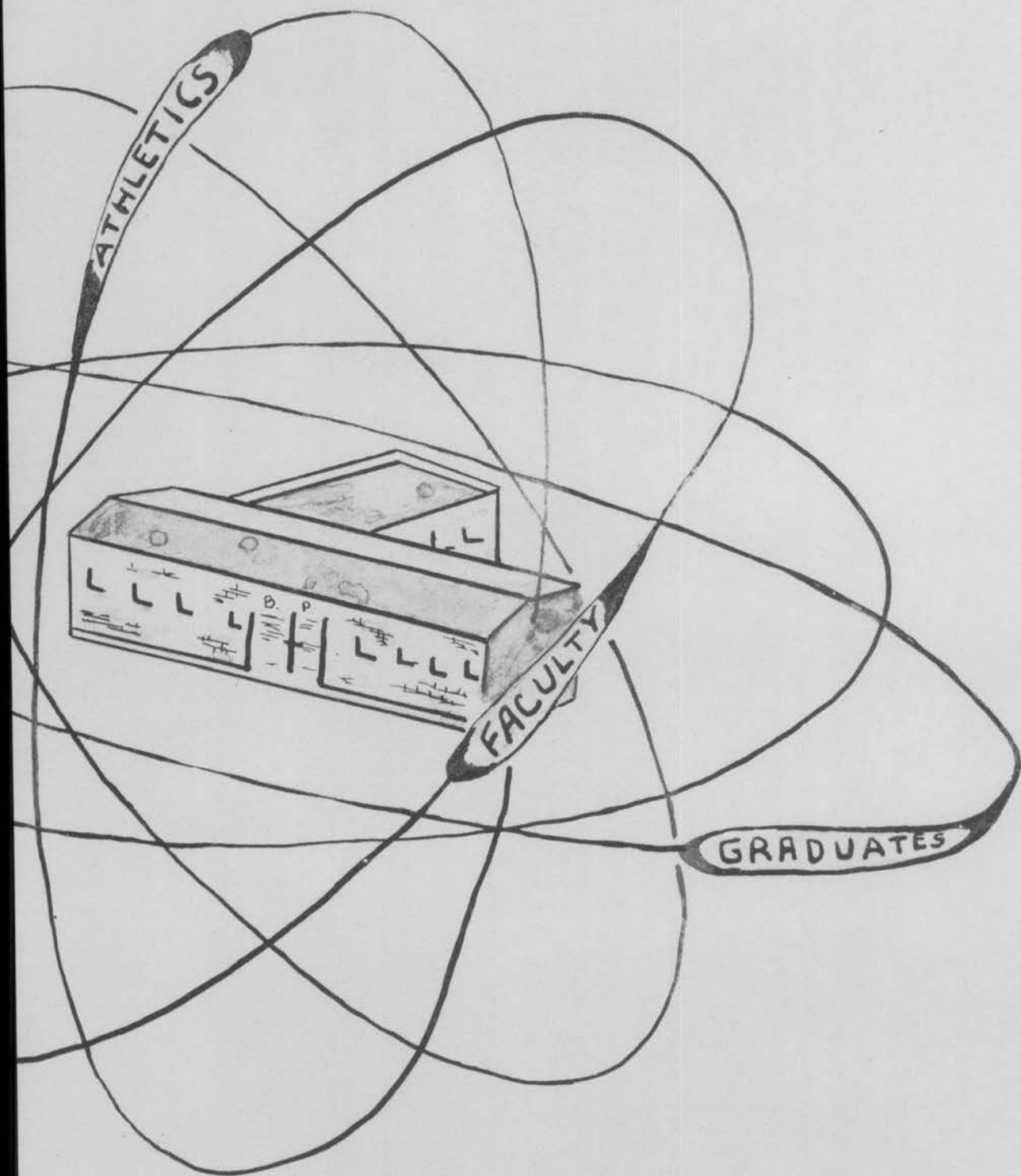
In Memoriam

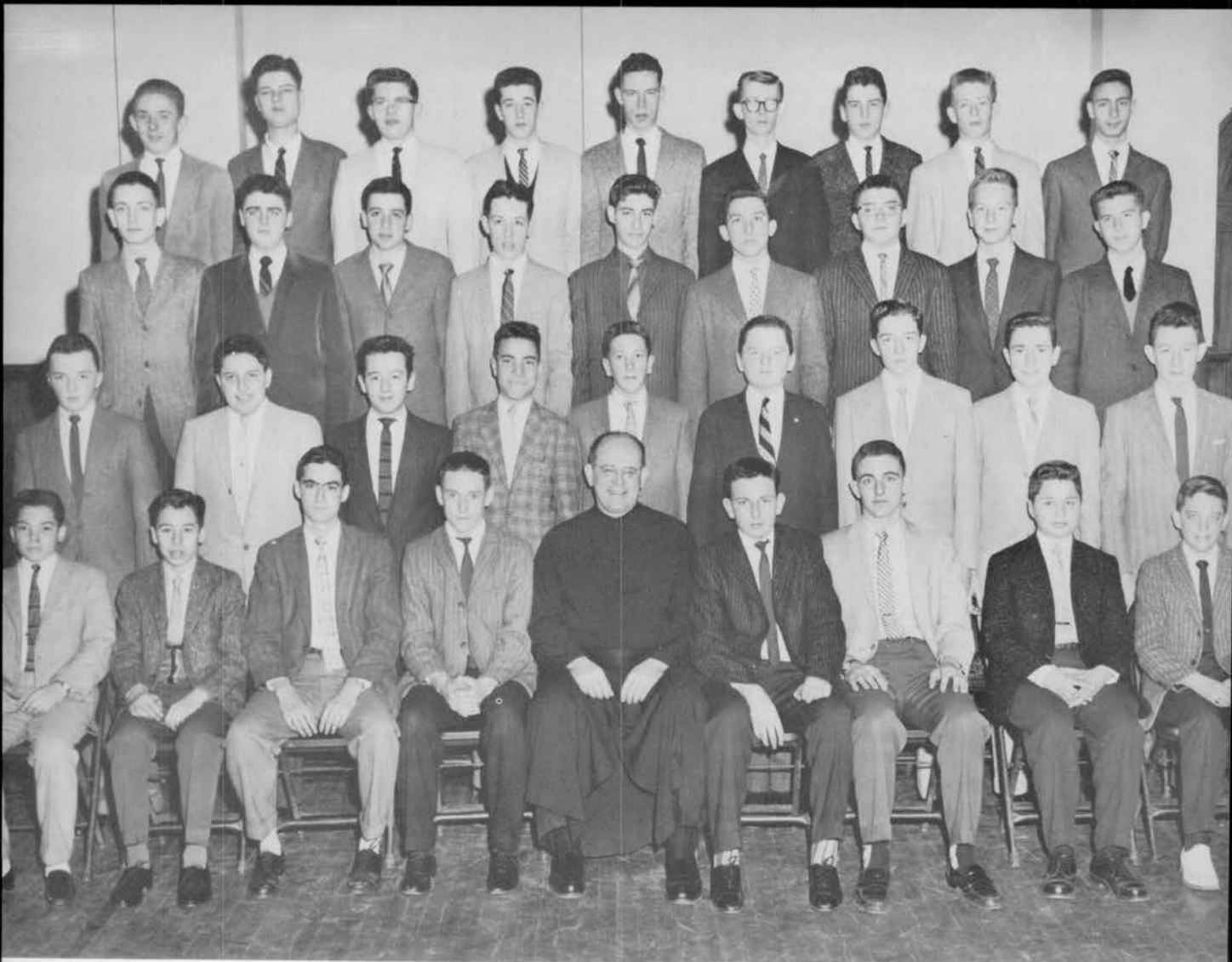

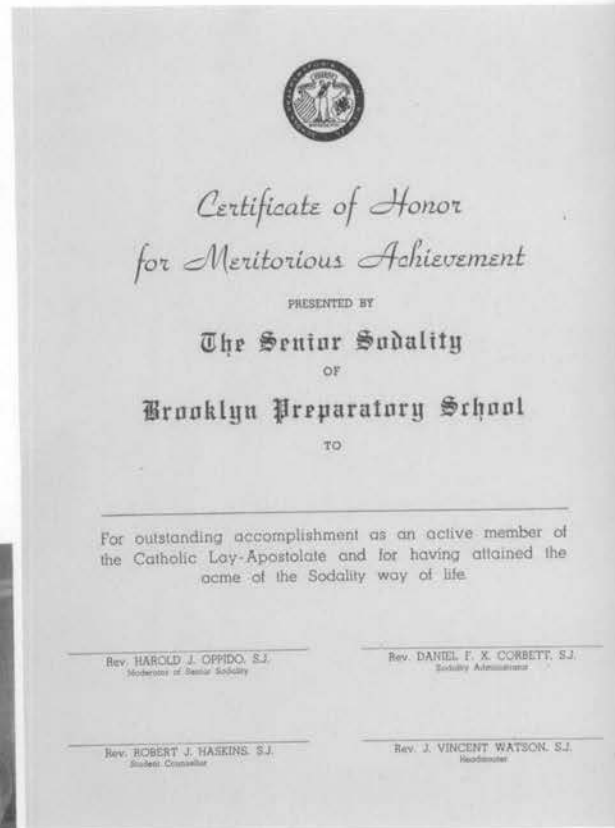

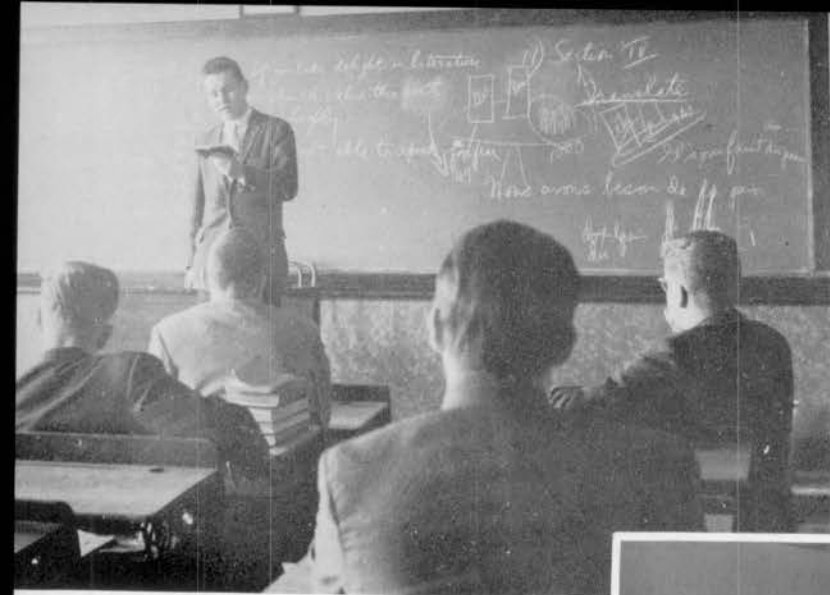

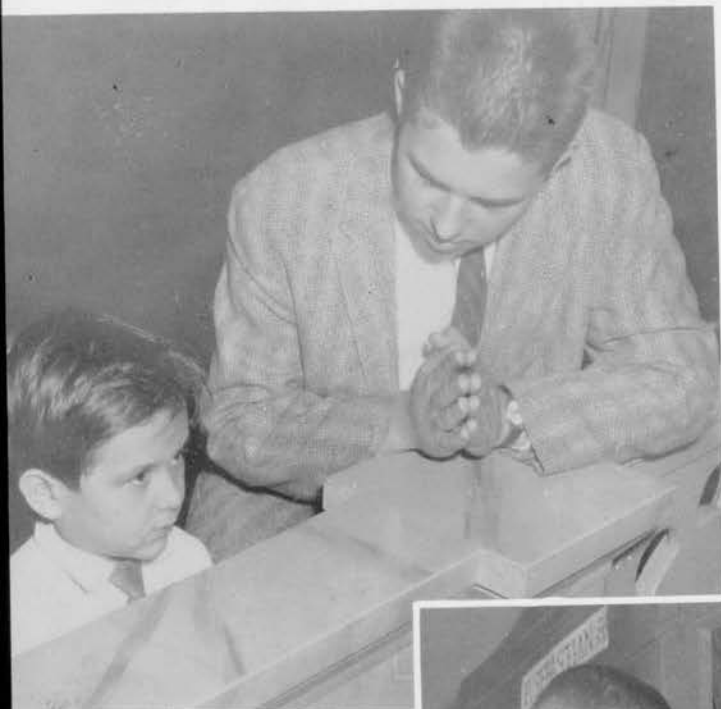

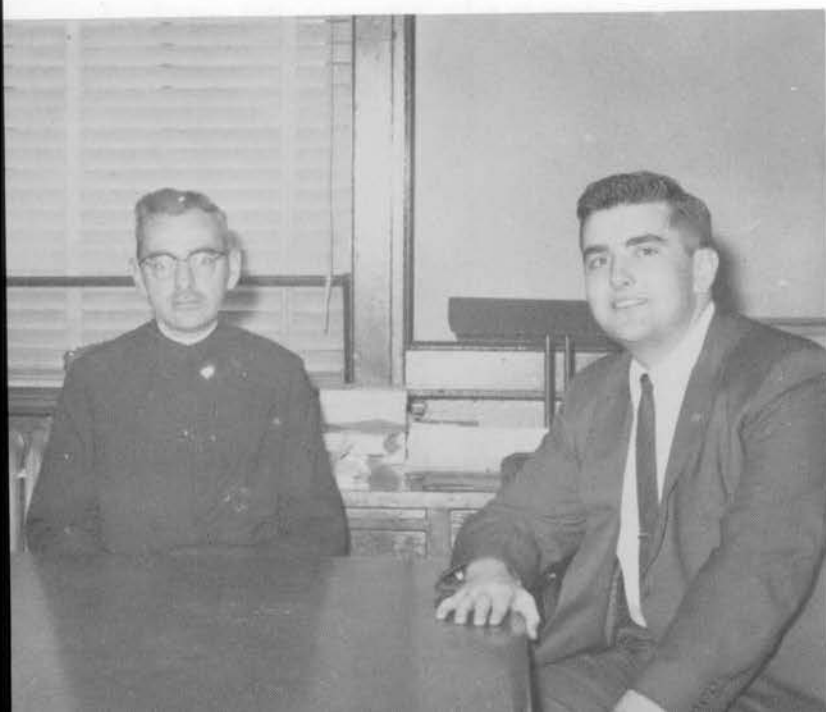

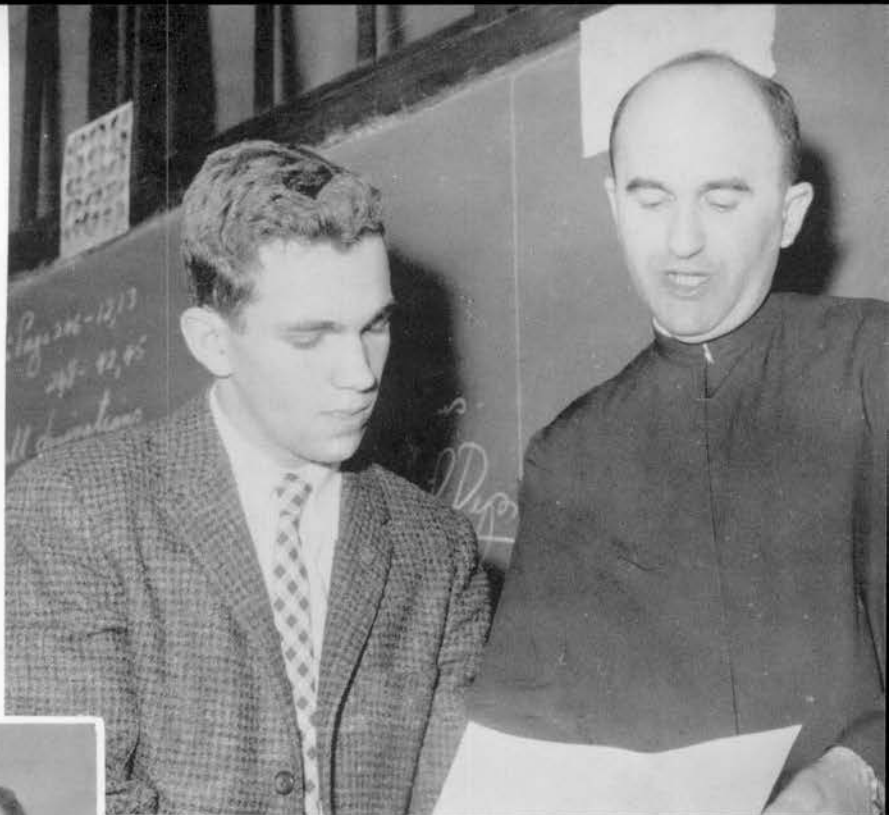

Speakers Keep Prep on Top

A powerhouse in forensic circles in recent years, Prep was acclaimed once again this year as one of the best in metropolitan, and even national, competition. Climax of the year's success was the outstanding triumph won by debaters John Sexton and Leo Amari in Washington, where they were crowned as the top National Catholic Debating Team.

With Clint Vickers and Ken Bleakley, this pair also took first place in the Georgetown Tournament (28 schools) and the Brooklyn-Queens Championships of ten schools. They placed second of forty at St. Peter's and second of twenty-one at St. John's.

The Jayvee team of Ed Mullin, Carlos Gonzalez, Frank Greene and Russ Sloun hit their peak with a fourth-place finish in a varsity tournament for 68 schools at New York University.

Brightest light in the debating field was John Sexton, who, besides spearheading his team's efforts in every tourney, was voted top debater in St. Joseph's College and St. Peter's College tournaments, second at St. John's, and third at Fordham and Georgetown. John was also voted top speaker in the National Forensic League Student Congress, qualified as District representative in the national finals, and was selected one of the outstanding delegates to the Daily Mirror Youth Forum.

On the Oratory side of the season's scores, though the score was not so high as in Debating, this department was greatly improved, largely through the work of Fr. DiGiacomo, S.J., Moderator, over previous years. In the spring Grand Tournament, in fact, Prep finished a close second, in the combined fields of original oratory, declamation, extempore and dramatic interpretation, as well as debate, and qualified eight speakers for the National Catholic Finals, the highest representation from any school.

Prep's most solid oratorical entry was the extempore team of Ken Bleakley, John Sexton and George Mahoney; Frank Greene, in Declamation, and Russ Sloun and Gus Kuhn in Dramatics, were also consistent point-getters. Mike Ryan, Prep's entry in the American Legion Oratorical Contest this year, won the local and district contest, comprising Kings and Richmond Counties, before bowing out in the zone finals. Mike also placed second in the Grand Tournament's original oratory division, qualifying for the National Finals.

