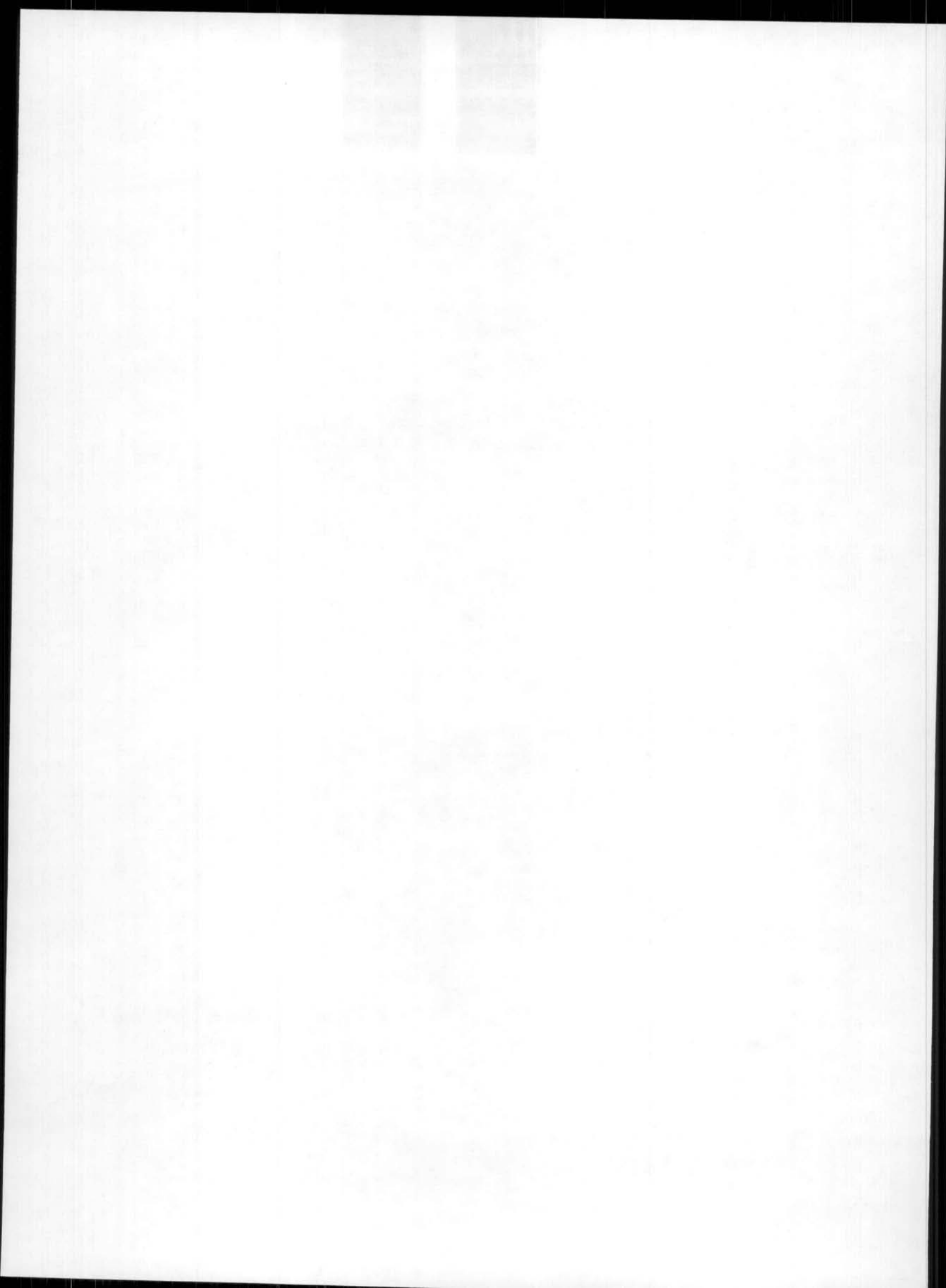




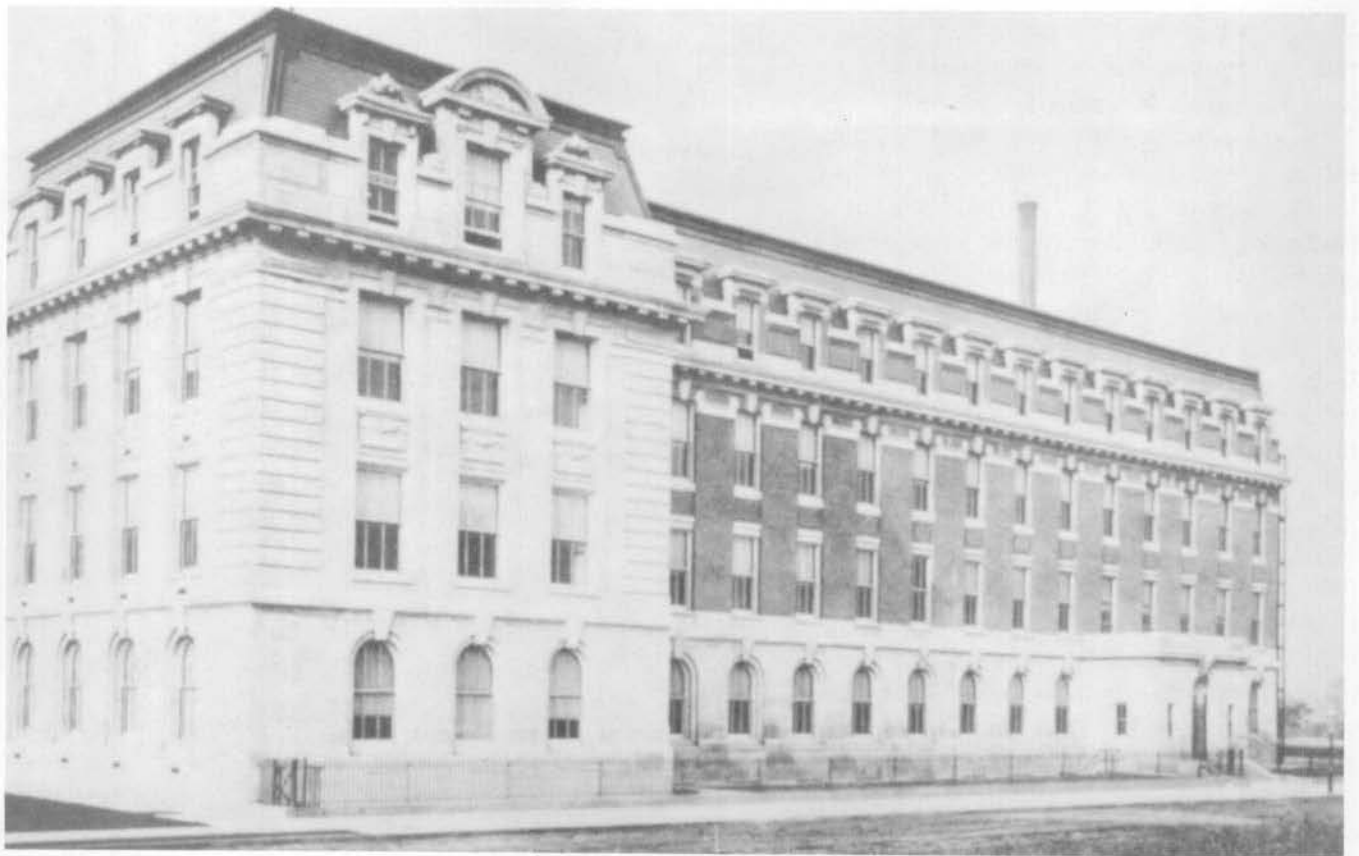

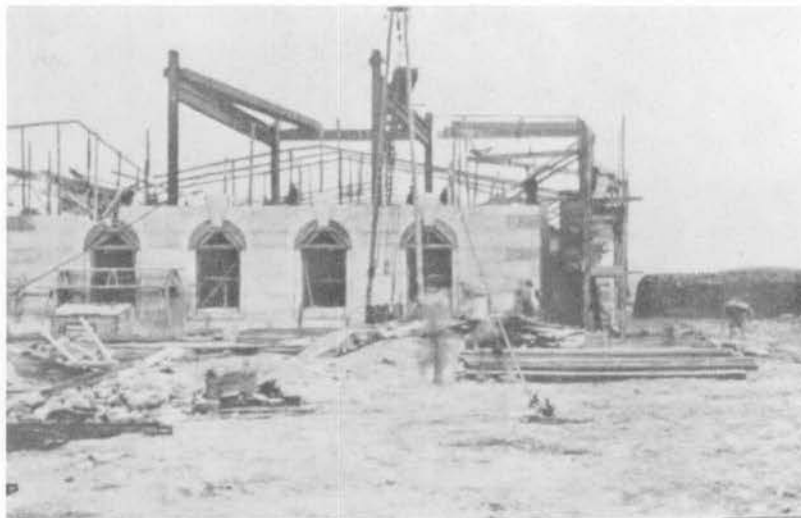
BROOKLYN PREP: 1908—1972



As the building now known as Brooklyn Prep changes hands, a new future for the land on which it stands begins to unfold. The area possesses a history worthy of interest.

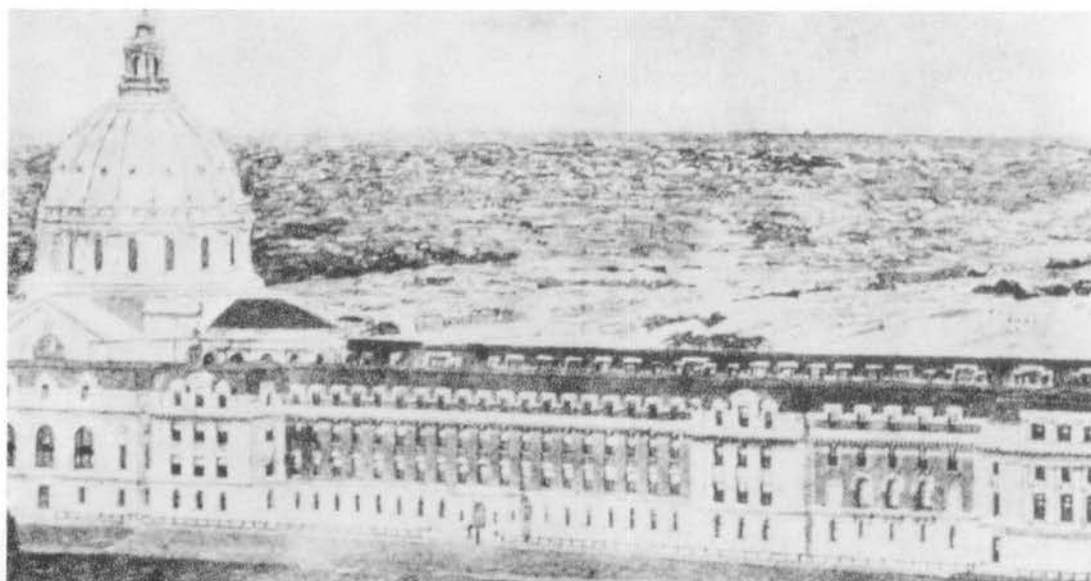
The current site of Prep had its obscure beginning in 1607. In that year, with the permission of Governor Francis Lovelace, colonists living in downtown Brooklyn began to purchase suburban land from the Indians. Unlike some of their brethren who lacked business acumen and sold Manhattan for 24 dollars, Peter Elmohar and Job and Shamese Makaquiquas, three Canarsie from Staten Island who happened to be hunting in Brooklyn, garnered a nifty profit from the sale of Crow Hill (now Crown Heights), land that did not even belong to them. For one hundred guilders, three long barrel rifles, four match coats, and three half turns of strong beer, these crafty traders hoodwinked the unsuspecting colonists.

Decades passed swiftly; the property exchanged ownership several times until 1846 when the Kings County Board of Supervisors purchased the site to construct a penitentiary and workhouse. Crow Hill

