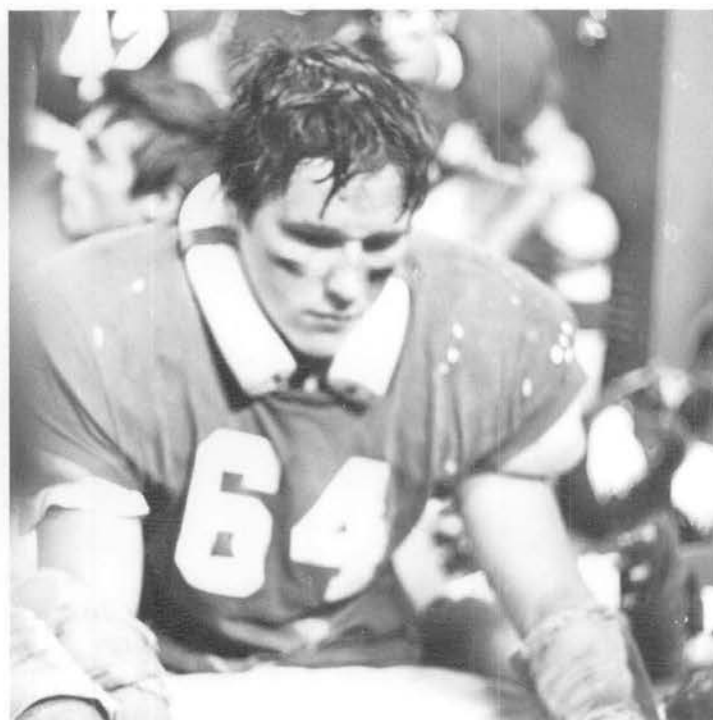

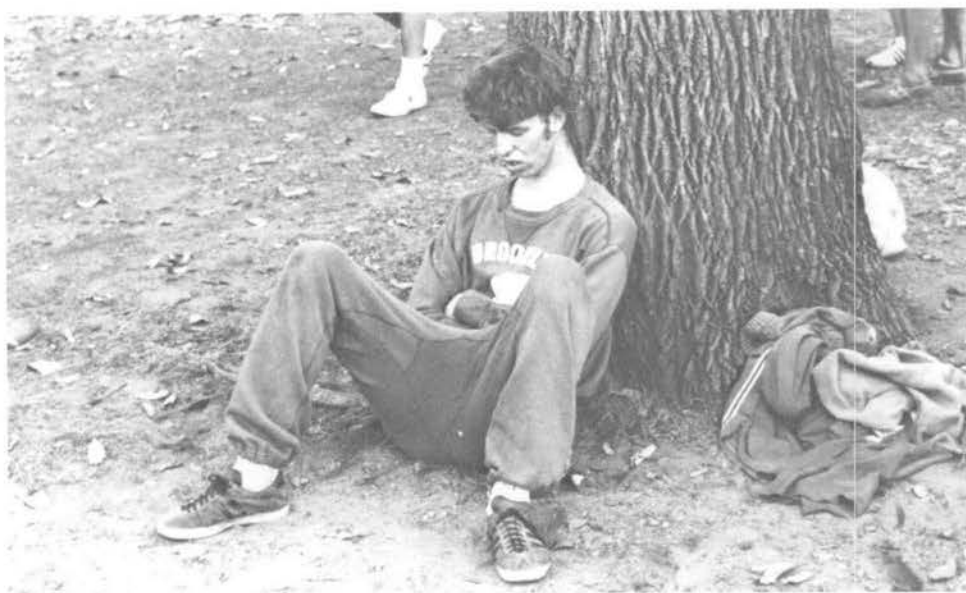

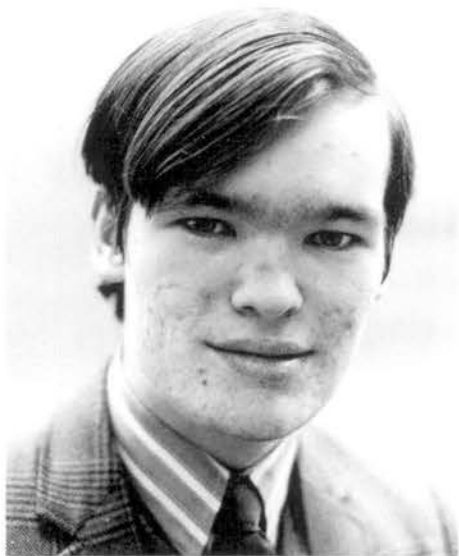

Blue Jug

This year, as it has been over the past 40 years, *The Blue Jug* has attempted to record the efforts of present Prepmen, to uphold the glorious past. That was its initial goal and still is the goal for today.

Prep had two newspapers before *The Blue Jug* as we know it now; but they both failed for a number of reasons. *The Blue Jug* first appeared on April 10, 1929, just six months before the Great Depression. Neither the Depression nor the Second World War could stop the paper from reporting all the news related to Prep. Its popularity was most notably seen when a rival newspaper, *The Gadabout*, tried to gain a foothold in the student interest. *The Blue Jug* was triumphant, however, and *The Gadabout* folded in 1940 after less than one year of publication.

Over the years, feature columns have come and gone. Sections about



the Sodality, Alumni, Prep graduates in the Armed Forces, various sports columns, and even a spotlight for teachers have all long departed.

Originally, the students subscribed to the paper and advertisements from local merchants and cigarette companies were accepted to finance the paper. Also, candidates for Student Council offices often purchased paper space for campaign purposes.

The name, *The Blue Jug*, was picked because it represented the two most important elements of Brooklyn Prep at that time. *Blue* signified both the school color and



the color of Our Lady. *Jug*, of course, is an age-old Jesuit institution.

After 25 years of publication, *The Blue Jug* revised and expanded its purpose. The issue of June 7, 1944 transcended this goal as it traced the "history of the school as it lived with each day, as it kept a permanent record of Prep's most outstanding personalities and activities, as it demonstrated how each generation of Prepmen responded to the high ideals set before them."