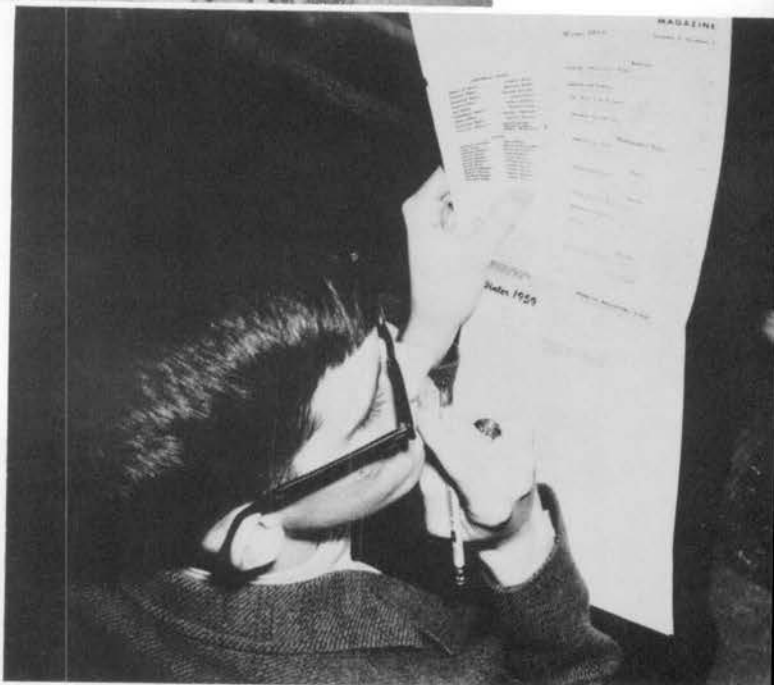

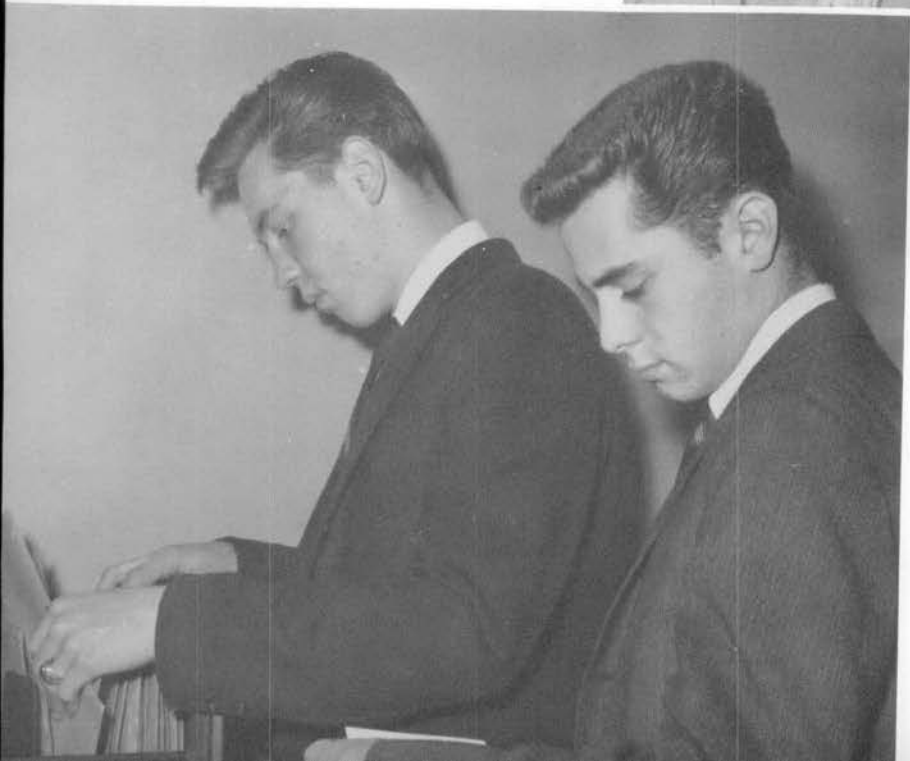

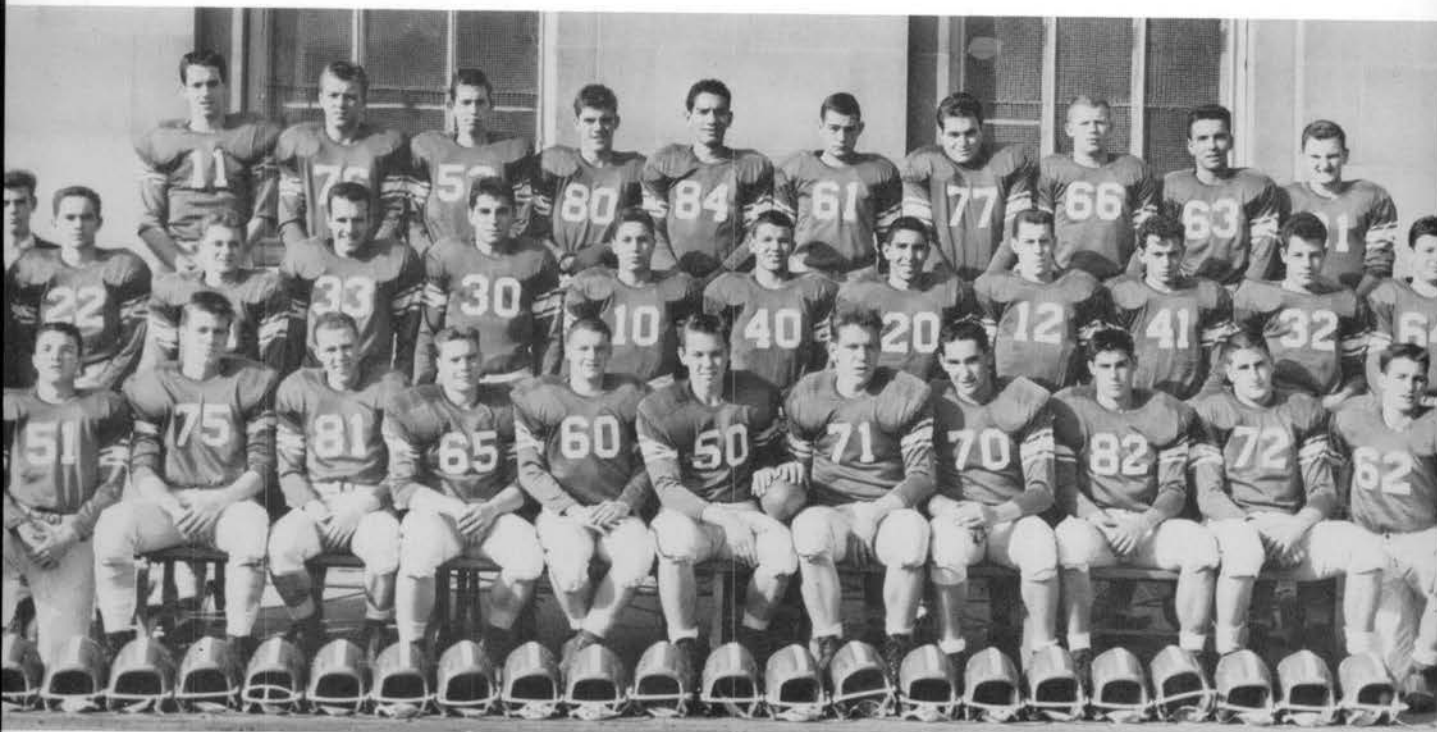
As the 1958 season got under way, every Prepman sensed that this was THE year — the pearl of great price, victory over St. John's, was within reach.

However, there were to be pitfalls along the way. In the opening game, against Fordham, the inexperienced Prep eleven found the Rams too smooth and powerful, and succumbed, 26-0. But against Xavier, Prep unveiled too strong an attack and too tenacious a defense to allow the Cadets a chance, triumphing, 26-0.

Stymied in the Jersey mud in the first half, Prep left the field trailing St. Cecilia, 7-0, but exploded for three touchdowns in the first six minutes of the second half, and added another in the fourth period to make the final score 25-7.

Seton Hall of Patchogue ran up against the Prep machine on the day when every cog was functioning perfectly. The result was a 28-0 Prep lead at the half, and a final score of 35-7. On offense and defense, the Prep line pushed the Islanders all over the field; Harry Wheeler, in particular, spent most of his time in the opponents' backfield. Offensive honors were spread among Milian, LaRusso, O'Connor, Addeo and McCloskey.

Overconfidence, spoiler of so many fine records, struck at the Prep forces in the game against LaSalle Military Academy. As a result, after Addeo's 78-yard touchdown sprint with the opening kickoff, the Soldiers dominated the game, and Prep was glad to escape with a 7-7 tie. But the bitter pill

brought the desired cure, and the chastened Prep forces regrouped with new zeal for the crucial game.

The St. John's game, in calm retrospect at least, was all Prep's, featuring two quick touchdowns, stubborn defensive action, and a final tally, with seconds left, as gravy for the Thanksgiving turkey. Score: 20-8.

Early in the first quarter, St. John's McElroy buffeted by a sea of Prep tacklers, fumbled Wheeler's punt on his own goal line and Cal Lockwood fell on the ball to give Prep the lead. A driving 40-yard run by Milian set up Addeo's touchdown, and Prep settled down to insuring the victory. The defensive line, led by Fusco and Shortt, linebackers Charlie Dietz and Bill Darcy, and the secondary of Milian and Bill Martin kept the Indians bottled up until, with seconds left, Ken Crowley picked off an errant pass and squeezed into the end zone, routing the awful specter of nine years of defeat.

The brightest stars of the Prep galaxy were singled out at the season's end. Co-captain Jim Fusco was named to the first team of the Tablet, News and Telegram All-Catholic squads; co-captain Jim Shortt was picked on the Telegram's second team, and shared various Honorable Mentions with Al Milian, Jack O'Connor, Barry McCloskey and Richie Addeo. The always dependable, often brilliant Milian was awarded the Dahut trophy at the Sports Dinner as the outstanding football player of the season. Finally, in a richly-deserved tribute, Coach Dick Reilly was named by the Tablet as the Outstanding Coach of THE year.

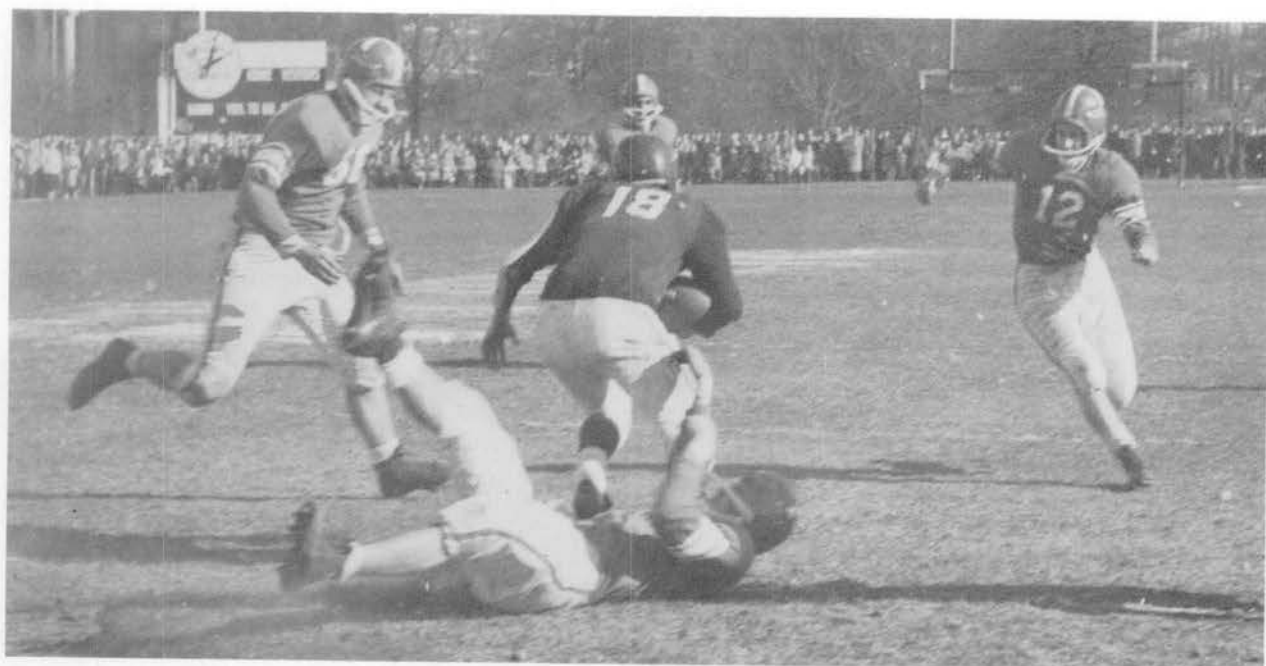

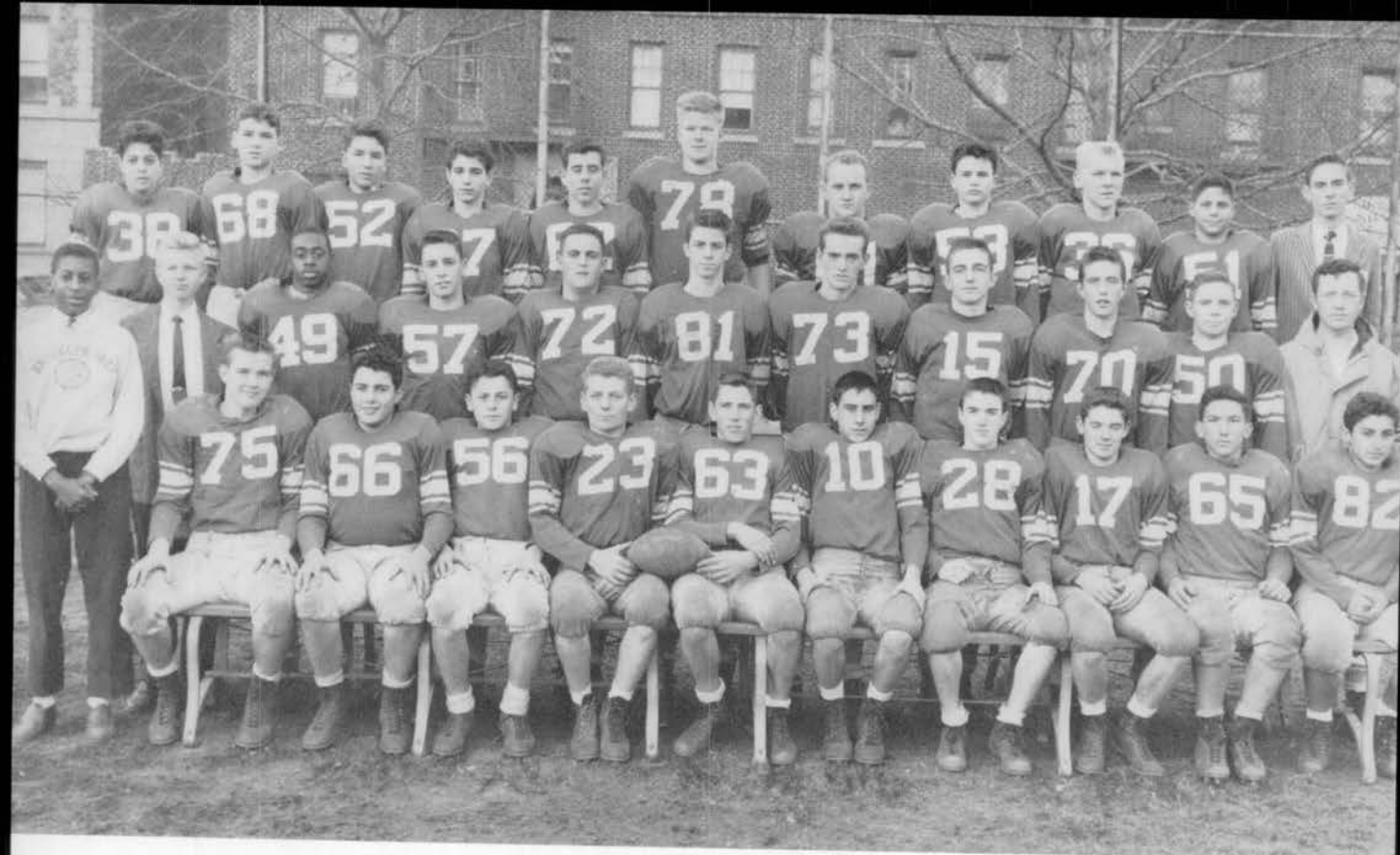

The 1958 Junior Varsity football team enjoyed the kind of season that is becoming typical for that squad. Numbering on its roster a large majority who have had no football experience, the team took a bit of time to find the starter, but then picked up, roared to life, and finished in high gear. Coach Tom Gibbons, faced with an assortment of sizes and abilities, capitalized on the one common factor, eagerness, to form a team that at season's end had registered four wins against two defeats, and gave promise of high-caliber play for future varsities.