Penitentiary, bounded by Rogers and Nostrand Avenues and Carroll and Montgomery Streets, was completed in 1848. On March 23 of that year the first group of prisoners began serving their terms, taking exercise in the yard that is today Prep's athletic field.



The original artist's plan of the school.

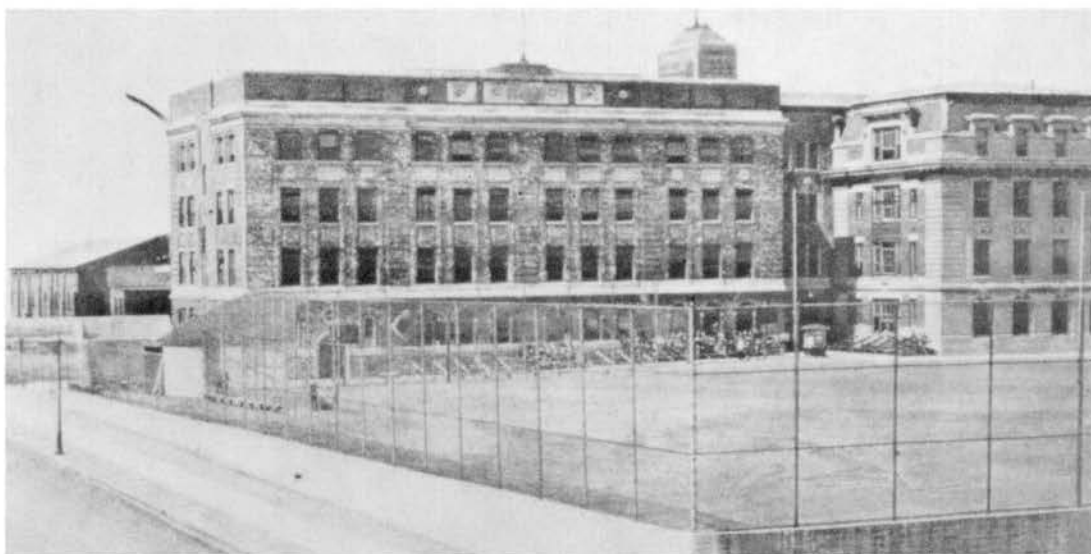


Bishop McDonnell of Brooklyn bought the property in 1907 from the City of New York and, in the same year, sole it to the Jesuits. In November of that year, plans were drawn up for the building of Brooklyn College, a combined Jesuit prep school and college. One can still see the remnants of those days—the BC on the glass of the main entrance. The original plan called for a spacious college, a huge square building, highlighted by a white domed basilica. Unfortunately World War I and the drafting of college

students caused the shelving of these plans.

If a visitor to Prep with no knowledge of its background toured the school, he might be able to see the progress of the building and improvement of the school since 1908. The original Brooklyn College was the building which now housed the Jesuits and the offices of the administration. In 1928, one year after the school officially became chartered Brooklyn Preparatory School, a new wing, extending from Carroll St. To Crown St., was constructed.

Above: The first student body posed in front of the school in 1909. **Right:** The new wing added in 1928, which now houses the classrooms.