This year, Dan Heneghan, Editor-in-Chief, maintained these high standards. He covered news both inside and outside of Prep, and showed its relationship to the students. The editorial policy he formulated took a strong stand on problems concerning the school. Along with his editorial staff, Dan spent close to twenty hours in the *Blue Jug* office each week. That figure excludes work they did at home, and the never-ending "layout night".

Layout night is the most important part of publishing *The Blue Jug*. All of the articles are printed on two sets of "galley sheets", eighteen inches long. One set is used exclusively for proofreading, while the other is cut up and pasted on "dummies" to resemble the finished product. An engraver scales the pictures down to size as they too are pasted in their appropriate positions. Headlines, and captions have to be written on separate sheets of paper. Each headline has to be measured to make sure it will fit, and then a type style has to be picked.

The dummies, galleys and head sheets then go back to the printer to be printed. He prints up one copy and the editors again proofread the paper, making any last minute corrections. Finally, eight hundred copies are printed and delivered to Prep for distribution. The whole process takes about two weeks.

Associate Editor Steve Gasser and Assistant Editor Gerry Carey contribute time and energy as well as their literary prowess to help out with the mass of pre-publication labor. Ralph Sciamé eased the tension with his column *Shamey Shambles*. The entire sports scene was controlled by Sports Editor George Forster, while John Mezzasalma tied up loose ends as Managing Editor. Moderator Mr. D. James French, S.J., and Editor Dan Heneghan consolidated their energies throughout the year to continue the tradition of excellence which *The Blue Jug* has maintained.