Culled from the crowd, the starting team, led by Co-captains Esposito and John Whelan, was made up of Richie Ryan and "Tiger" Torrillo, at ends, Mike Slovak and Bill Crook, tackles, Esposito and Lou Rotundi, guards, and center Nick Salvatore. Line up behind them were quarterback Fernando Corry, halfbacks Ed Draney and John Dockery, and fullback Whelan.

In their baptism of fire, the Jayvee more than met their match in Brooklyn Tech, who held an early 6-0 lead throughout the last three quarters. Prep penetrated as far as the three-yard line just before the final gun, but could not push it over.

Freshman John Dockery had a field day against Xavier, setting up several touchdowns by his long runs. The team was blocking and tackling with more authority now, and the new teamwork told on the Cadets, 34-6.

Poly Prep lowered the Prep flag, however, with an 8-0 defeat. After the early Poly score, the Prep defense stiffened, but the offense could not roll.

From then on, the battle song had a victorious lilt. Fordham bowed, 16-0, and allowed four other scores which were called back. John Whelan shone, throwing a touchdown pass to Ryan, and blocking a Fordham kick. St. John's fought strongly, but could not overcome a first period 6-0 Prep lead. In the final game, the opening defeat was avenged by a return-engagement victory over Brooklyn Tech, 20-6.

Outstanding players, selected after each game, were Richie Ryan, Joe Whelan, Ed Draney, Bill Crook and Chester Weber. The varsities of the future will be seeing much of these boys and their now-experienced cohorts.

Berkery Paces Hoopmen to 13-7

The 1959 Prep basketball team provided the extraordinary quota of thrills that is fast becoming ordinary on the Prep court, as well as the best record in four years, the highest scorer in history, and, unfortunately, several inexplicable lapses which cost Prep the most successful record in its fifty-one years.

To the team's credit, it never stayed "down" for long; in fact, only once did it lose as many as two games in succession. In the debit column, it was likewise unable to string more than three victories together. In two games, its disorganized play discouraged all but the most rabid fans; on two other occasions, at least, the Prep five was brilliant.

The Alumni, in the first game, put up an unusually strong fight, principally because it featured three squads of varsity players from the past three years, but the Varsity won out in the last quarter. St. Augustine was the next victim, by eight points, as Dan Berkery gave the first of his thirteen "over-twenty" performances.

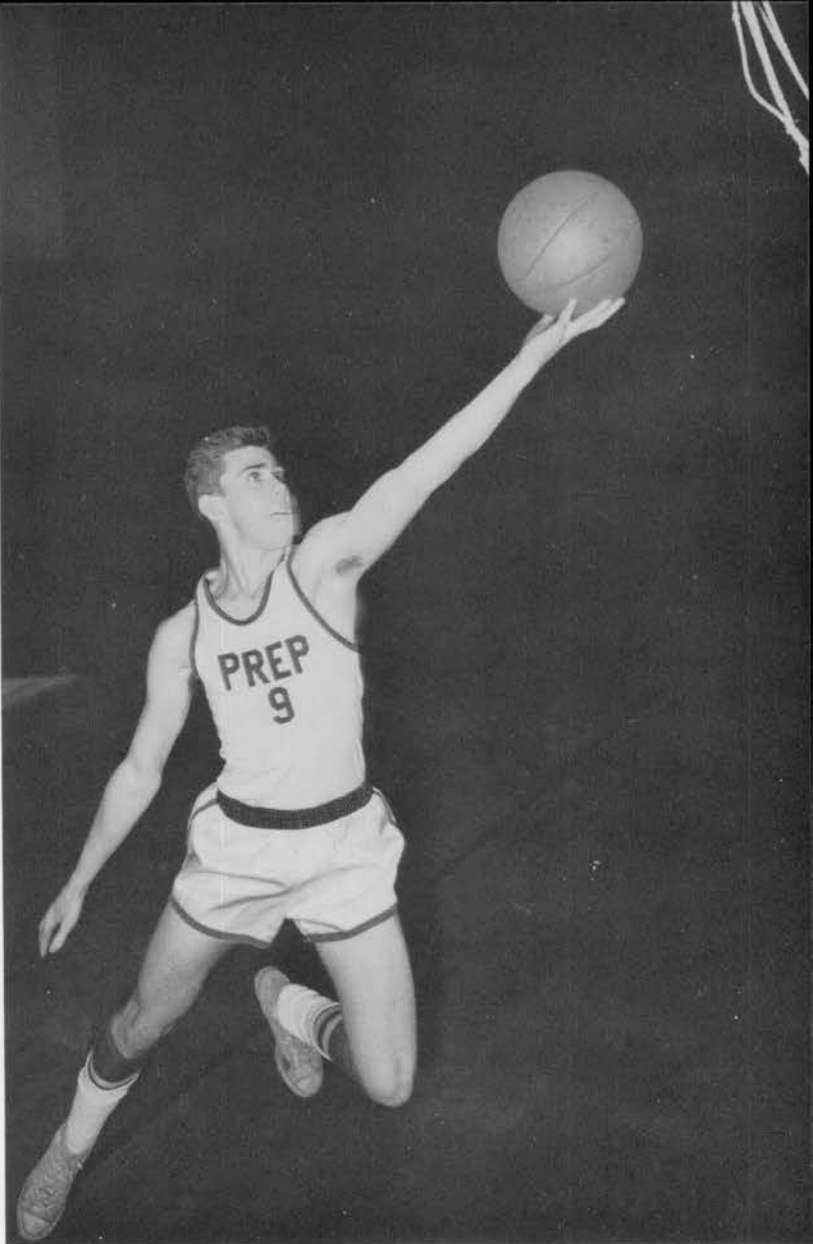
Captain Charlie Myers, Lippy Leupold and Berkery all fouled out in a close defeat to Loughlin, but Prep sprang back to overcome St. Michael's 10-point halftime lead for a 51-50 victory. The bid for a third straight was thwarted by Fordham, which broke through an early Prep freeze, for an overtime win. Kew Forest put up little opposition, but tuned up the Prep team for a sparkling victory over a taller Regis squad, with "Deadly Dan" reaching his season's high of 36 points. A close loss to

Fordham in the Jesuit Tournament and a poor performance against St. Michael's put the only double defeat on the Prep books, but the team rebounded in a last-second victory over Xavier.

An easy win over Rice and a last-quarter thriller over Adelphi preceded the other poor performance of the season, a twenty-point loss to Regis. But by this time Charlie Myers was recovering from an ankle injury, to provide scoring support for Berkery, and with Barry McCloskey finding his form, Leupold and Joe DiSpalatro taking charge in the back court, and Joe D'Agostin rebounding steadily and effectively, the team had to rely less on the scoring eye of Berkery.

A heart-breaking overtime loss to St. John's on a thirty-foot set shot with two seconds to go in overtime was a hard swallow, but the team bounced back over Trinity, a C.H.S.A.A. powerhouse, in the game that saw Prep and Captain Myers, reach their season's peak performance, a game Coach Bill Duffy called one of the two best he has coached in his nine years at Prep.

The seesaw, rocking true to form for the remainder of the season, finished on the upbeat, with an uphill victory over Xavier that showed the true team ability of Prep's starting five. The season scoreboard, indeed, had showed some disappointments, but far overshadowing those scattered occasions were the continual effort, exciting play and general excellence of the Prep 1959 Varsity.

Whether scanning the records of the full season's play, or witnessing one or more of the games from courtside, the Prep fan saw immediately that there was one sparkplug that the Prep machine depended on — the sparkplug which fired the team all season long. The play of Dan Berkery brought Prep fans to their feet in one game after another, roaring at his amazingly accurate jumpshots, his twisting drives underneath, at his outstanding rebounding. The scorebook is equally revealing: Dan set a school one-season scoring mark of 476 points for a 22.7 average, and led the team in foul-shooting percentage, with .714, an over-all performance that earned him a first-string berth on the New York News Brooklyn-Queens All-Catholic Team.

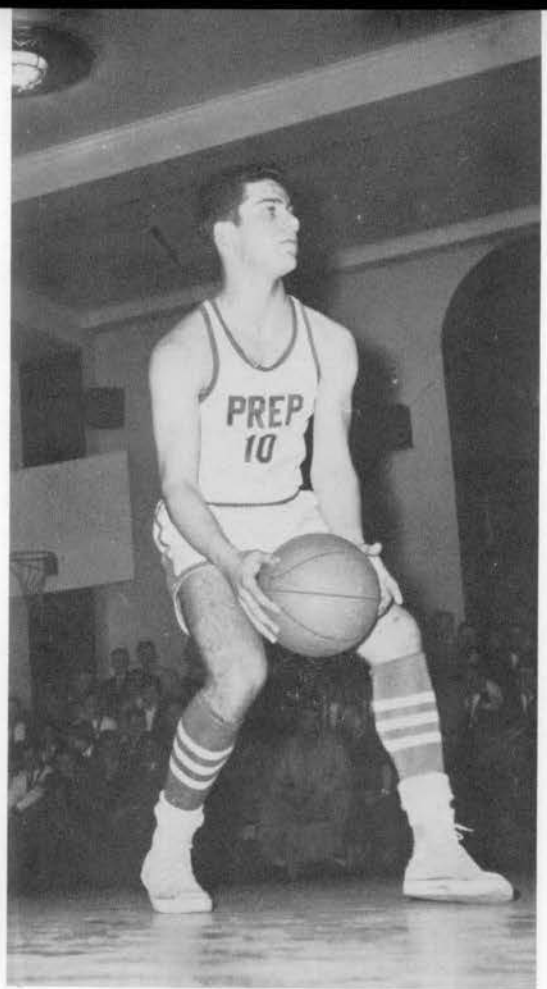
Dan's best effort was the first Regis game. Prep trailed, 35-32, at the half. Berkery had scored 13 points. Then, in the second half, the Berkery brand of magic, jumpshots, drives, and taps, boosted Prep to a runaway 74-50 victory. In desperation, two Regis players fouled out trying to stop him, but Dan cashed in 18 of 22 free throws and wound up leading both teams in scoring, with 36, and in rebounds, with 13.

Strangely enough, it was after the second Regis game, Prep's poorest performance of the season, that a visitor voiced his appreciation of Berkery. "I know he got only 12 points; but his fight and self-control and good sportsmanship were more impressive than the 36 points of the first game." The outsider had expressed what every Prep fan knew.