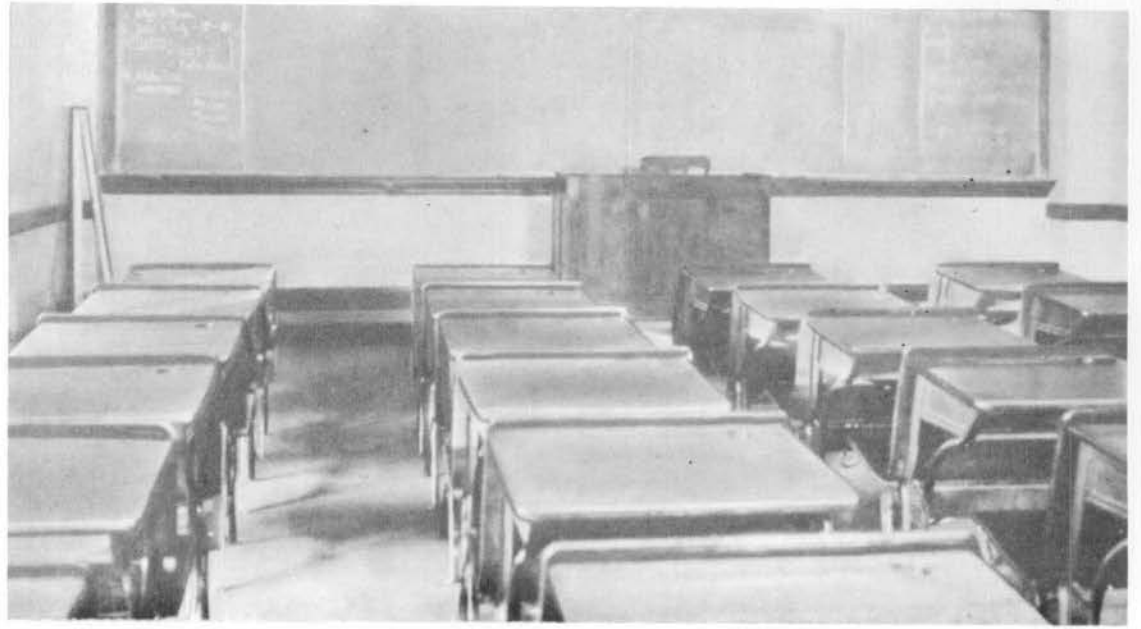
I came to the Prep in September of 1929. The wing of the school which contains most of the classrooms had just been opened and the future looked bright. Then came October 29th, the bottom dropped out of the stock market and the depression was on.

Prep, with a student body of about 950, did not feel any immediate effect, but, as we went through the 30's and the number of incoming freshmen dropped off, various economies had to be resorted to. I remember one in particular. A thermometer was put in each classroom in an effort to keep the heating bills down. The teachers were expected to keep an eye on it and to turn the radiators on or off in order to maintain the temperature between 67 and 70 degrees.

As the number of pupils decreased the Fathers' Guild was organized into parish teams which endeavored to persuade more parents to send their sons to Brooklyn Prep.

In spite of every effort, however, the student population fell off until in the early 1940's it was approximately 450. The faculty had also decreased in size until only six laymen were left.

Despite this, school activities were not curtailed. The various sports, the Blue Jug, the Blue Book, etc., all received the full support of the Administration.



Then came the War and almost overnight, it seemed, the number of students increased rapidly until, within a few years it was back where it had been before the depression.

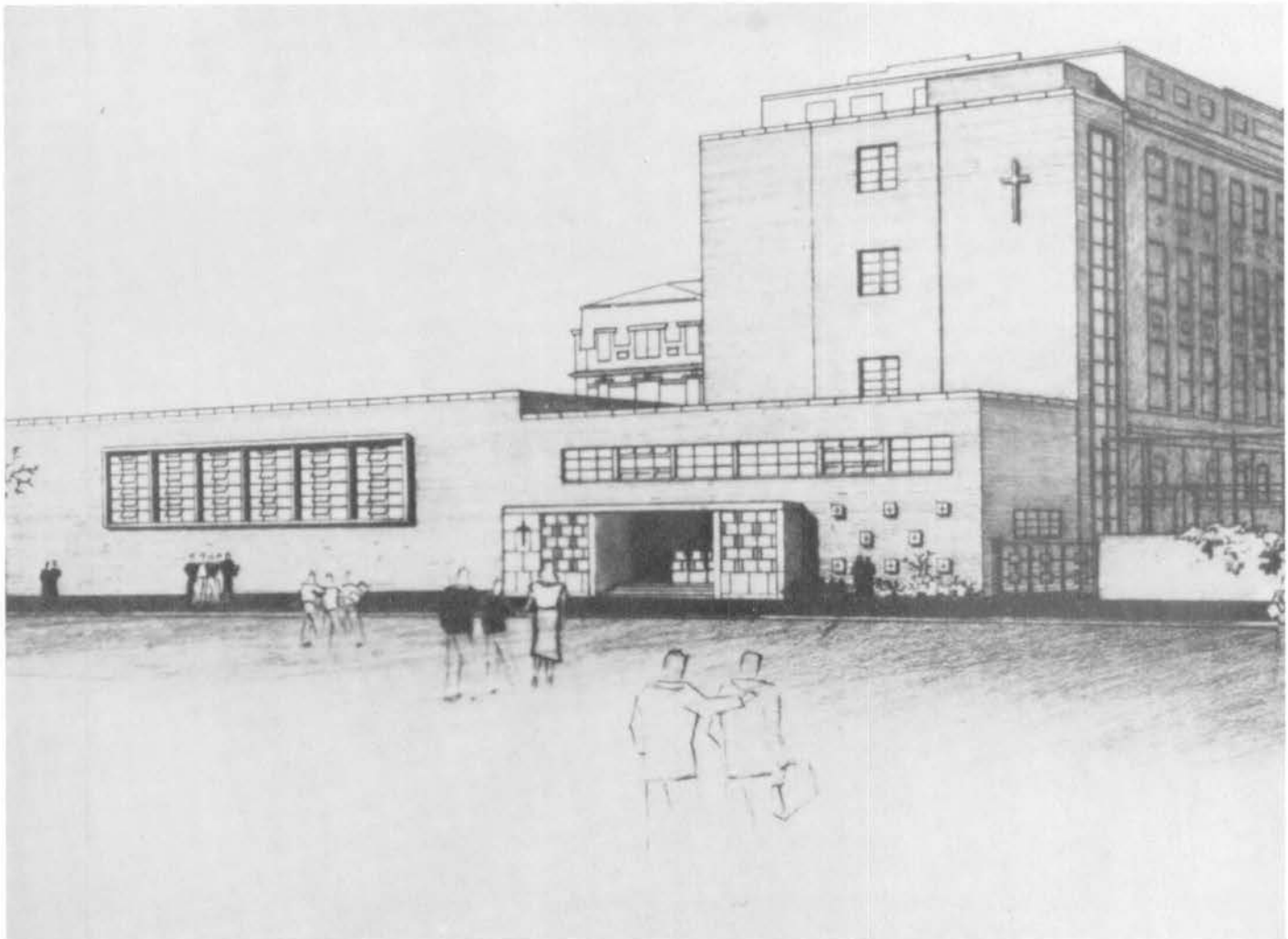

Construction begins on the new wing.