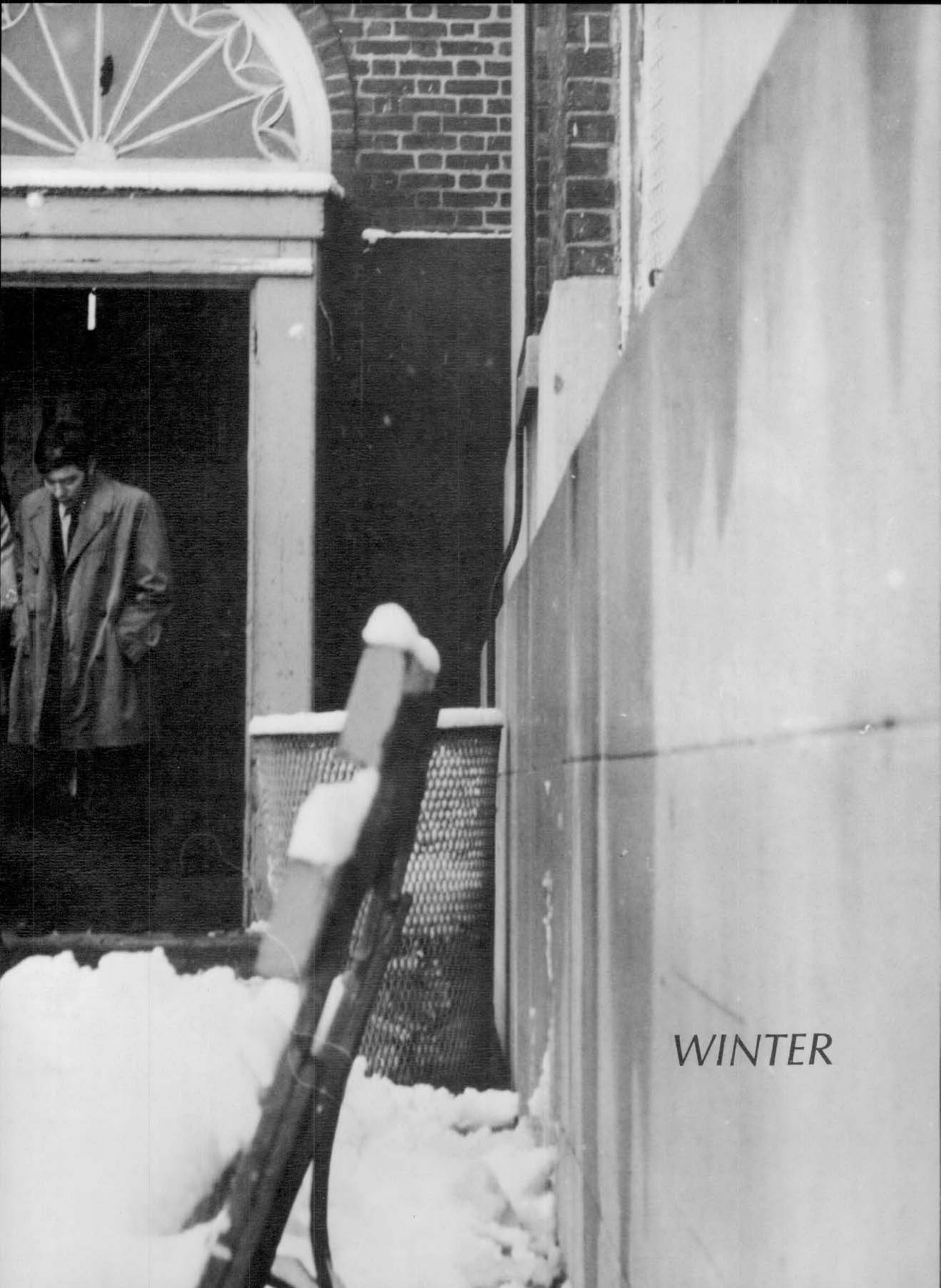