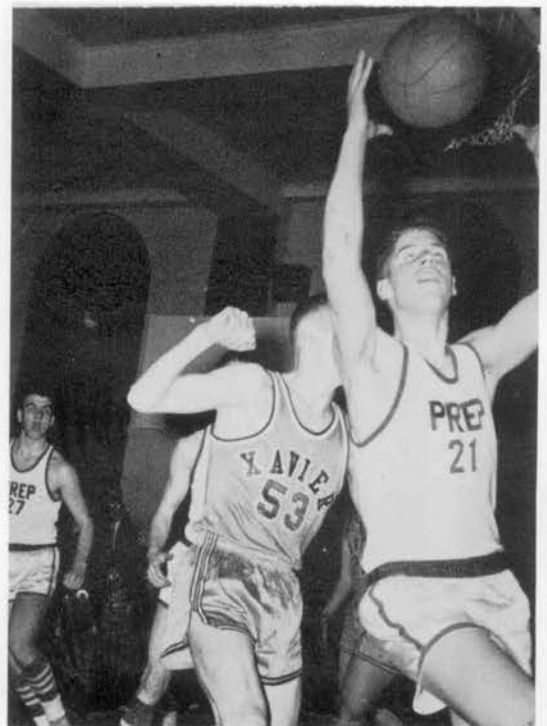

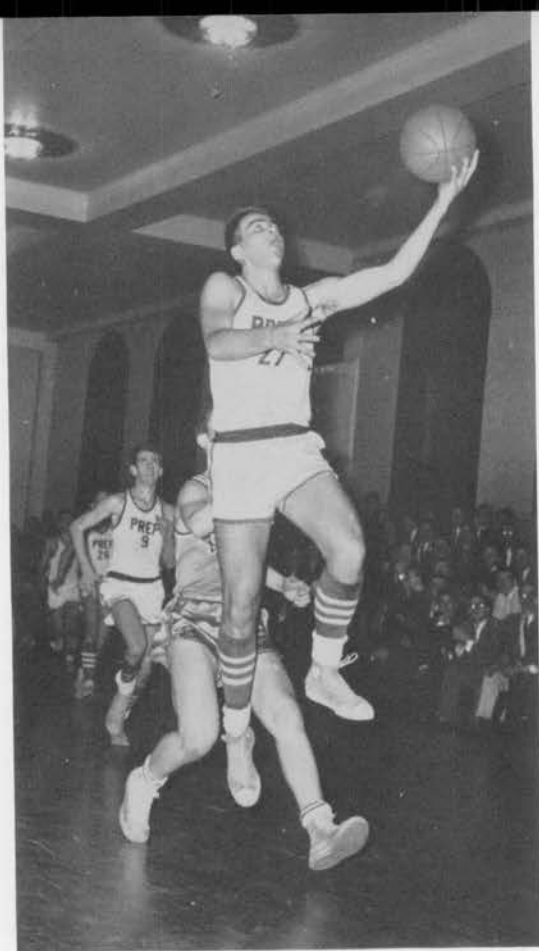

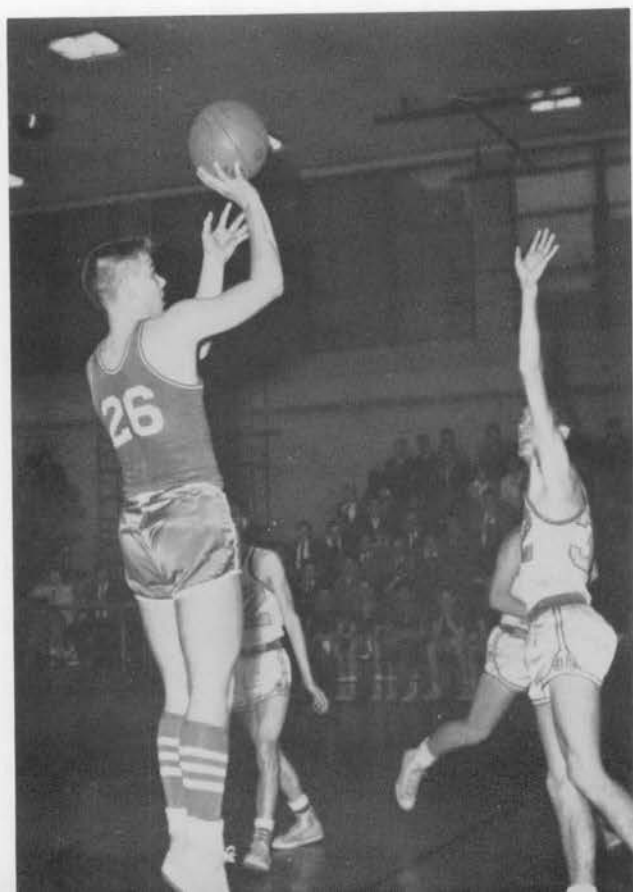

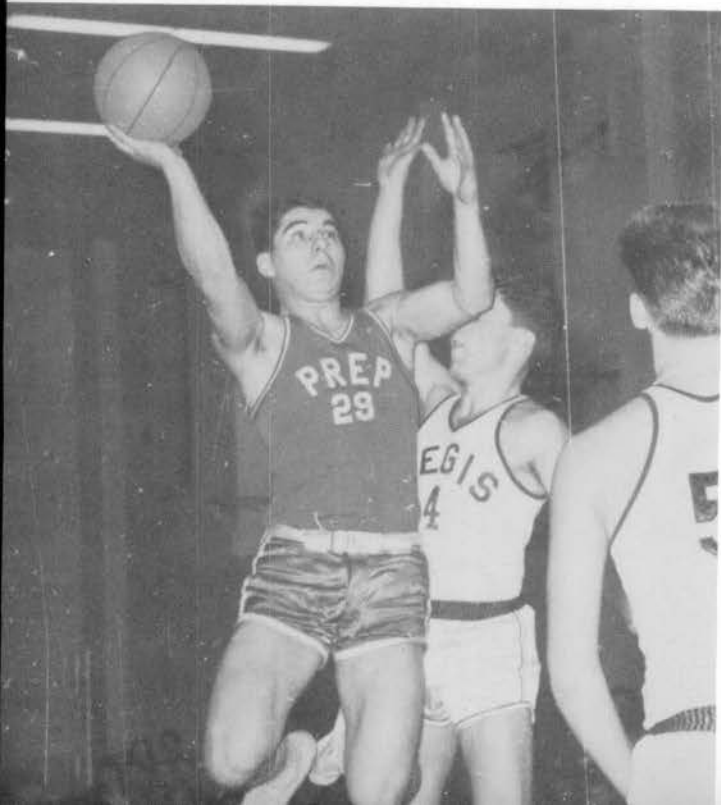

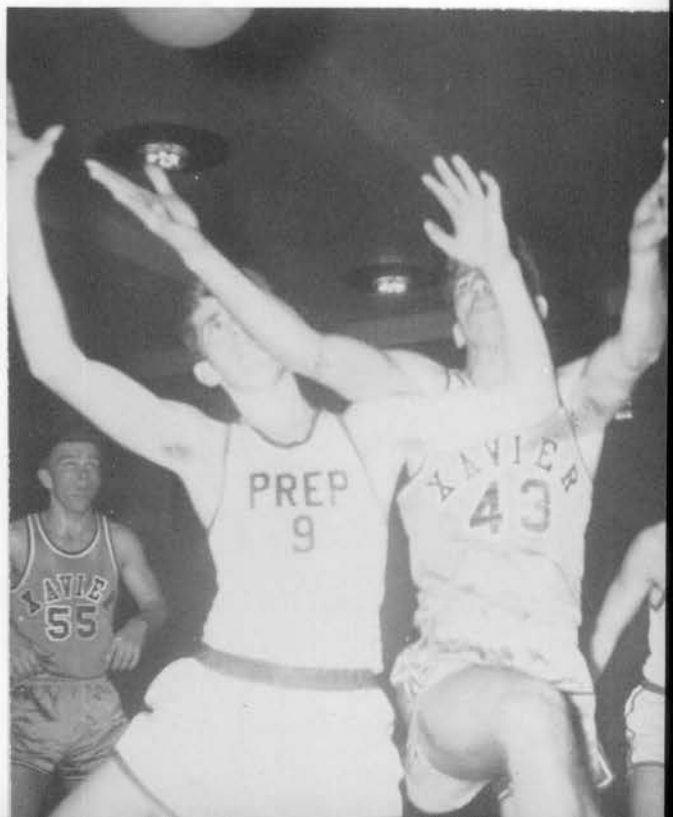


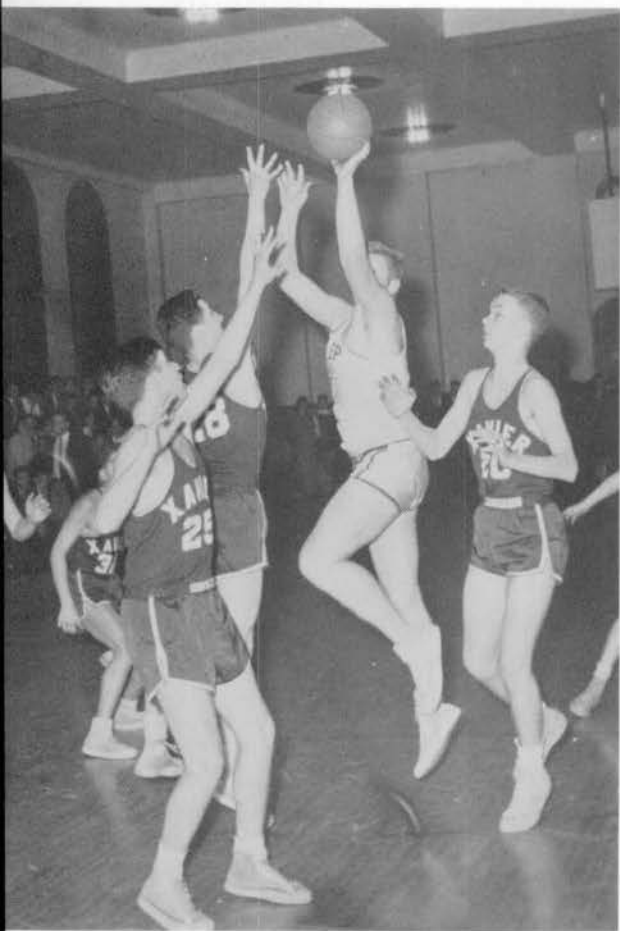

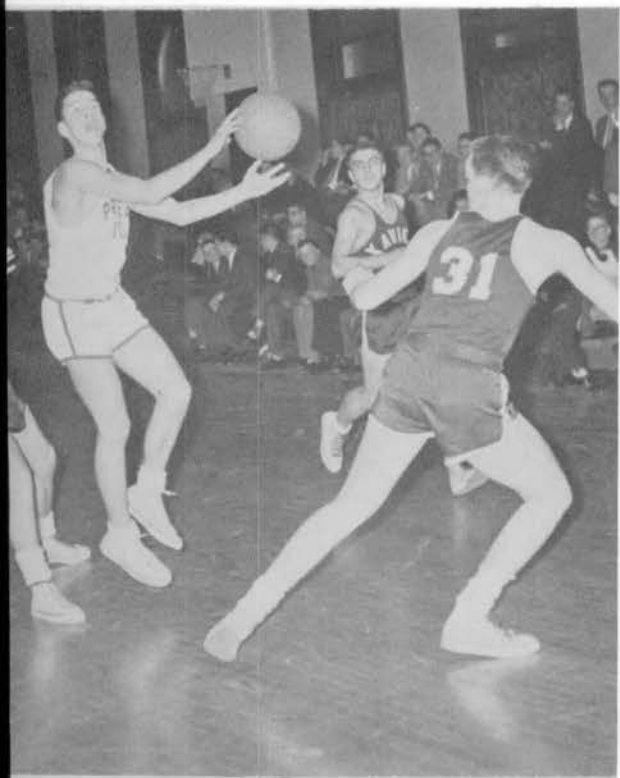

Due to the fact that Prep discontinued Freshman basketball this year, the Junior Varsity, using promising Freshmen, was younger than ever, sacrificing a more successful season of its own to the actual purpose of a J.V., readying boys for Varsity competition. Several Freshmen figured prominently in this year's action, and while this may have lost a few games, those boys will be that much advanced for having a season of J.V. competition under their belts.