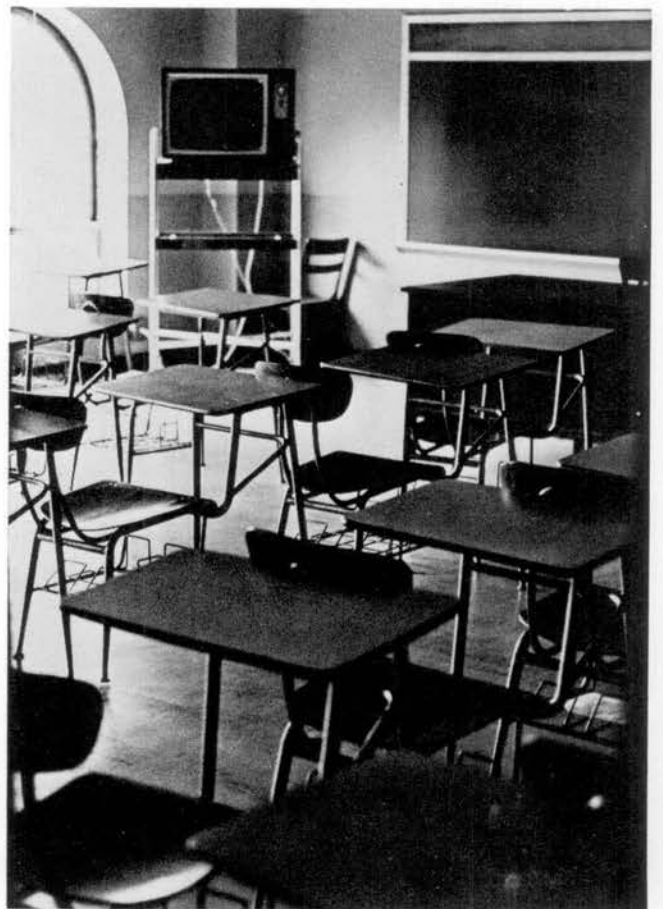
The new gymnasium as seen from across Crown St.





The school remained much the same until 1959. At that time construction began on another wing facing Crown Street, which was to include classrooms, a cafeteria, a gymnasium-auditorium, and a swimming pool. The entire first floor was raised, and a heated pool and new floor of classrooms and offices replaced the old gym. Brooklyn Prep had finally fulfilled its original plans—to occupy the entire square block.

The future shone brightly: everyone thought that Prep would continue to be one of the country's leading high schools. Then the rumors came, slow, silent, like dark fog. The banks must eat. The school had gone into steep debt by building the new wing. Hopeful speculation fed upon these rumors; there was talk of Prep closing and moving to Long Island; there was talk of further expansion; there were even those who talked of Prep's becoming co-ed.

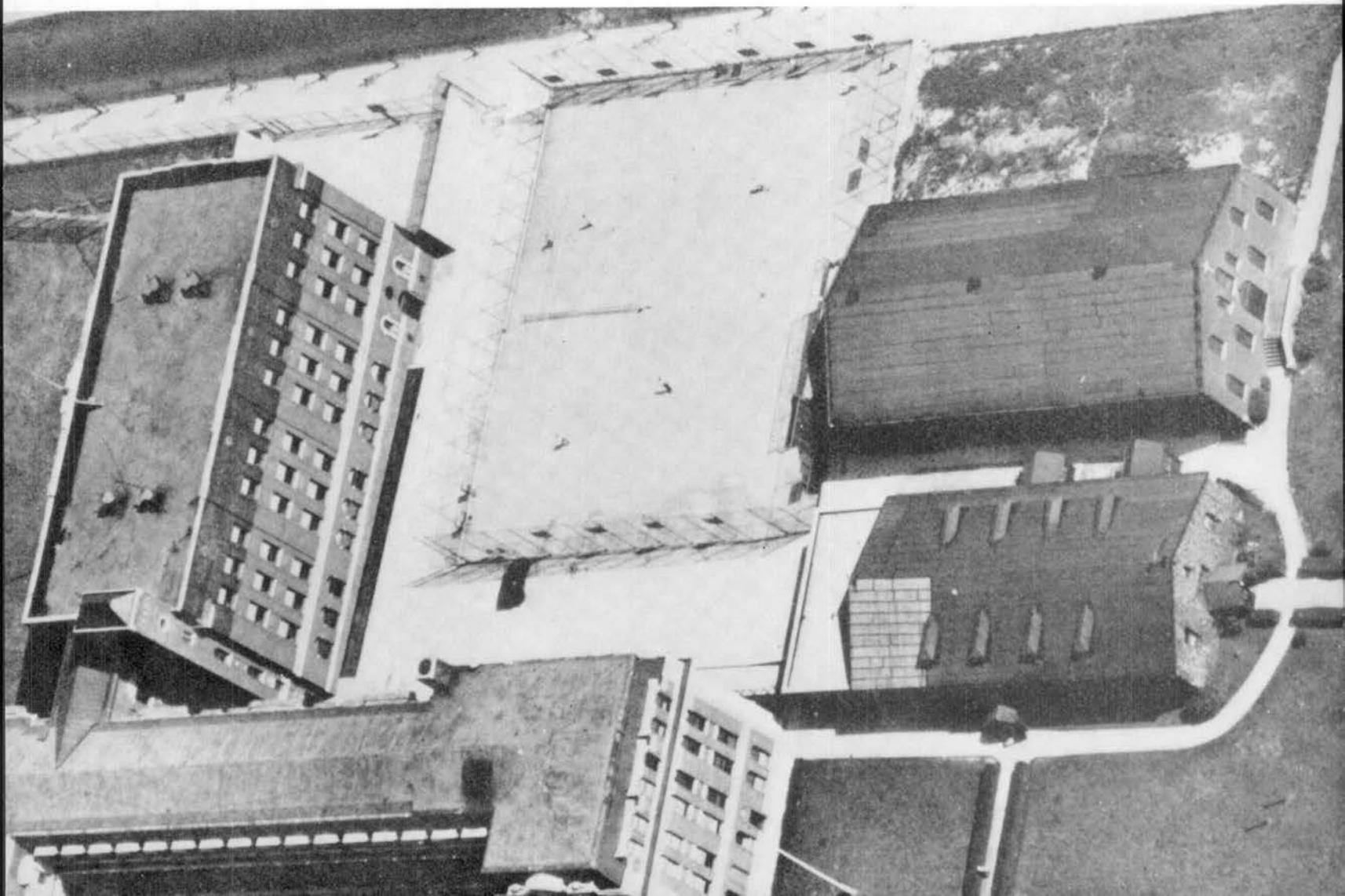




The dim rumors increased as tuition rose steadily. Mortgage and interest rates devoured profits. The entire New York Province struggled under the weight of indebtedness. Something had to be done. Provincial leaders convened in Morristown, or somewhere. Still everyone at Prep thought that circumstances would improve.

At the close of the 1970 school year plans were made for leasing Jogues House to the City University of New York. During the summer the sale of Brooklyn Prep to the City University was finalized. It would become Medgar Evers College.

Crow Hill has changed hands many times since 1607. Once again it passes to a new owner. It has been a relatively short 64 years that Prep has tenanted the land, but in that time an indomitable spirit and a reputation for excellence have been created that transcend the mere selling of land. It has been some 64 years.