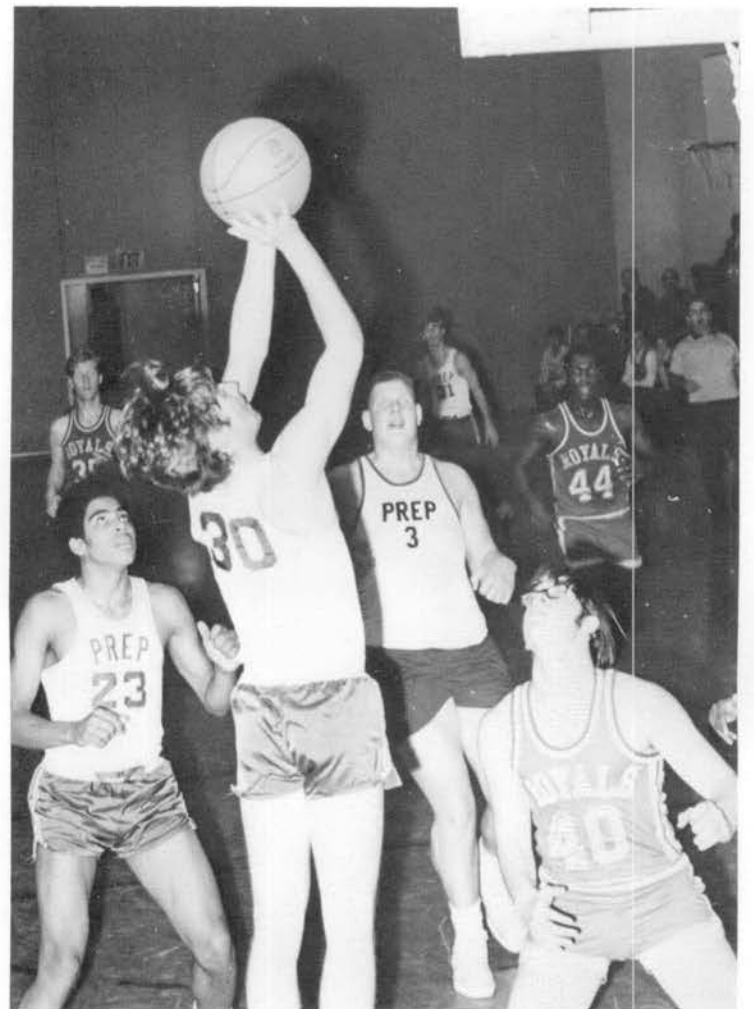