Big guns on this year's Jayvee were two sophomores, Captain Jerry Carpentier and Richie Ryan, and Freshman Ed Ryan. Among them, these three scored over half of the season's total points. Aply supporting the Big Three were Sophs Ed Draney and Richie Newsum, Frosh Mike Bowles, John Dockery, Bingo McMahon and Ray Dearie.

Like any young team, the J.V. had its ups and downs, committing mistakes that cost ballgames, then showing fire and finesse that brought joy to Coach Duffy's heart. The final record of eight wins and nine losses could, with a few breaks, have been several games more successful, but the important thing was the experience acquired.

The record flitted around .500 all season. Early losses to Xaverian and Loughlin were balanced by victories over Fordham and St. Augustine. Richie Ryan, in his second season of competition, led the scoring with 49 points in those games, while Jerry Carpentier tallied 35.

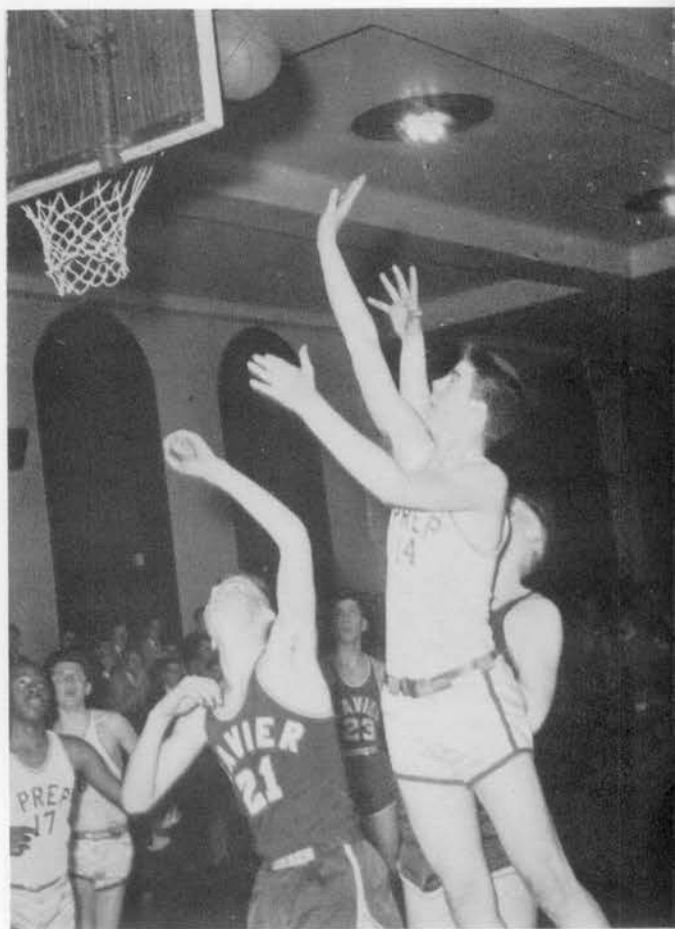
A romp over Kew Forest preceded a thriller with Regis. Trailing by seven points with a minute left, Prep scrambled to a tie that was broken by a last-second heave from center court by the Owls' Lively.

In the rest of the games, other scorers began taking some of the burden from Carpentier and Ryan, especially Draney and Ed Ryan, the latter climaxing his season's scoring with 25 points in a losing cause against St. John's.

At season's end, Richie Ryan was at the head of the scoring parade, with 199 points and an 11.9 average. Captain Carpentier copped the trophy for free-throw accuracy with 63%.

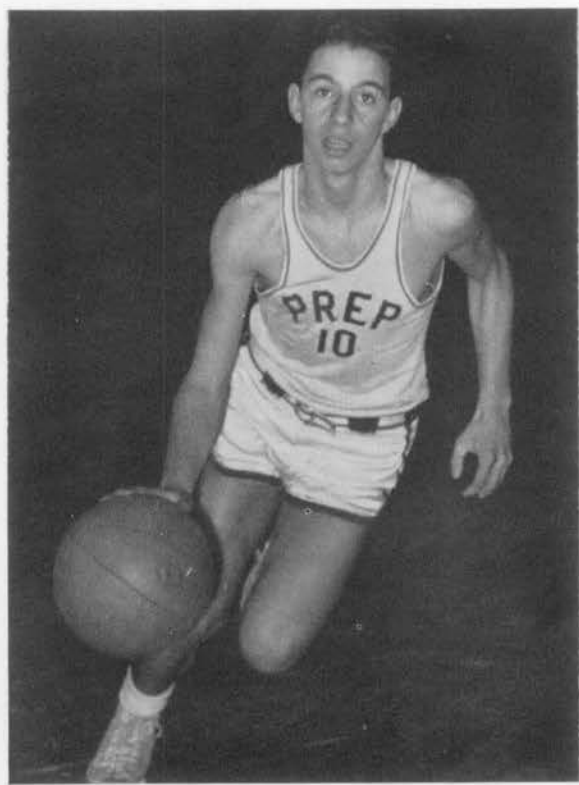


Bowles. Standing: Coach Duffy, McMahon, Ryan, Crook, Ed Ryan, Manager Jones.

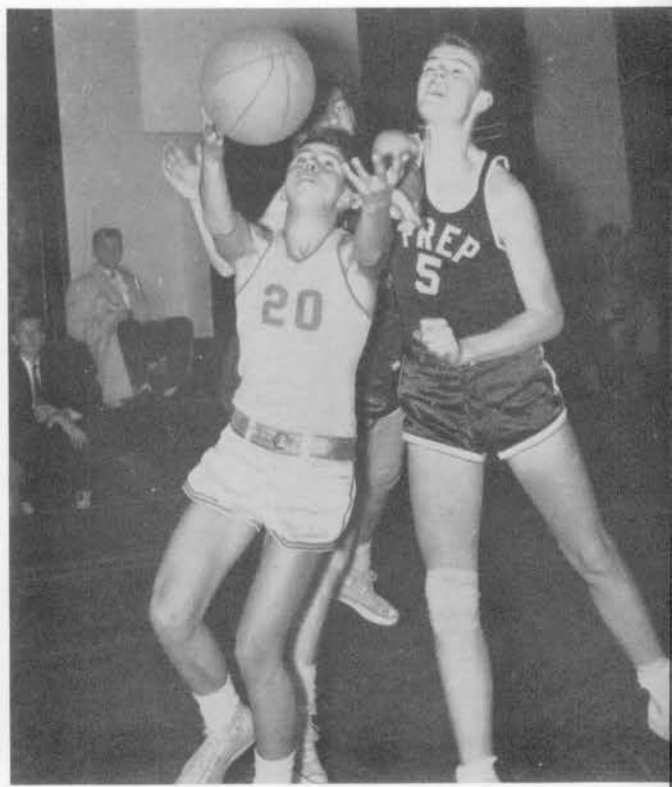


Richie Ryan maneuvers for close shot.

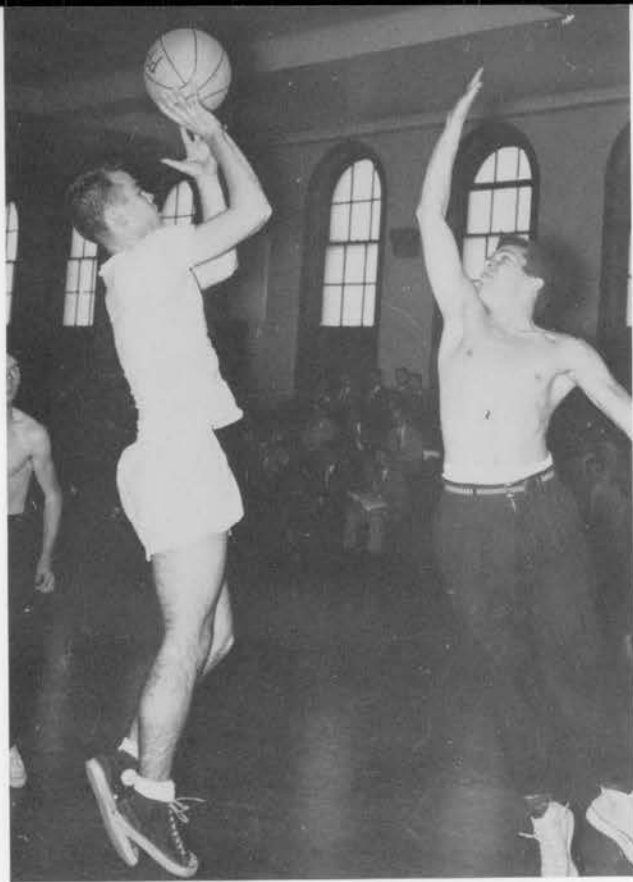

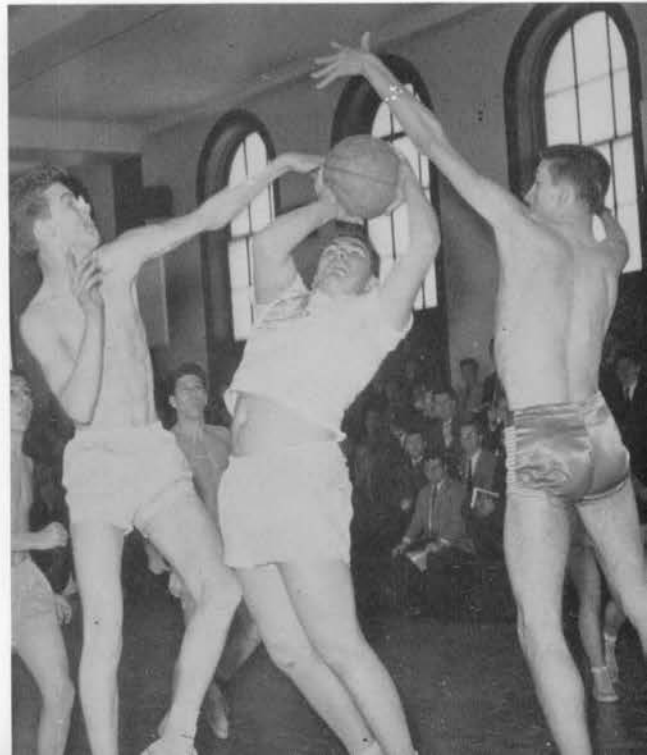

1959 witnessed the climax and close of several outstanding careers in Prep swimming annals. Bill Beck, captain for the second year and varsity letterman for the fourth time, and three-year lettermen Dan Devaney, Bob Mullen and Walt Trum have all swum their last races for Prep.

In their Senior year, this quartet kept Prep well represented in championship meets. In the C.H.S.A.A. finals, Beck and Devaney scored fourths in the 50-yard sprint and 100-yard backstroke, respectively. Frank Cleary took fifth in the butterfly. In dual meet competition, the team turned in a 6-5 record. Though the Seniors took more than their share of races, there was not enough depth of talent to beat the stongest opponents.