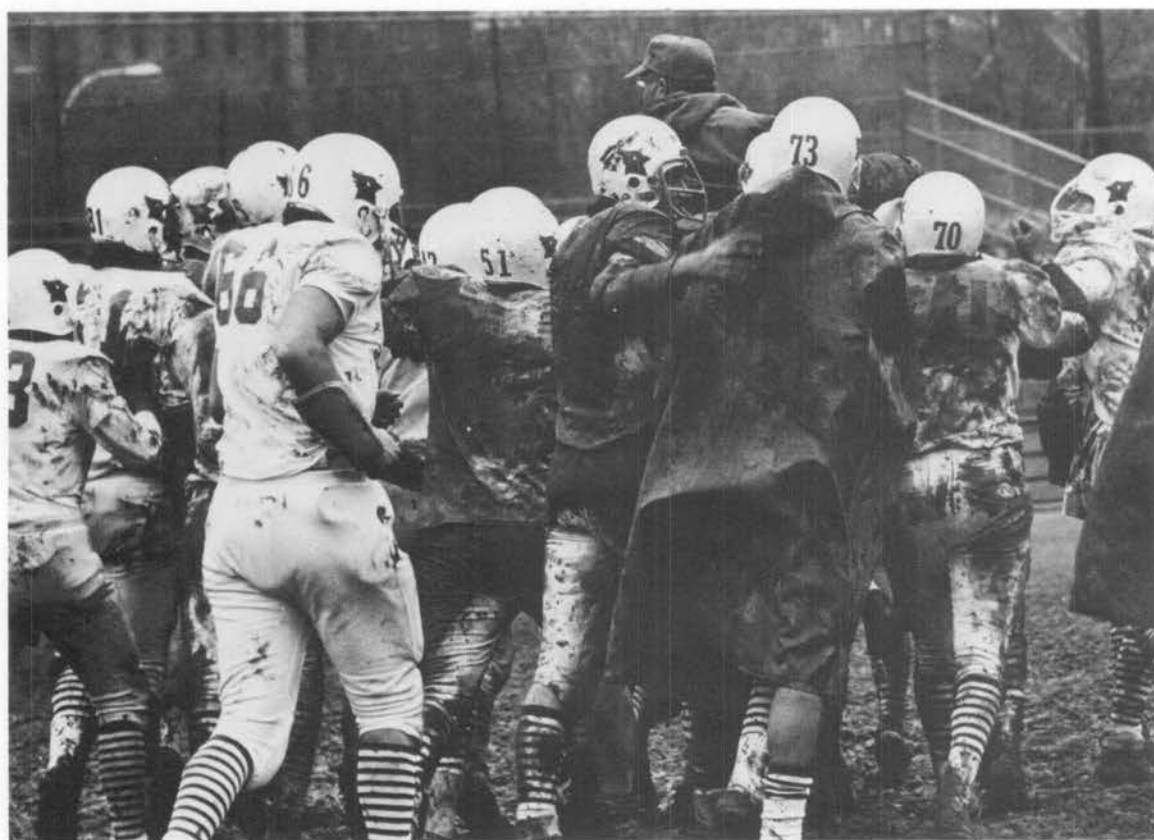

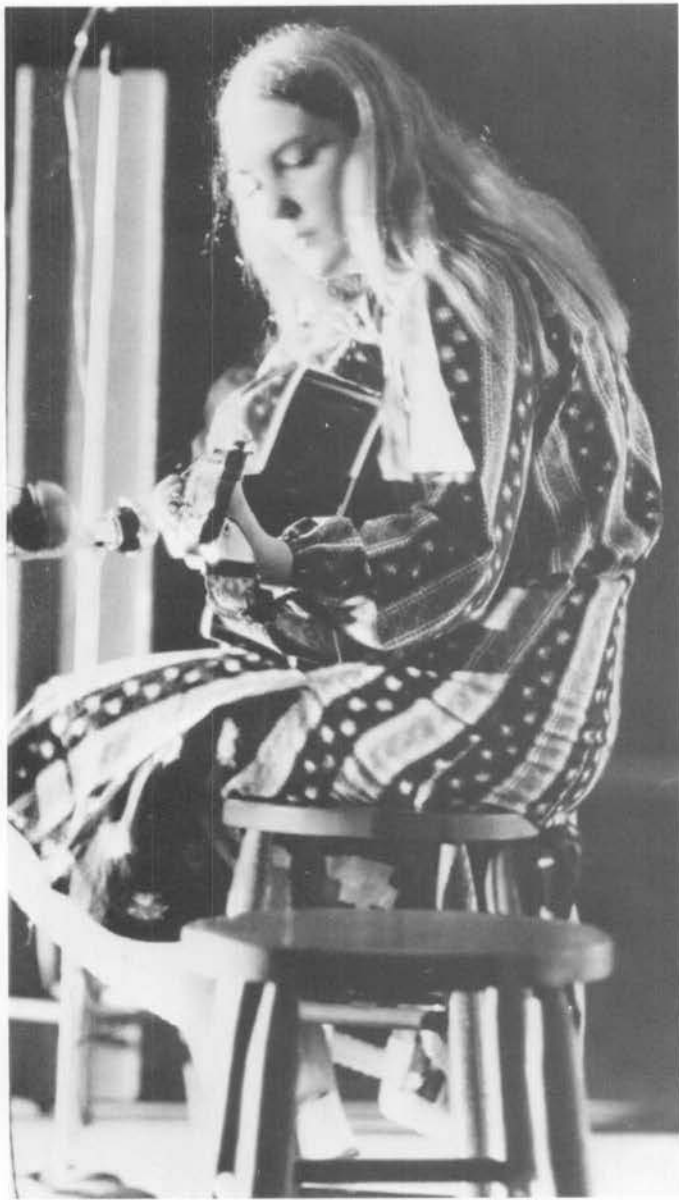

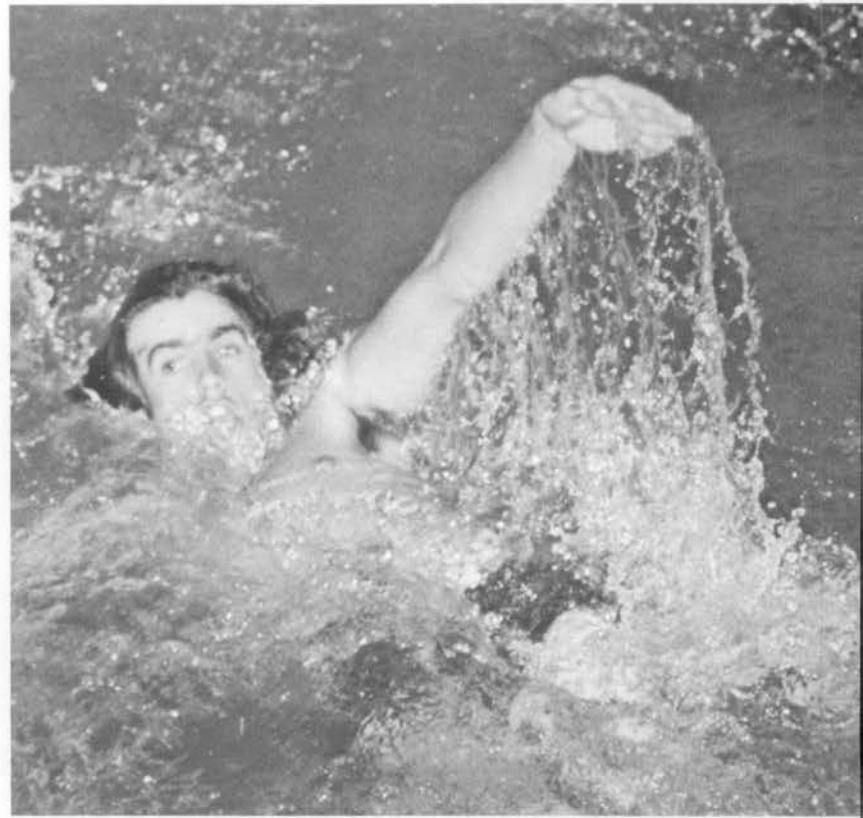

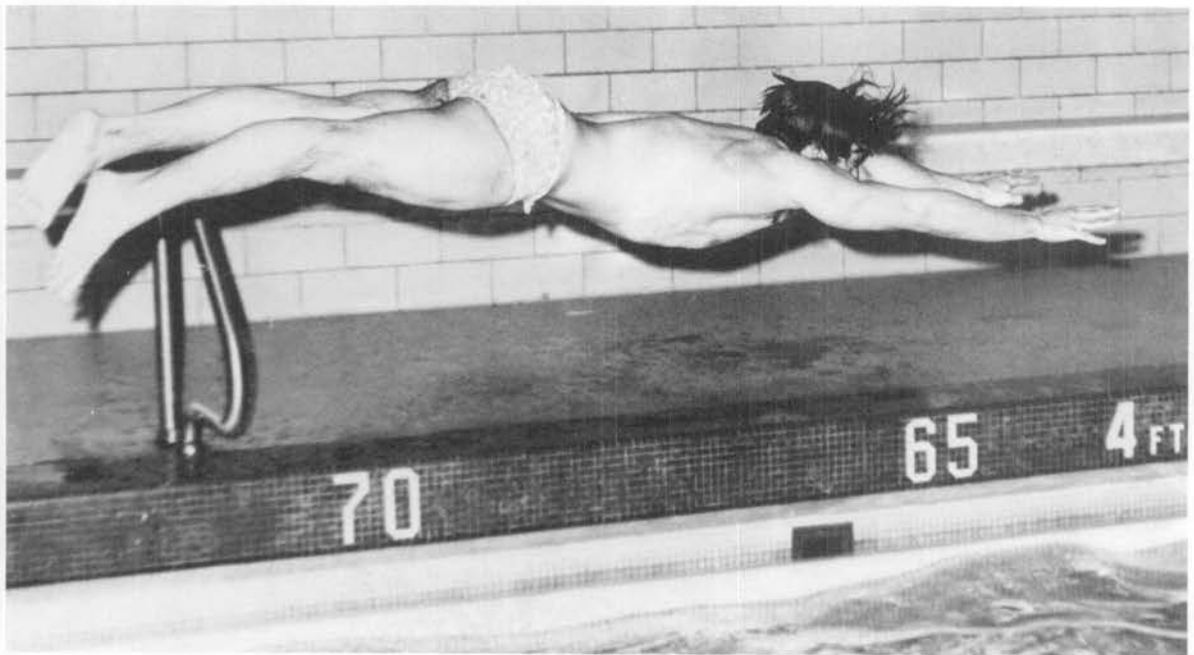

Krapp was very aptly portrayed by Kris Dowling, with spiritual assistance from Mr. Charles Winans.