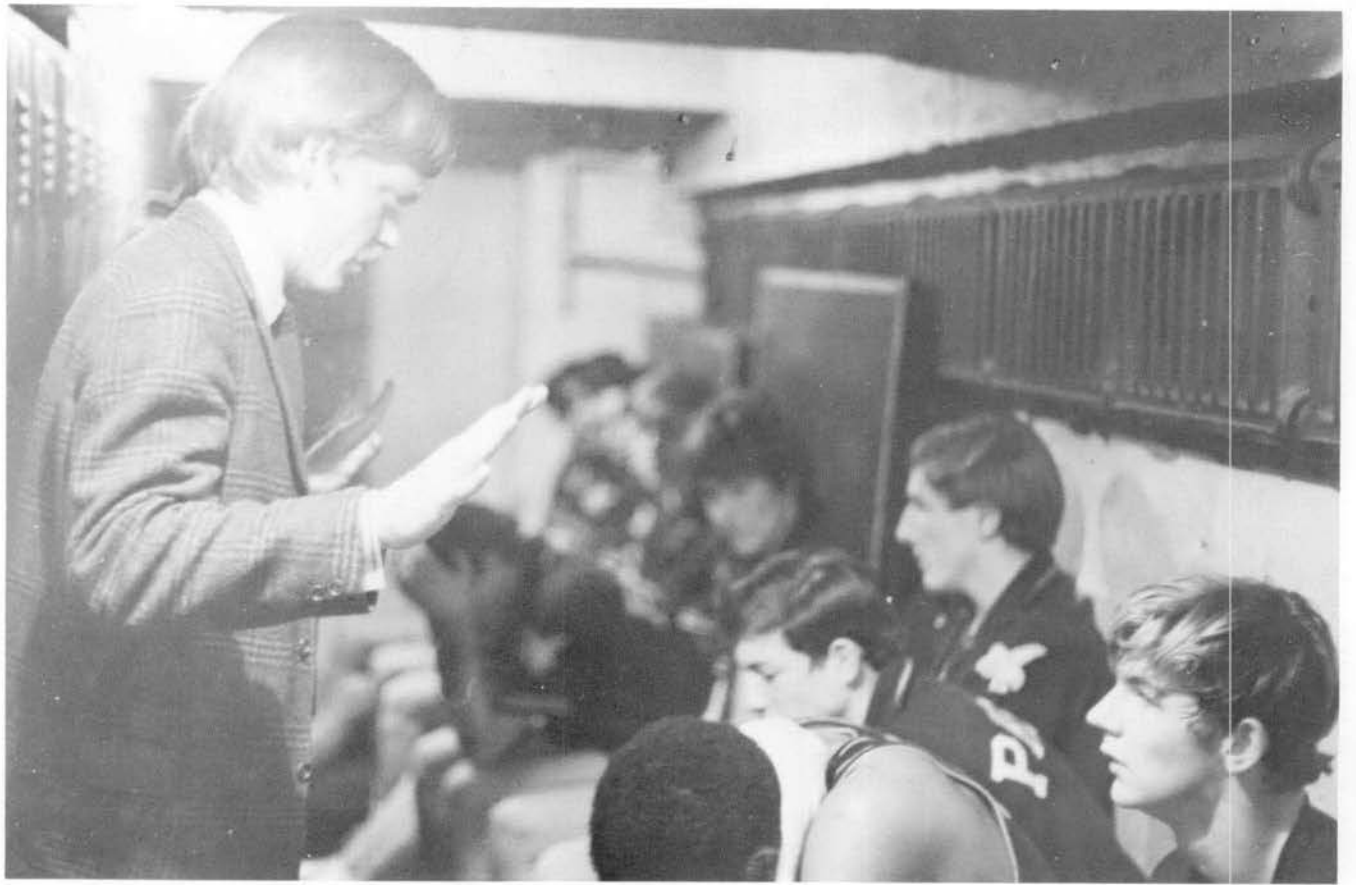
Basketball