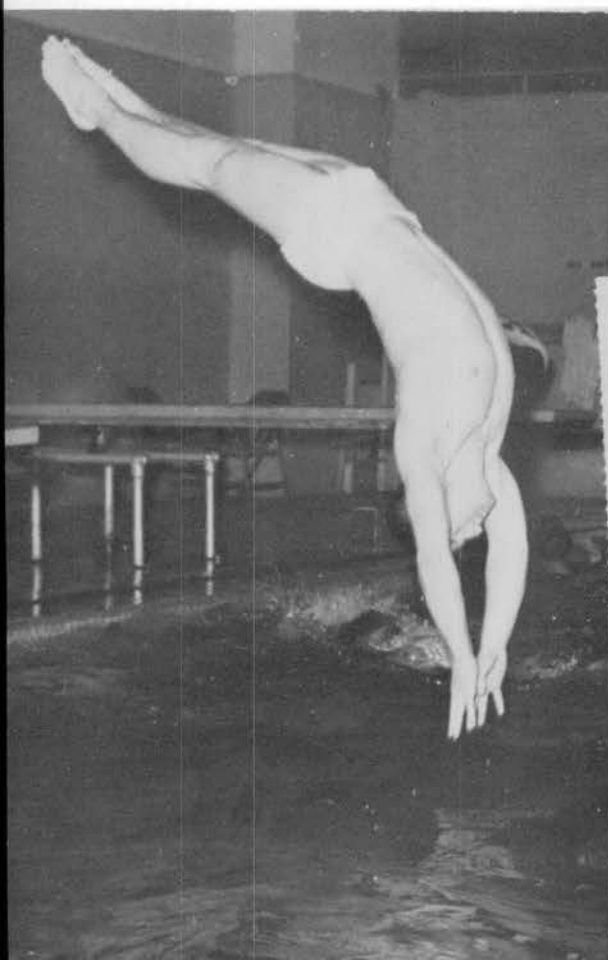

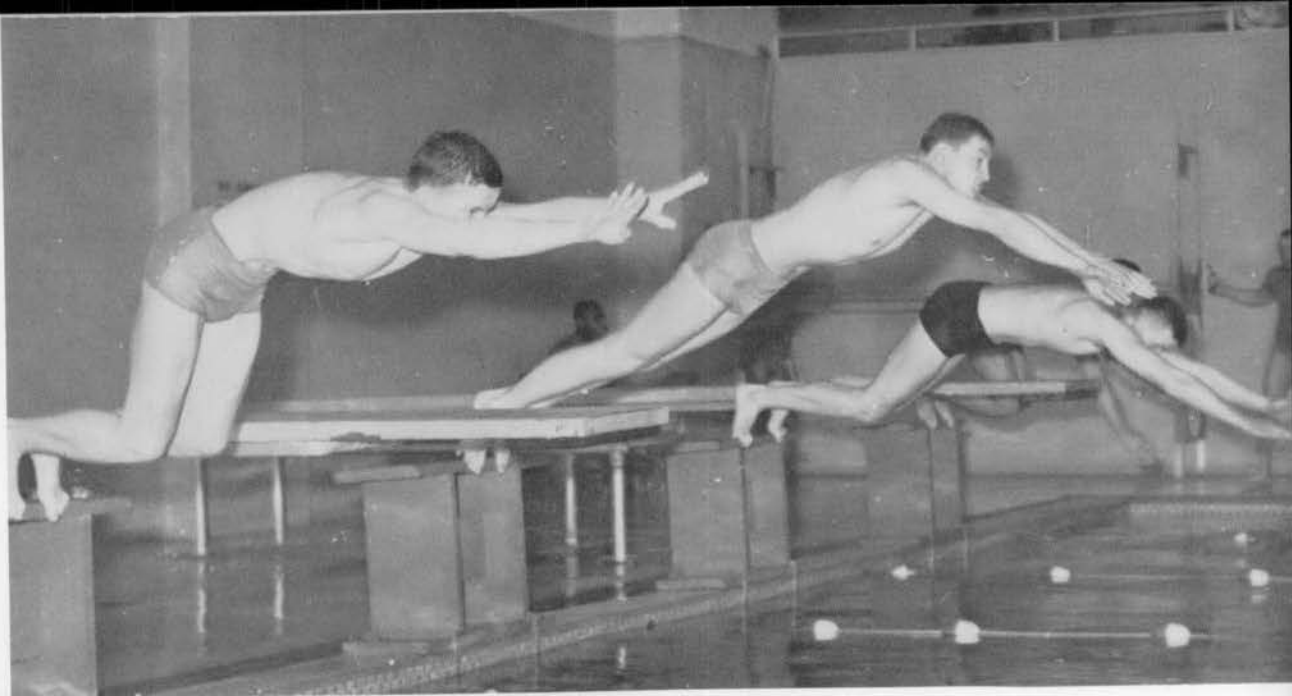

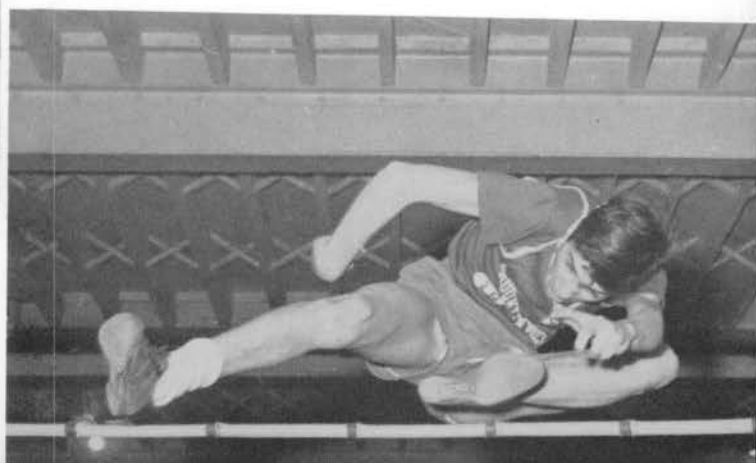
Senior Relay Best

The record of the 1959 Prep track team is, in large measure, the success story of a group of Seniors who have registered the best relay, as well as individual times in Prep history. The relay team of Frank Tomeo, Bill Clancy, Charlie Buchta, and Jack O'Connor scored fourth at two-miles in the Catholic Relay Carnival, fifth in the mile relay and first in a class mile at the Queens-Iona Relay Carnival, first in the mile in the Brooklyn College Meet and second in the distance medley (setting a school record) at the Fordham Relay Carnival. 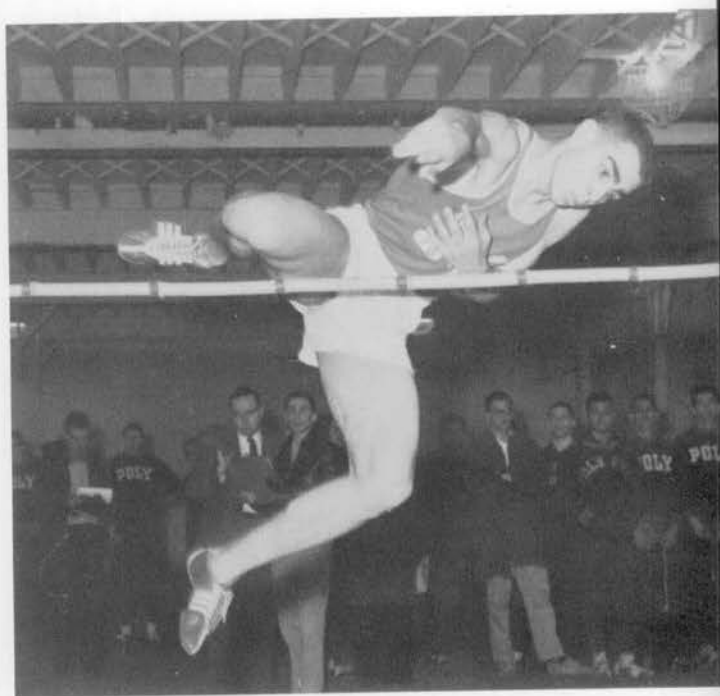

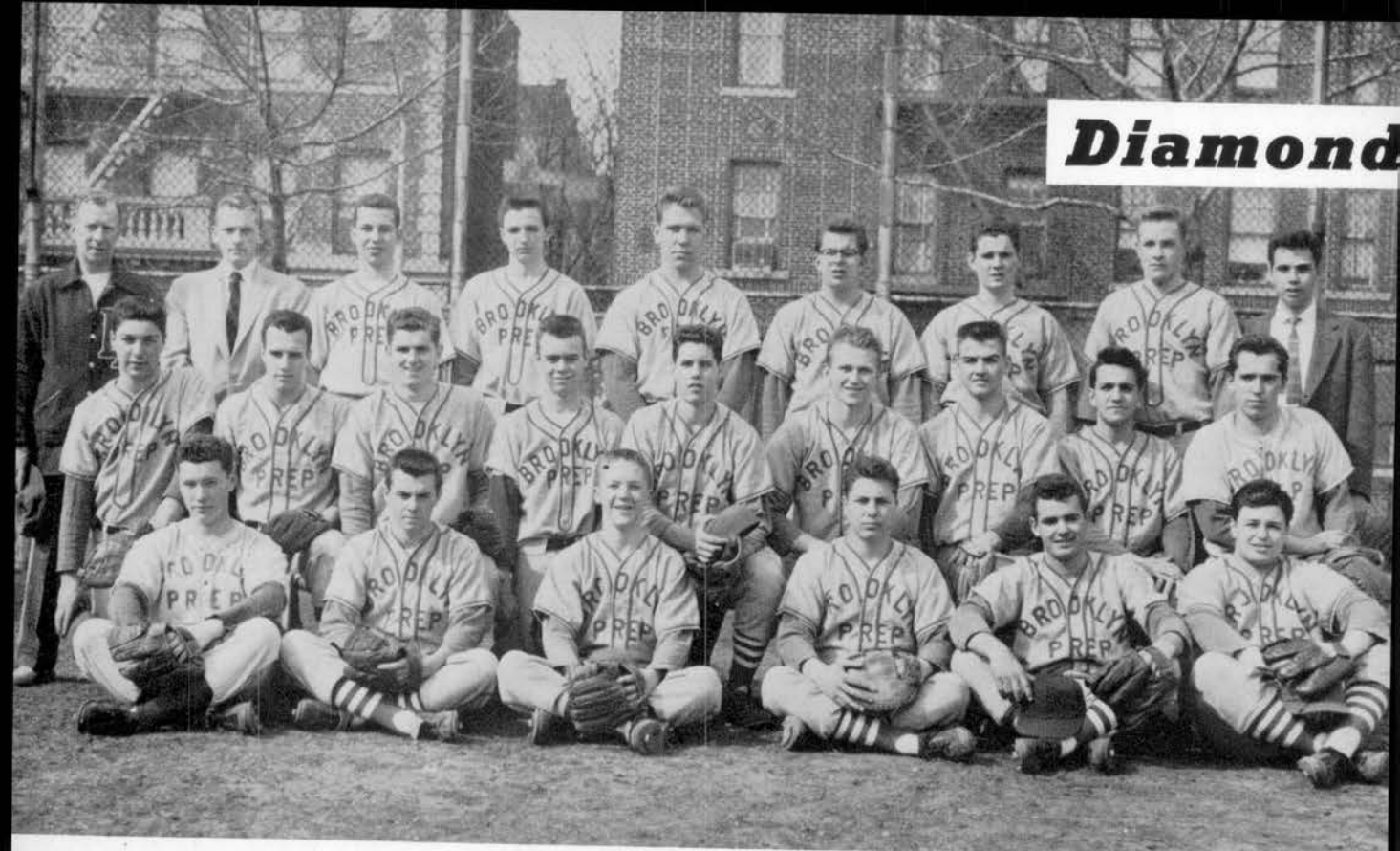

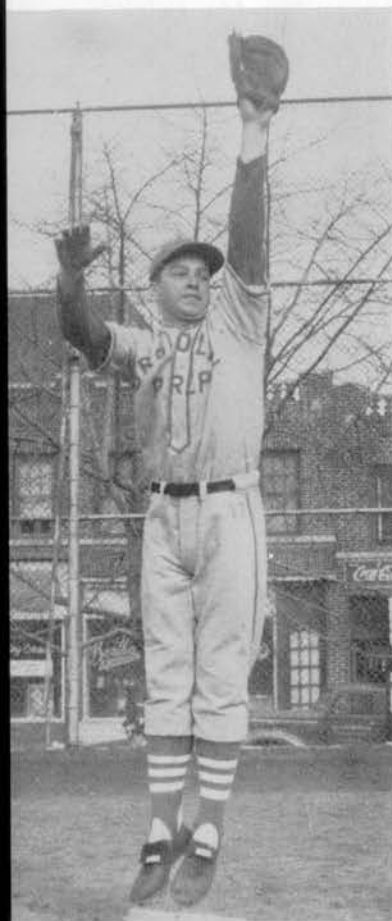

Although Coach Walter Doolan's baseball team shaped up in pre-season forecasts as a flag contender, it never caught on all cylinders during the season. After three consecutive non-league victories opened the season, they dropped four straight league tilts, mainly due to loose defense. Strong hitting was delivered at times by Joe D'Agostin and Dom Torrillo, who was a pleasant surprise at first base in his first year of varsity ball — but in the long run, the sharp pitching, alert fielding and hard hitting did not come together enough to get close to winning the league crown.