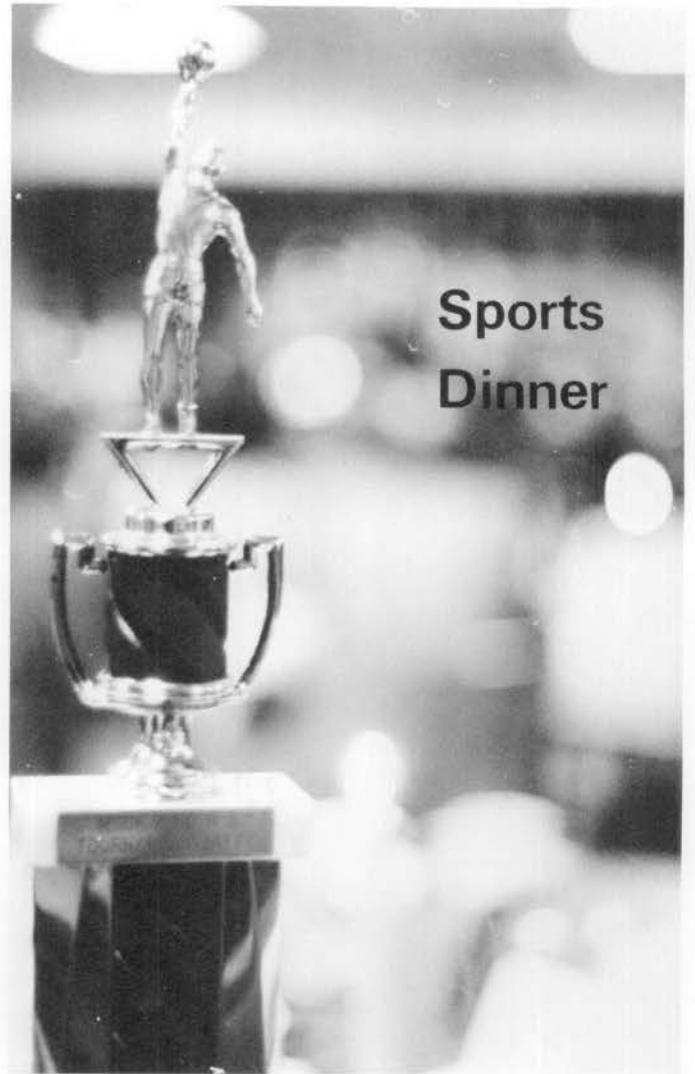


Tennis

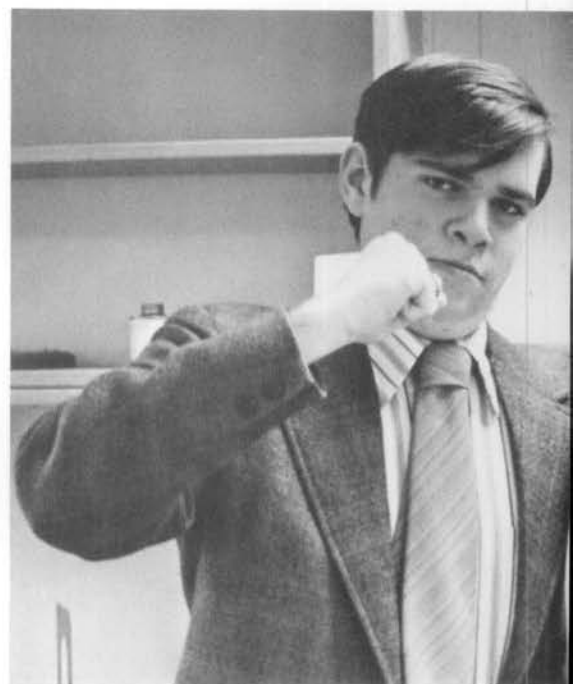

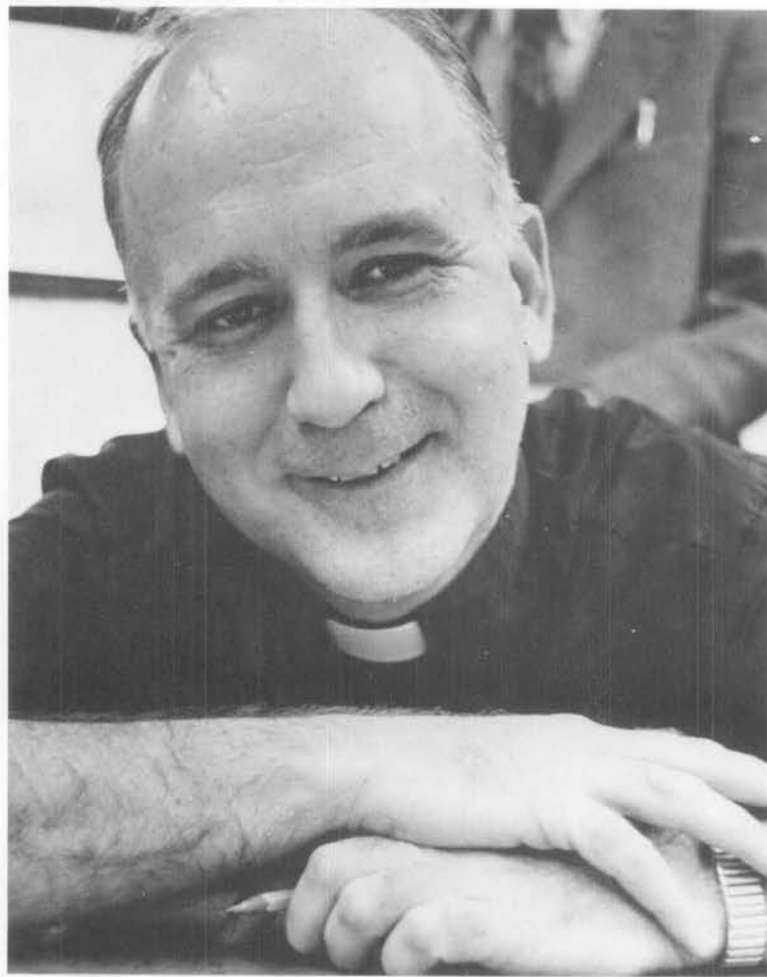

The staff's concerted effort, which was awarded an "excellent" rating by the National Press Association, brightened the school year with fresh, absorbing monthly issues.