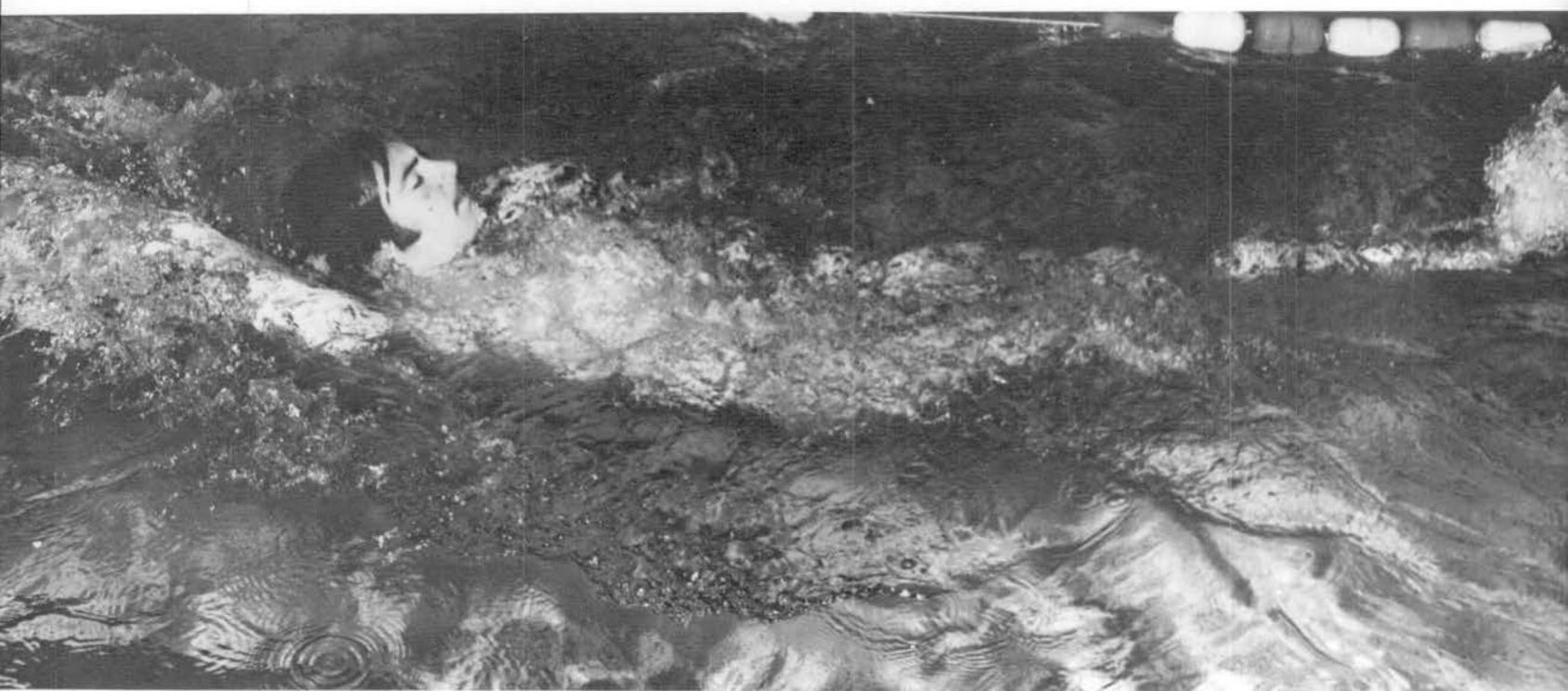


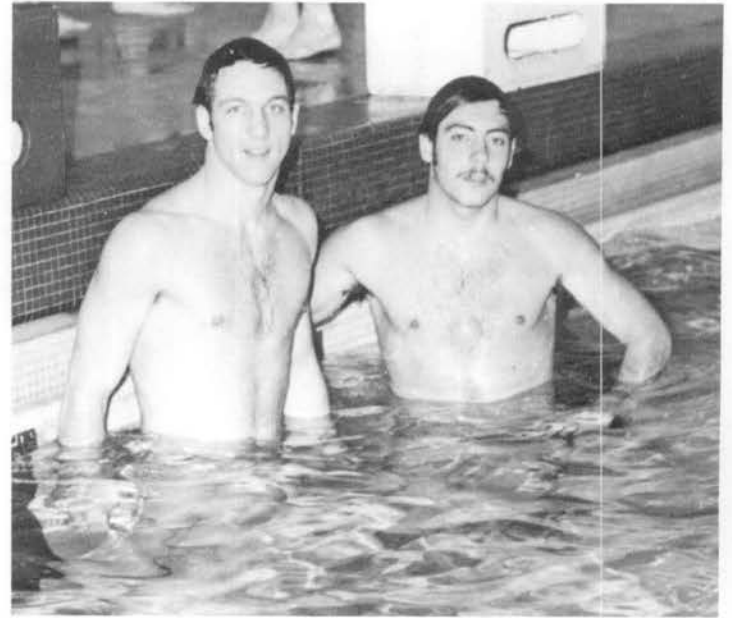