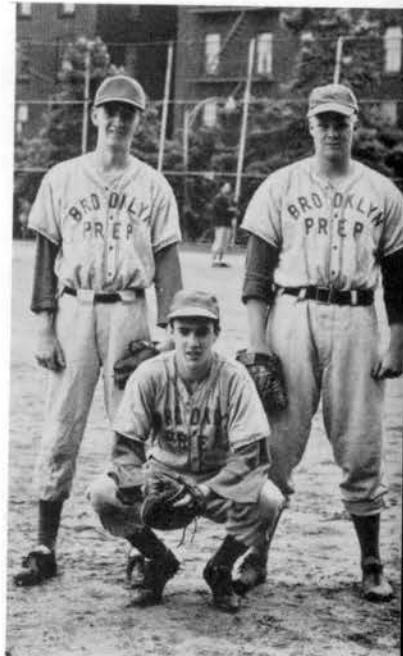

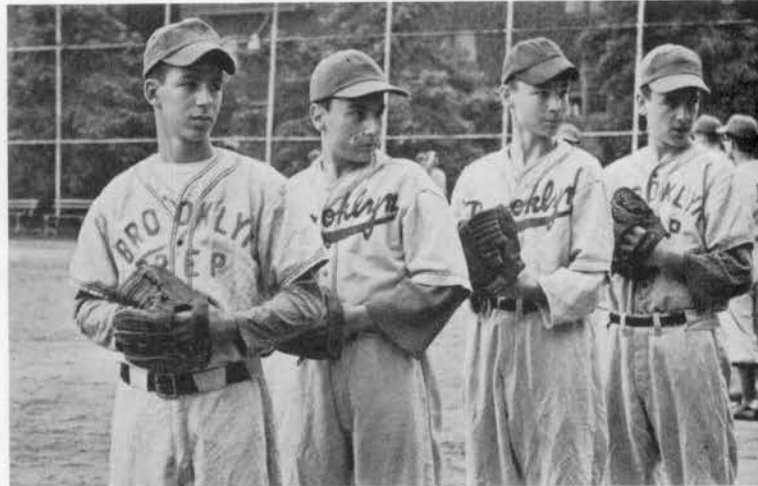

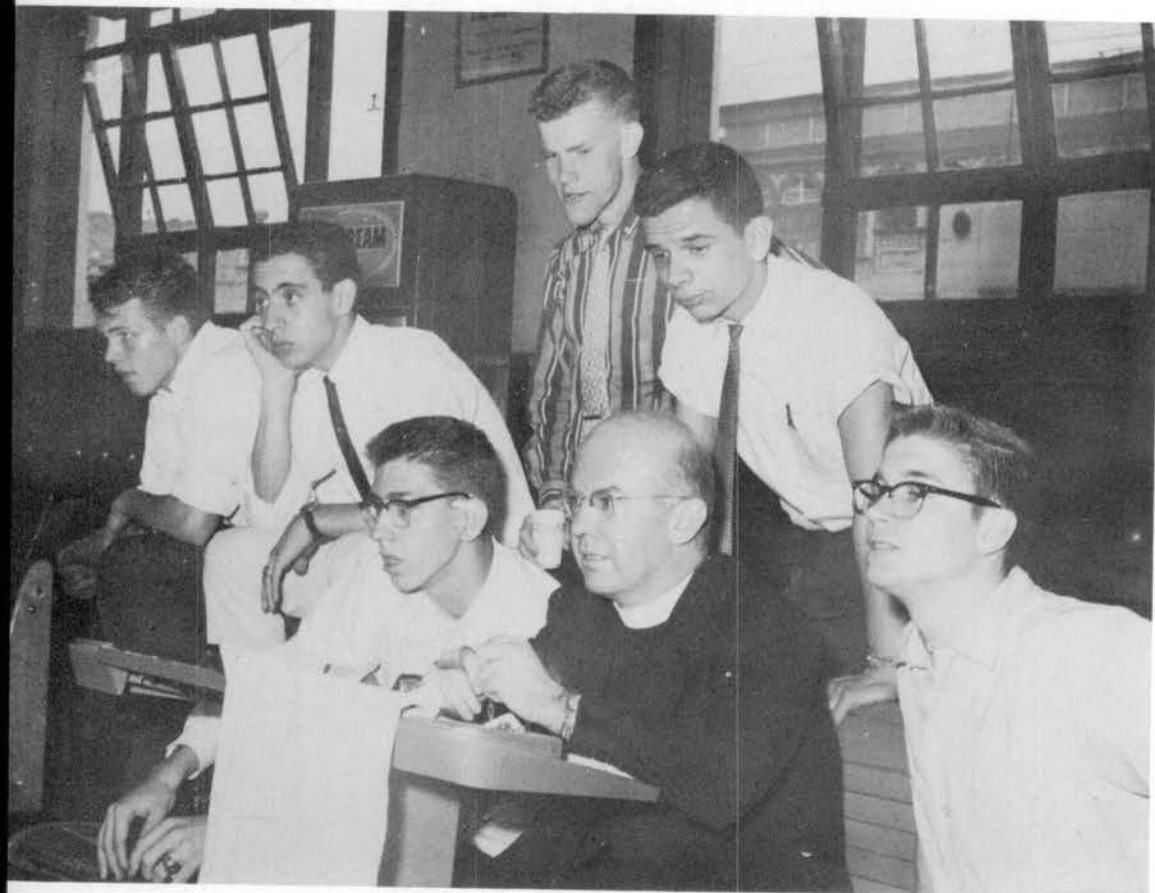

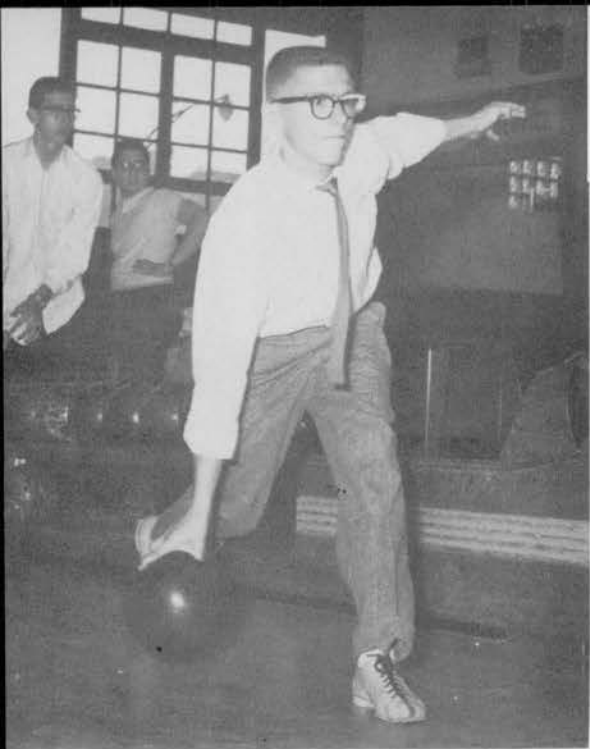

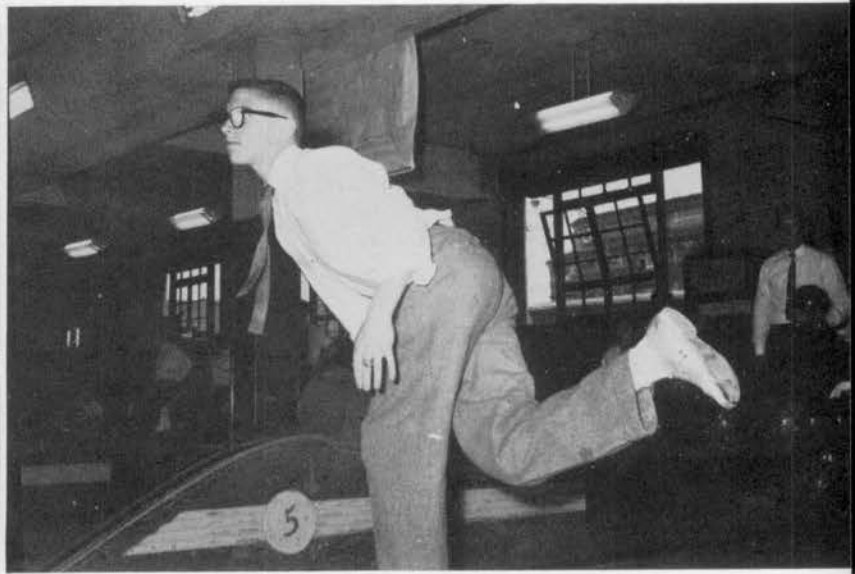

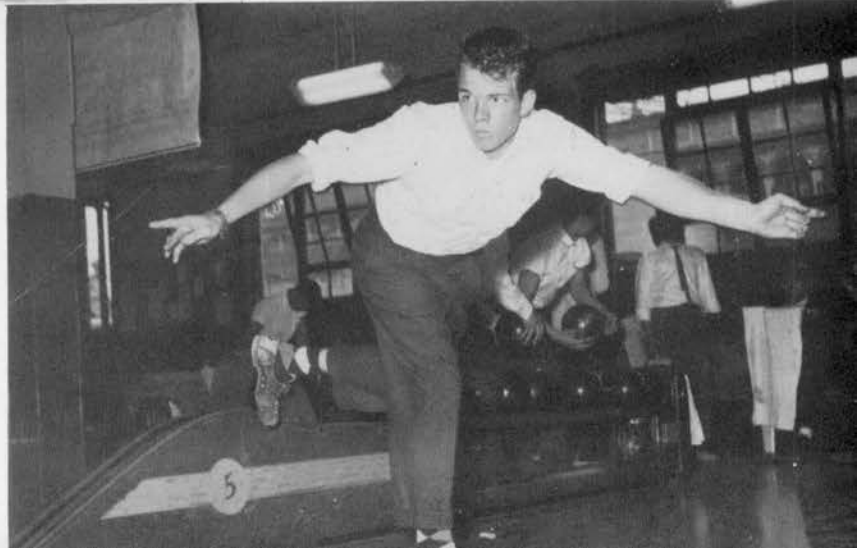