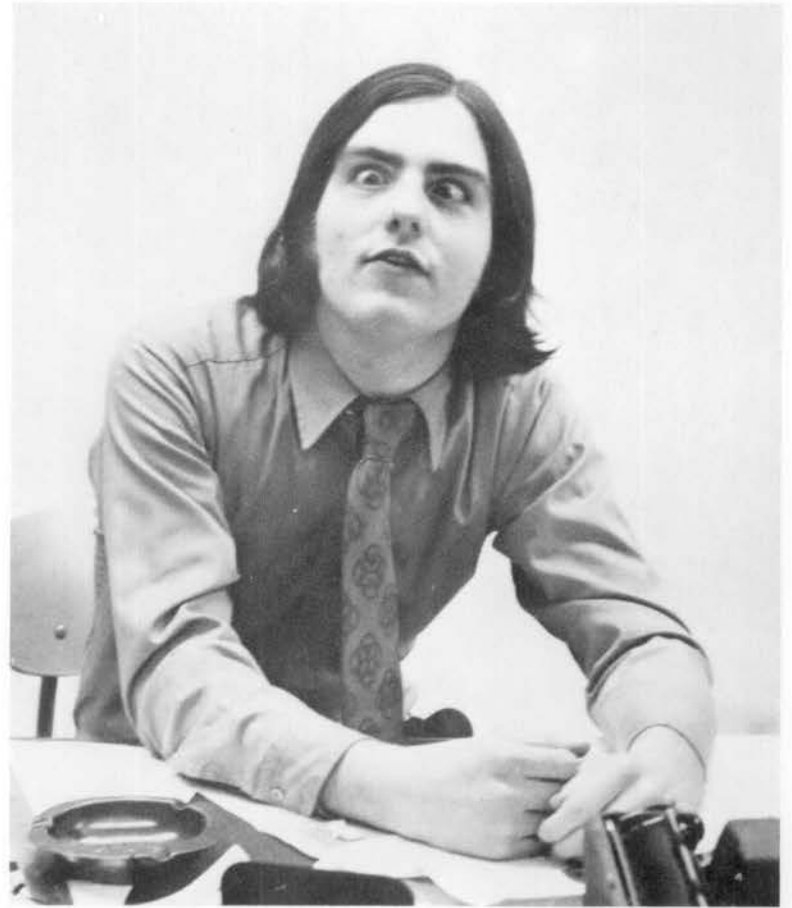

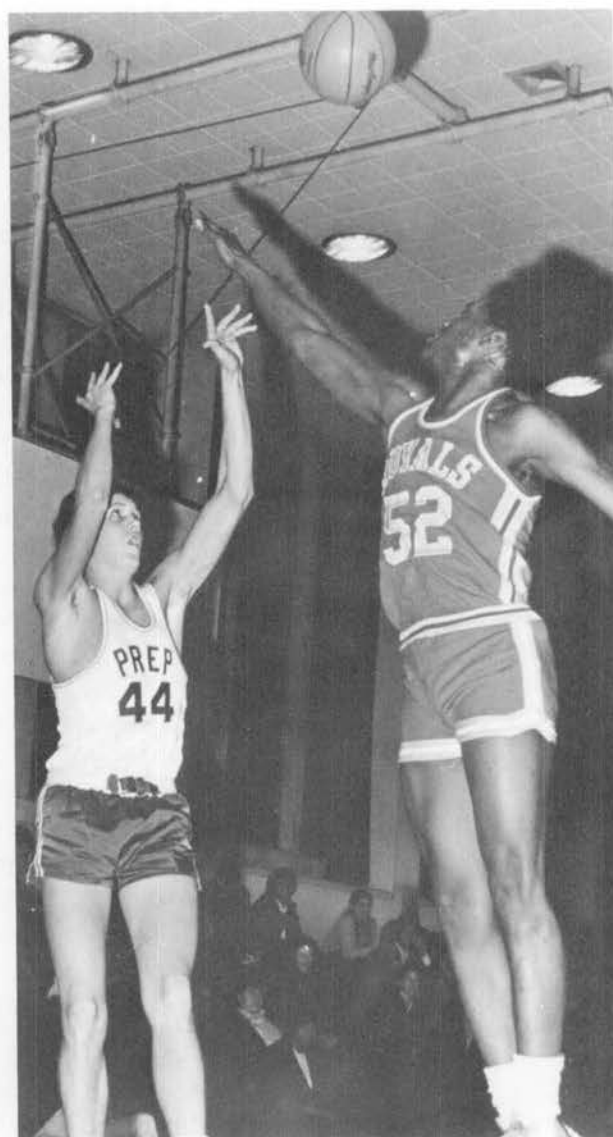

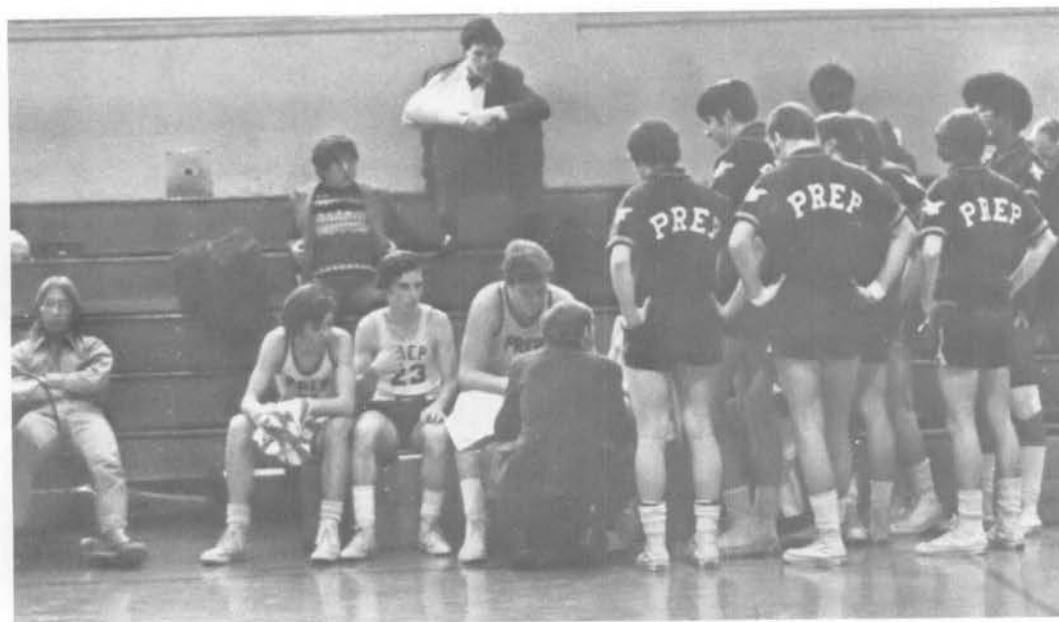

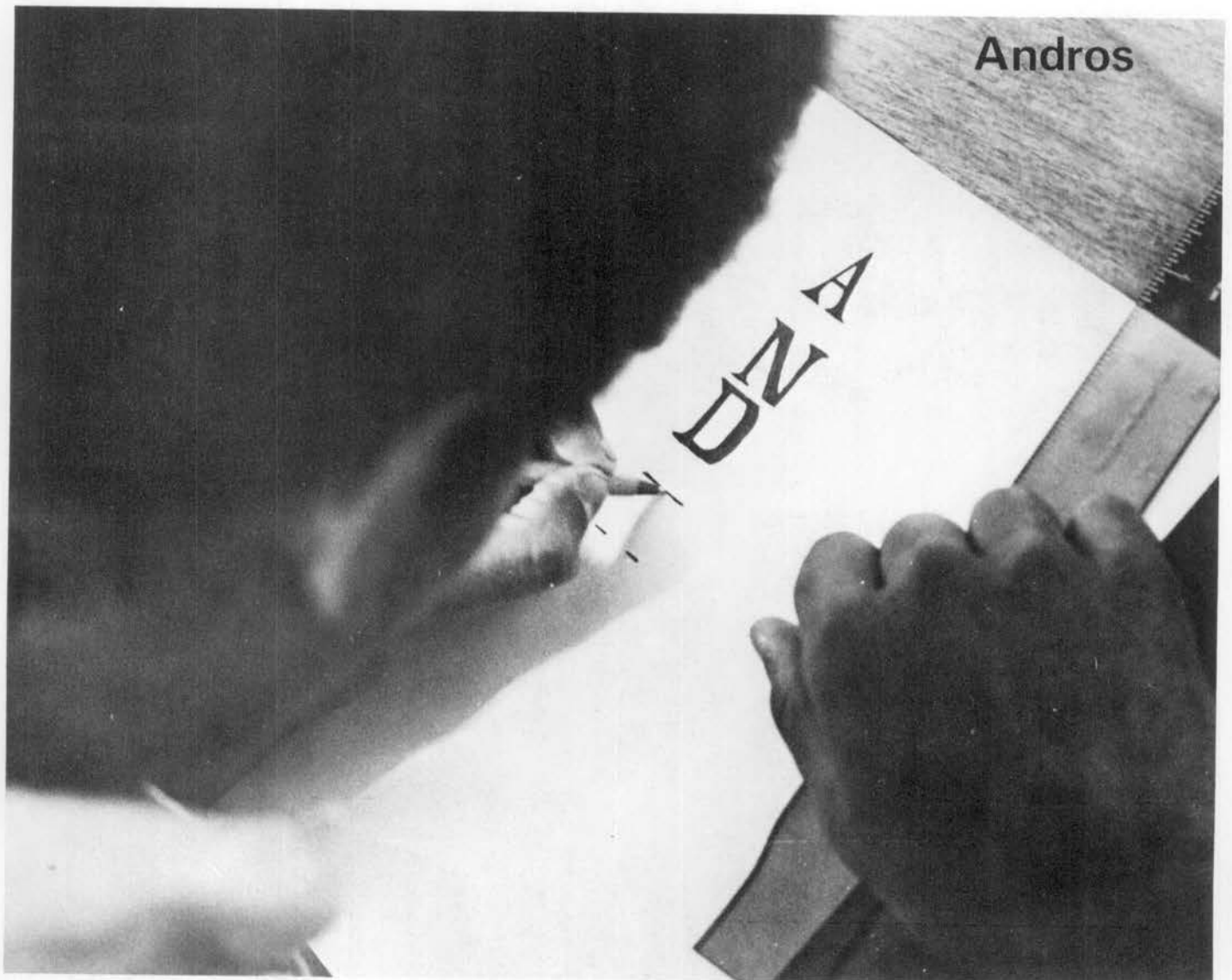
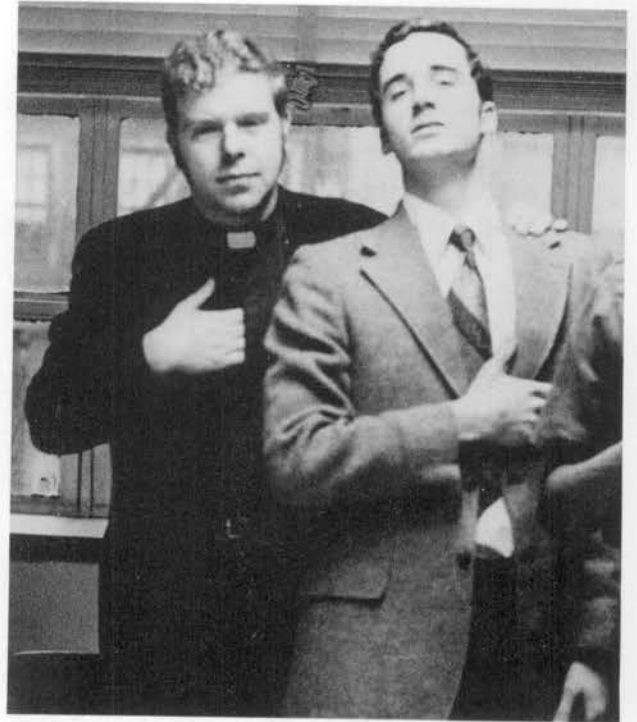

Besides being a talented Speech coach, Mr. Picardi has doubled as the Debate coach as well this year. Though encumbered by the extra burden, he has led the Speech Team on to