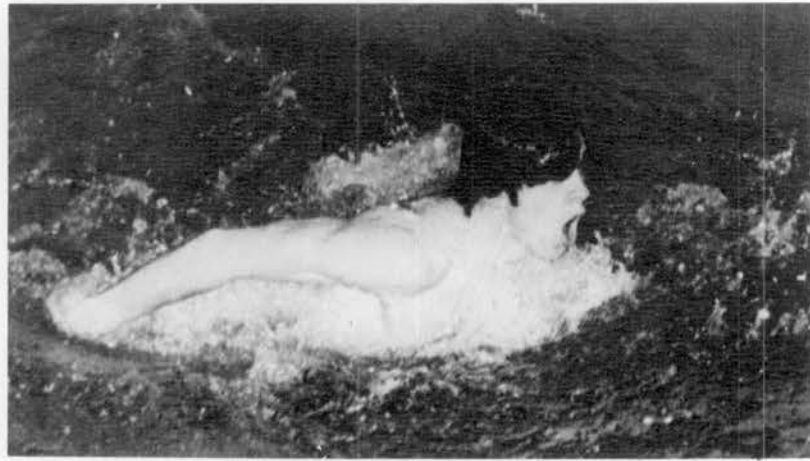

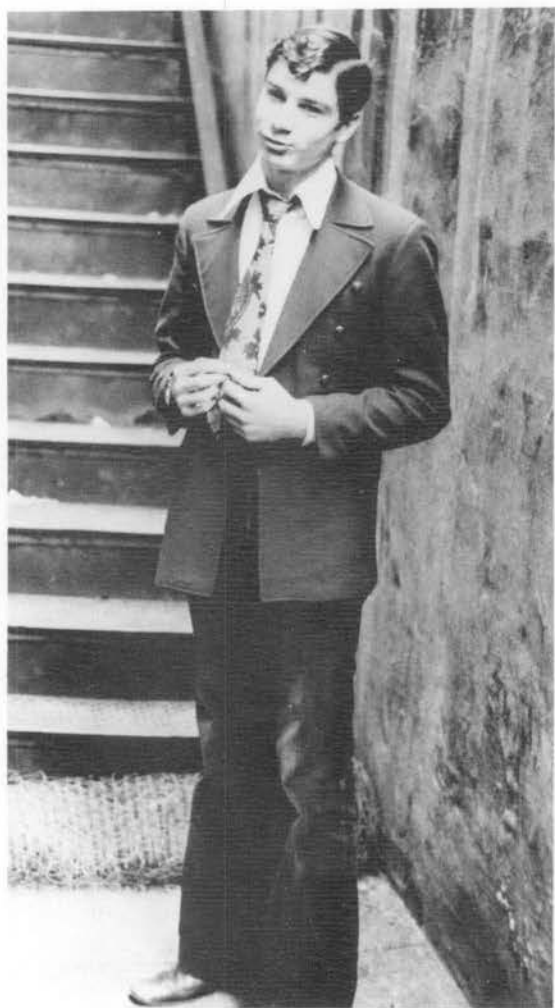


Educational Television

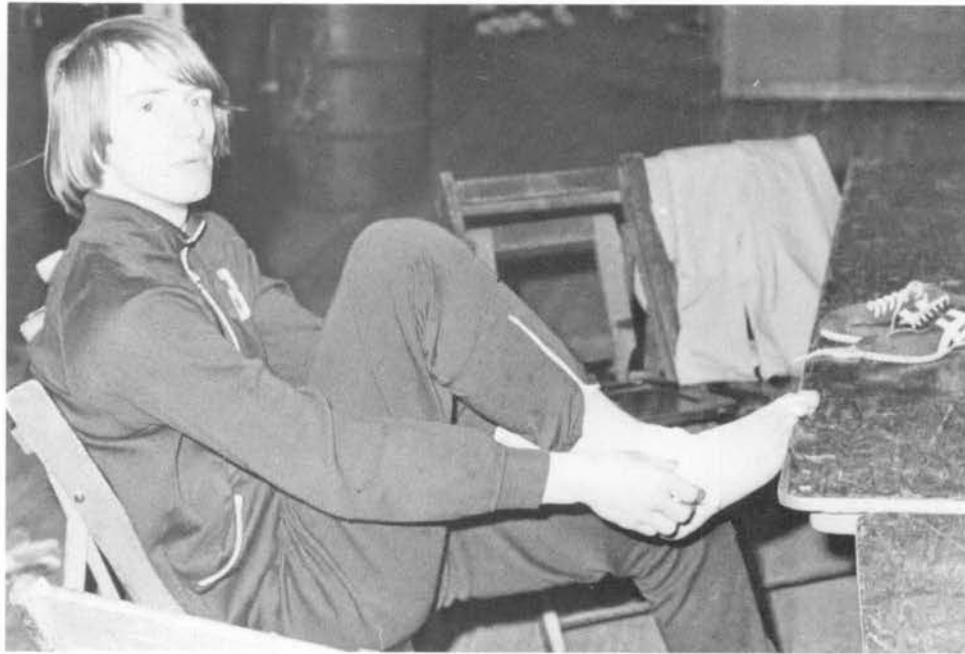

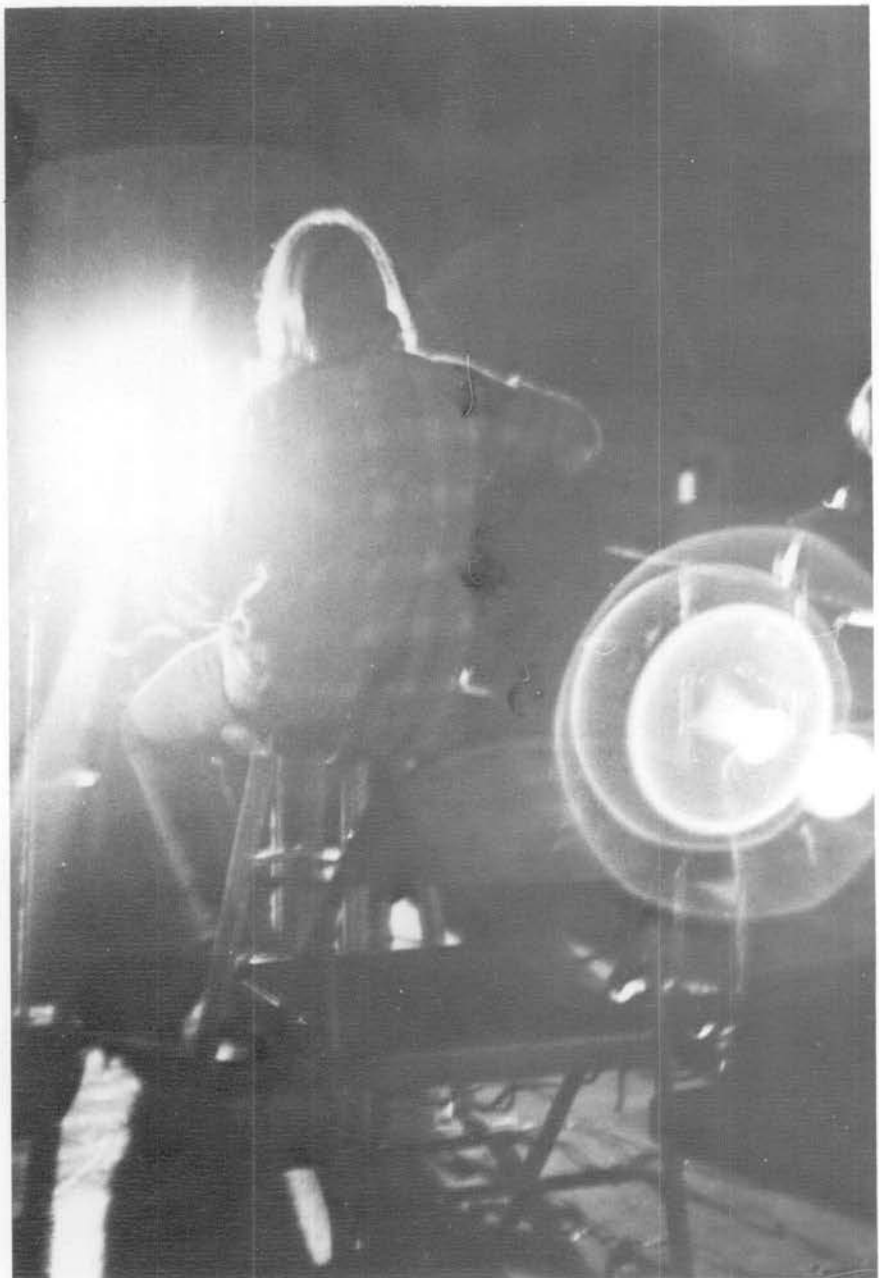
Weasel's Workshop