capture first place in every speech tournament in which it has participated. The Debate Team of Carlton Bush, Algimantas Bruzas, Bill Stroud, and Raymond French performed exceptionally well not only at local tournaments such as St. Brendan's, but also at St. John's University culminating in a splendid qualification for the State Finals at Oneonta. 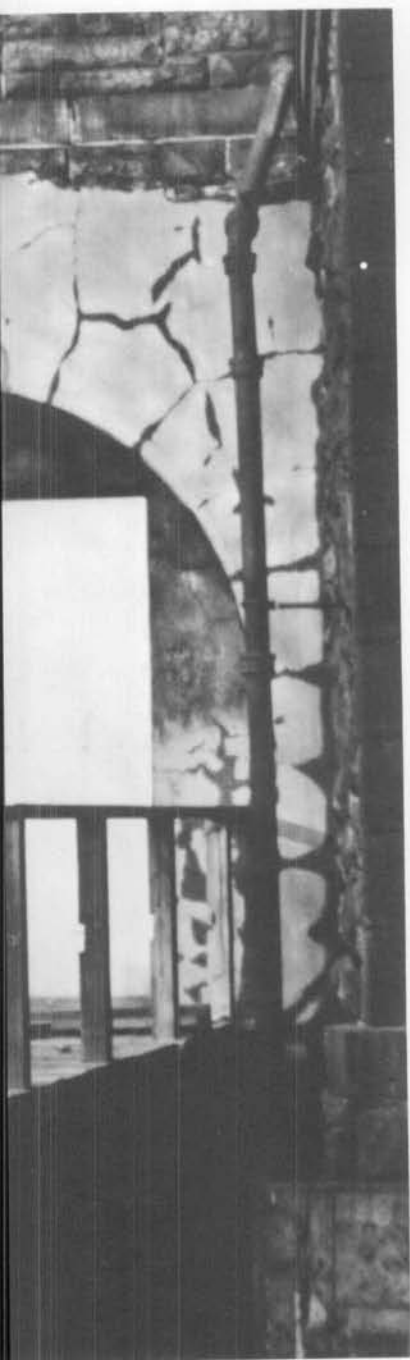
